





Russ Parker is the recipient of an athletic leadership award this year for his contribution to baseball in the City of Calgary.

Russ was born in Moosomin, Saskatchewan in 1940. He came to Calgary in 1955. He played minor baseball until 1961. At that time he turned to managing junior baseball. The year 1965 saw Russ manage the Calgary Junior Dodgers to the Canadian championship. From 1966 to 1970 Parker served in various capacities with the Calgary Amateur Baseball Association. In 1970 he served as president.

Russ served as vice president of the Alberta Major Baseball League in 1971 and in 1972 he was made League commissioner.

Parker was responsible for organizing the Calgary Major Baseball Tournament and serves as Tournament Director. This series is recognized as the outstanding competition of its type in Western Canada and draws some of the top teams from Western Canada and United States.

SAMMY KOFFMAN

Probably only two people have ever been recognized in Canadian Football by being presented with Gold Lifetime Passes to their home football park. One was the late Brian Timmis, the Hamilton grid great. The other is Sammy Koffman of Ottawa, a follower of the Rough Riders for 50 of his 62 years.

Sammy Koffman is one of the most sought-after Master of Cerimonies in Canada and his sparkling wit will be heard from the Head Table of the Calgary Booster Club's Annual Dinner. Sammy was given his Lifetime Pass at a dinner in his honor last month in Ottawa— a \$25.00 a plate affair attended by 200 friends who warmly acknowledged the little man's great contributions to the Ottawa sports scene.

Sammy Koffman has been the friend and confidant of Ottawa football players, writers and broadcasters and highly placed politicians for more than three decades. At his testimonial dinner among the paid guests were two close friends, Finance Minister John Turner and Tory Leader, Robert Stanfield.

A former sports writer (Detroit Free Press and Ottawa Journal) Sammy climaxed his journalistic career during the Second War when he enlisted in the Canadian Army and immediately siphoned off for duty with a typewriter with The Maple Leaf — official newspaper of the Canadian Forces. He even got to interview Marlene Dietrich.

Sammy Koffman's ability to laugh at himself and poke fun at people in high places has won him the admiration and friendship of thousands of people in Eastern Canada. This will be his first trip to Calgary. Welcome, Sammy!

LARRY ROBINSON

Larry Robinson and football in Calgary are almost synonymous. Larry started making a name for himself in 1956 with Western Canada High School where he was perhaps the all-time, outstanding high school football player ever to play in Calgary. In 1960 he enrolled in Mount Royal College where he was the MVP in the Alberta Junior Football League and lead the Cougars into the Western Canadian final. In 1961 at the age of 19 Larry made the jump to the Stampeders. In that year he was the WFC rookie of the year.

With the Stampeders, Larry has made the All Star team in 1965, 71 and 72. He was runner up for the Schenly in 1965. He is the all time Stampeder scoring leader, as well as the second all-time scorer in CFL history.

Last year Larry's outstanding play and leadership were recognized by his own teammates as he was awarded the President's Ring as the most valuable player on the Stampeder Football Team.


CATHY PRIESTNER

Cathy Priestner at the young age of 16 has already established herself as one of the world's premier speedskaters.

Cathy has recently returned from an exhausting trip in which she competed for five weeks in Europe, the Canadian Championships in Winnipeg and a two day meet in Milwaukee as a member of Canada's team which competed against the United States.

On this tour Cathy won gold and silver medals at the 500 metre events at Davos, Switzerland. Her European tour was climaxed by winning the silver medal for the 500 metres at the World Sprint Championships in Oslo, Norway.

In the Canadian Championships at Winnipeg she won the intermediate 500 and 1000 metres and placed second in the 1500 and 2000 metres. At Malwaukee she won the 500 metres and placed second in the 1000 metres against the top U.S. competitors.

ED JANS

Ed Jans is being honoured this year for his athletic achievements in Free Pistol Shooting competition. Ed started shooting in 1967 and in 1970 he competed in the World Championships. In 1971 he won the

Canadian Free Pistol Championship. That year he also placed fourth in the Pan American Games at Cali, Colombia. In 1972 Jans won the Canadian Air Pistol Championship. This year he was a member of Canada's Olympic Team.

Ed is only 26 years of age and aspires to win a gold medal in international competition. Next month he will be competing in Mexico City for the Championship of the Western Hemisphere.

John was born in Ottawa, February 27, 1953. He has resided in Calgary for the past 12 years. He is a graduate of Henry Wise Wood High School.

In 1970-71 he played with the Lethbridge Sugar Kings where he achieved Rookie of the Year honors. The 1971-72 season saw John move to the Centennials.

For his outstanding play that year he was named the leagues Most Valuable Player and Calgary's Athlete of the Year.

This year John is again having another All Star season with the Centennials. At Christmas he played with Medicine Hat in the World Cup series in Minneapolis and Colorado Springs.

John is without a doubt the best junior goal tender in Canada. He is virtually certain of being a top draft choice this year in the professional draft. He is 6'3", 200 lbs. and has been called the best net prospect since Bernie Parent.

GUEST SPEAKER



JOHNNY ESAW

JOHNNY ESAW is the Sports Director of CFTO Television and the Canadian Television Network.

He is considered not only one of Canada's outstanding sports broadcasters, but also an outstanding administrator and business manager in the field of television sports broadcasting.

Mr. Esaw started his broadcasting career after the war in North Battleford, Saskatchewan and in 1949 moved to Regina where he gained prominence as one of the Country's finest broadcasters with his success in broadcasting the games of the Saskatchewan Roughrider Football Club and also with his excellent actuality in broadcasting baseball, curling and hockey. He was also actively involved in the community and was one of the persons responsible for the Saskatchewan Roughrider name change from Regina Roughriders to include an all-provincial involvement.

In 1956 Mr. Esaw moved to Winnipeg as Sports Director of CKRC Radio where he met with continued success and broadened his excellence and reputation as a sports broadcaster.

In 1960 he was hired by Canada's largest television station — CFTO Television in Toronto —to initiate and organize a sports department. Later he was placed in charge of the Canadian Television Network's sports programming. Mr. Esaw has initiated such outstanding events as the Nationally syndicated television shows — "Sports Hot Seat" — "Sports Beat "73" — "World International Hockey" — "World International Figure Skating" — "Canadian Wide World of Sports" — "Wednesday Night NHL Hockey" — National and International coverage of the Calgary Stampede and the sophisticated coverage of the Canadian Classic — The Grey Cup.

Mr. Esaw firmly believes in a Canadian identity and outmost support for Canadian teams, athletes and talent at all levels.

Mr. Esaw is married and has two children — he is an avid golfer.

GUEST SPEAKER



LEO CAHILL

LEO CAHILL, former coach of the Toronto Argonauts will make a most interesting and controversial guest at this year's Booster Club Sportsmen's Dinner. Cahill, 1971's CFL Coach of the Year, is an outstanding speaker. He was the highlight of that year's Grey Cup Dinner as those attending the Vancouver affair will attest.


Leo is known as the man who finally took the Argonauts to the Grey Cup game after a 19 year absence. He is also known as the CFL's most successful recruiter of high priced American talent having brought Joe Theismann, Jim Stillwagon, Leon McQuay and Tim Anderson to Canada. He is perhaps even better known as the colorful coach who molded a group of rebellious castoffs into a football team.

Leo Cahill was born in Utica, Illinois, July 30, 1928. He attended the University of Illinois as a 6 foot, 185 lb. center and guard. He was the only freshman on the 1946 Rosebowl Team that beat UCLA 45-14. In his senior year, he was an All-Midwest guard, Honorable Mention All-American and played in the Blue Grey Game. Three days after graduating, he joined the U.S. Army and was immediately sent to Korea for seven months of combat duty. Upon leaving the army, he became freshman coach at Illinois. His college coaching career includes: 1954-55 Lewis College; 1956-57 Toledo; 1958-59 University of South Carolina.

In 1967 he was selected as head coach of the Toronto Argonauts. In his first year he took Toronto to the playoffs, a position that had escaped them since 1961. Prior to his disastrous injury-plagued year of 1972, he compiled an impressive 47-32-2 record.

Mr. Cahill is presently collaborating on a book. He stated that he hoped to have something interesting to say about this subject at the Sportsmen's Dinner. With the tremendous talent and interesting characters he has surrounded himself with in Toronto, he should have a wealth of material for both his book and his speech.

GUEST SPEAKER



PAUL HENDERSON

For a number of years Paul Henderson toiled very honestly and effectively for the Detroit Red Wings and then the Toronto Maple Leafs. He was regarded as a hockey player's hockey player; good scorer, good defensively, excellent skater.

In the fall of 1972 Paul joined Team Canada and helped form the team's most effective forward line with Bobby Clarke and Ron Ellis. It was during the celebrated Team Canada-U.S.S.R. series that Paul Henderson achieved the stardom that neither he nor Canada will soon forget.

The big Russian Bear had assumed the commanding series lead of three wins, one loss and one tie after five games.

Then in the sixth game Team Canada won to keep their series hopes alive. In the seventh game Paul scored the game winning goal to even the series and the stage was set.

In the history-making eighth game it was Paul Henderson who with only seconds remaining scored the game and series winning goal, a feat that will be long remembered in Canadian and international hockey circles.


