Tom Cheney is a native Calgarian, who graduated from Western Canada High and Commercial where he participated in football and track.

After serving with the Canadian Army for 3 years during World War II he began his officiating career in 1946 in the sport of hockey.

In 1951 Tom changed over to football officiating for keeps. Beginning as a junior high school official, he progressed through the ranks working junior, university and ultimately the

CFL in 1957. Tom has been a “head man” in the CFL since 1970.

As well as officiating Tom Cheney has been very active in the Calgary Football Officials Association, having served on this organization’s executive in various capacities including president and executive-secretary ever since 1953. Presently Tom serves as a Director of the Officials Association, involved mainly in the rating of junior officials.

Tom has also represented the Association on the Harry Hood Memorial Trophy Committee ever since its inception.

Although Tom was an active curler in the past, even serving as president of the North Hill Curling Club some 10 years ago, his entire life is now devoted to his position with Revenue Canada, whom he has been employed with for the past 28 years, presently as the Public Information Officer, and football officiating.

Tom Cheney approaches both loves with equal intensity and competency. He spends countless hours reviewing football films, clipping “key plays” and infractions, in order to improve the football officiating in Calgary through well-prepared clinics, not only for the officials but also for high school coaches and players.

Tom and his charming wife, Marjorie, have made their home in the Renfrew district for the past several years.

Tom Cheney is a self-acclaimed “sports nut” and the Booster Club is proud to add his name to the distinguished list of former Sportsmen of the Year.

MASTER OF CEREMONIES

SAMMY KOFFMAN

The presence of Sammy Koffman has been over a year in the making. An unfortunate illness prevented Sammy from carrying out his scheduled role at last year's Dinner, however; like a fine wine, an additional year of aging should have its effect.

Probably only two people have ever been recognized in Canadian Football by being presented with Gold Lifetime Passes to their home football park. One was the late Brian Timmis, the Hamilton grid great. The other is Sammy Koffman of Ottawa, a follower of the Rough Riders for 50 of his 62 years.

Sammy Koffman is one of the most sought-after Master of Ceremonies in Canada and his sparkling wit will be heard from the Head Table of the Calgary Booster Club's Annual Dinner. Sammy was given his Lifetime Pass at a dinner in his honor last year in Ottawa — a \$25.00 a plate affair attended by 200 friends who warmly acknowledged the little man's great contributions to the Ottawa sports scene.

Sammy Koffman has been the friend and confidant of Ottawa football players, writers and broadcasters and highly placed politicians for more than three decades. At his testimonial dinner among the paid guests were two close friends Finance Minister, John Turner and Tory Leader, Robert Stanfield.

A former sports writer (Detroit Free Press and Ottawa Journal) Sammy climaxed his journalistic career during the Second War when he enlisted in the Canadian Army and immediately siphoned off for duty with a typewriter with The Maple Leaf — official newspaper of the Canadian Forces. He even got to interview Marlene Dietrich.

Sammy Koffman's ability to laugh at himself and poke fun at people in high places has won him the admiration and friendship of thousands of people in Eastern Canada. This will be his first trip to Calgary. Welcome, Sammy!

JOHN JENKINS

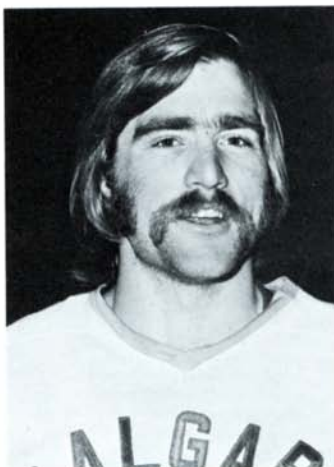
John Jenkins is a 23 year old native Calgarian who has just completed his 5th year with The University of Calgary Dinosaur Hockey Team.

PAT MARSDEN, Toronto Channel 9's unflappable sportscaster, joined the staff of CFTO in January, 1968. In that short time his skill in delivery and his flair for transmitting the sports scene directly into the eye of the viewer has made him a valued member of CFTO'S team.

Pat was born in Ottawa, attending high school there and Ottawa University. He began his career in Blind River, Ontario as a general announcer. From there he went to Niagara Falls for a year and a half; then to CJLX, in Fort William, where his career gathered enough momentum to carry him back to Ottawa as Sports Director for CKOY Radio.

Pat Marsden knows the sports game up and down the board and he has called the play-by-play in every field from goal post to wicket. He was the voice of the Ottawa Roughriders for three years and free lanced with CBC network.

Now at CFTO, Pat handles all the sportscasts from Monday to Friday, early and late, including Jr. A. Hockey.

He knows his stuff, and after he's done his stint, you know it too, thanks to his clear and concise comment which is right on the mark.

JOHN BASSETT JR.

Toronto-born 35-year-old, JOHN F. BASSETT is currently President and Chief Executive Officer of CAN SPORTS INC., holding company for the World Hockey Association Toronto Toros and the Toronto entry in World Team Tennis; President and Chief Executive Officer of the Toronto Northmen of the World Football League; and President of Agincourt Productions, a feature film company.

Graduating as the Gold Medallist from the University of Western Ontario's Huron College in 1961, he worked one year on the Victoria Times before joining the Toronto Telegram in 1962 and TV station CFTO in 1964. Mr. Bassett was Vice-President of the Telegram when it ceased publication in October of 1971, and recently resigned his positions of Vice-President of CFTO-TV and Director of Baton Broadcasting Incorporated.

A member of Canada's Davis Cup Tennis Team and the Pan American Games Team in 1959, he was also Ontario Squash Champion in 1967, 1968 and 1969. Mr. Bassett plays to an 8 handicap at the Toronto Golf Club, an activity he began after knee ligament troubles forced his retirement from active tennis and squash competition.

Mr. Bassett is a Director of Hockey Canada, an Executive member of the Charley Conacher Research Fund and an active fund raiser for the Ontario Society for Crippled Children.

Married to the former Susan Carling, he is the father of four children, one boy and three girls.

GRAHAM LEGGAT

GRAHAM LEGGAT, currently General Manager of the multi-million dollar O'Keefe Sports Foundation, has been termed "one of the finest speakers I have ever heard" by no less than Normie Kwong, himself one of the wittiest emcees on the dinner circuit.
