





Charlie is most recently remembered for his contribution to golf and curling. In his earlier days he participated in most sports and was a member of The Calgary Canadians who went to the Western Canada Junior Hockey Finals in 1928, played on Provincial Champion Baseball teams and played football with The Calgary Tigers in 1930-1932.

Charlie was raised in Calgary and was one of the persons instrumental in forming The Inglewood Golf Club. He was Club Champion on two occasions during the 1930's. He moved to Edmonton after the Second World War and later became President of The Edmonton Golf Association and in 1949 was appointed to the Executive of The Alberta Golf Association and served that organization as Secretary-Treasurer for twenty years.

As most Calgarians know golf was not the only sport to which he dedicated his time and efforts as he is Bonspiel Chairman of The Southern Alberta Curling Association. He was Chairman of The MacDonald Brier Curling Championship staged in Calgary in the early 1960's and was also Chairman of the World Curling Championship held in Calgary.

Charlie is still active as a participant in both golf and curling. He is employed as Service Supervisor with Imperial Life Insurance Company. He like our previous Sportsman of the Year is a fine citizen and has contributed countless hours to help make our City and Province a better place in which to live. The Booster Club feels itself proud to be able to recognize Charlie Scott as Sportsman of the Year.

Bob formed the sport in Alberta in 1958 and has been involved as an Administrator and participant since that time. He has been Provincial Weightlifting Champion for the past 13 years. He won the Western Canadian Championship 3 times and was second in the Canadian Intermediate Championship in 1970. He was coach of the Alberta team for 5 years, Manager of the Canadian Weightlifting team in 1970 and an official of the 1971 Canadian Winter Games.

He has led the Stampeders this year into the Canadian Allan Cup finals.

He was captain of the 1970 University of Calgary Dinosaur Football team and W.C.I.A.A. All-Star guard and named to the All-Canadian team. was W.C.I.A.A. Wrestling Champion in 1970 and 1971, Canadian Heavyweight Wrestling Champion (free style) in 1971 and a nominee for the Pan Am team. He was named 1971 Male Athlete of the Year at the University of Calgary.

RABBI LEWIS N. GINSBURG

Rabbi Lewis N. Ginsburg, a native of Minneapolis, Minnesota, is spiritual leader of the Shaarey Tzedec Congregation of Calgary.

The Rabbi, who is a bachelor, came here in September, 1967, from Edmonton, where he had been spiritual leader of that community's Beth Israel Synagogue for four years. The Rabbi also has held pulpits in Saskatoon and Minneapolis. He served as counsellor of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation (Jewish Students Organization) at the University of Saskatchewan, the University of Alberta and the University of Calgary.

Rabbi Ginsburg is a board member of the Calgary and District International Development Society and the Western Region of the Canadian Council of Christians and Jews. The Rabbi is chaplain of the Men's Canadian Club of Calgary and chairman of the Public Relations Committee of the "Miles for Millions" Organization. Rabbi Ginsburg was a member of the organizing committee for the 1970 Canadian Amateur Wrestling Association Championships and the British Empire Games Trials which were held in Calgary in 1970. He was recently named Command Sportsman of the Week by CFCN-TV. Rabbi Ginsburg is also active in inter-faith projects. He is a popular speaker at Sportsmen's dinners throughout the province and as far north as Fort Smith, N.W.T.

GEORGE ARMSTRONG

George Armstrong began an illustrious career in the N.H.L. with the Toronto Maple Leafs in the 1951-1952 season. He has played in the N.H.L. for the past 20 years with Toronto and was team captain for a number of those years. He was a member of the Maple Leats on four Stanley Cup Championship teams. He has scored 606 points in league competition consisting of 251 goals and 355 assists.

George was a member of the Toronto Marlboro team in the 1949-1950 season which defeated the Calgary Stampeders for the Allan Cup.

He will be 41 years of age this July and has retired from the game for each of the last three years, but once the hockey season began he couldn't resist the urge to commence playing again.

George has been working with the Ontario Government in their Indian Affairs Department and most recently has been courting a movie career.

HEAD TABLE GUEST



JERRY KRAMER

Jerry Kramer was a superb offensive guard with the Green Bay Packers for 11 years, retiring in 1968. He was named "League All-Pro" five times in 1960, 1962, 1963, 1966 and 1967. He was on 3 N.F.L. Championship teams with Green Bay. During the "Lombardi-Green Bay" suppremacy of the N.F.L. the team was recognized for its superior execution of the fundamentals of the game. We can all recall the successful ground game of the Packers and the two men who made it such were the two "Pulling Guards", Fuzzy Thurston and Jerry Kramer.

Jerry Kramer was also a placement kicker with the Packers and he holds the Club record of kicking 43 extra points and 16 field goals in one season.

Near the end of his playing career, Jerry took up his pen and authored a best seller, "Instant Replay". This book gave the sport enthusiast an intimate inside look at the team, its personnell, its losses and its successes. Upon his retirement he authored another book entitled "Jerry Kramers Farewell to Football".

Jerry was born and raised in Sandpoint, Idaho and so is no stranger to this part of the country. He now resides in Tulsa, Oklahoma where he has business interests.

ARCHIE MOORE

Archie Moore is a former holder of the World's light heavyweight championship. He won the title in 1952 by outpointing Joey Maxim in 15 rounds. He successfully defended his title nine times in an era of good prize fighters. One of his memorable defences was against the Canadian Yvon Durelle. Moore was knocked down by Durelle early in the fight and most Canadians envisaged a new light heavyweight champion, but the experienced Moore used all of his boxing savy to keep away from Durelle for the rest of the round and went on to record another decisive victory. Moore made two unsuccessful efforts to win the heavyweight championship losing to Rocky Marciano and Floyd Patterson. During his career, he fought more than 200 fights and won more by knockouts than any other light heavyweight in history. He retired from boxing in 1964.

Archie now lives in San Diego and is very active in youth organizations in that area.

PATRICK JOSEPH MULROONEY

Patrick Joseph Mulrooney is a native Calgarian, who gained prominence as a leading jockey in Canada and the United States.

Patrick was born in Calgary 54 years ago and was introduced to the turf by his father, who was a leading trainer in Calgary, having trained the famous horse "Joey", a household word in Western Canada in the 30's.

Patrick began his racing career in Calgary and later moved to Eastern Canada and the United States and was the leading United States rider in '37 and '38. P.J. continued to ride until 1956 when he retired and was severly injured in a training accident at Woodbine in '57.

Patrick Joseph Mulrooney at present makes his home in Cheshire, New York and trains for stables running at Finger Lakes, New York; Fairgrounds, Detroit, Michigan and Raceway Park at Toledo, Ohio. P.J. was leading trainer at Toledo and recently claimed a horse called "Mountain Man" for \$2,000.00 and in a two year period earned \$30,000 on 15 victories in 28 starts.

Patrick is Chairman of The Horseman's Benevolent Protective Association at Finger Lakes, New York and will represent that area at a convention in Paris later this year. Those Albertans who follow the track will remember P.J. and the people in attendance at our dinner will certainly remember him for his merry wit and armfull of yarns.
