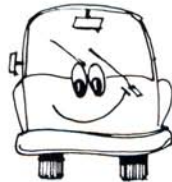

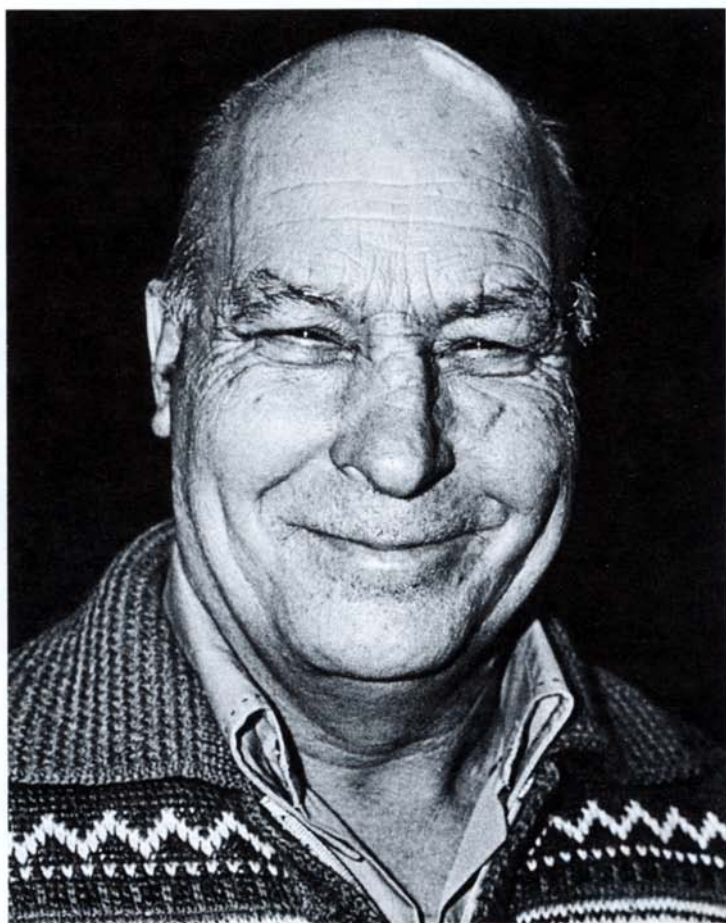

SPORTSMAN OF THE YEAR

Harry Maubert must be known to everyone who has participated in amateur sports in Calgary in the last 30 years.

Born in Calgary, Harry participated in hockey, football and fast-ball prior to World War II. He retired from competition himself following his return from the navy in 1945.

For the past 33 years Harry has helped to mold the character of our athletes through his dedication to amateur sports in several capacities.

Harry is probably best known for his efforts in hockey refereeing and baseball umpiring. He still referees as many as 175 hockey games each winter and 80 baseball games in the summer. Harry's running commentary with players, fans and officials calms frayed nerves in pressure moments. He always compliments players on well executed plays and offers friendly advice when things go wrong. His knowledge, enthusiasm and dedication inspires younger athletes and reinforces the emotions of older athletes.

In 1971 Harry was honored by the Booster Club for his involvement in Community sports and it is with great pleasure that we now add the name of Harry Maubert to the distinguished list of "Sportsman of the Year".

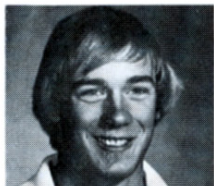

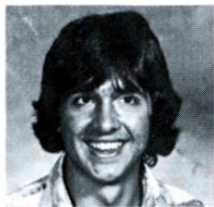

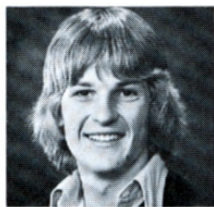

ROSE KOHN SCHOLARSHIP

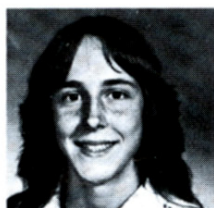

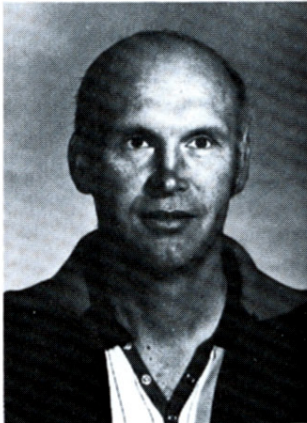
ATHLETIC



PETER CONNELLAN

Peter Connellan has had an enviable record as a football coach both at the High School and College level. Prior to settling in Calgary, Peter coached at Innisfail, Lacombe and Winnipeg. In 12 years as the Head Coach at Viscount Bennett the Vikings never had a losing season. Included in this record were six undefeated seasons in Calgary league play and two City Championships.

Peter served for two years as an Assistant Coach at the University of Calgary and in 1977 was named Interim Head Coach. Under his leadership the Dinosaurs won the W.I.F.L. and represented the west in the Forest City Bowl. His efforts were further rewarded when he was named Canadian College Coach of the Year in 1977.



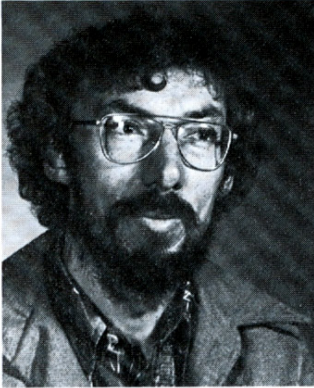
GARY DeMAN

Gary, a native Albertan has been winning High School athletic events since 1951 when he won the mile while participating for St. Mary's.

He began his teaching career in 1955 and has been at St. Francis since 1962. In 15 years as Head Coach of the Browns, Gary's basketball teams have reached the City finals 9 times, winning 4 City championships and one Provincial title. In football Gary has coached the Browns to 4 City championships.

In addition to his record as a Coach Gary has spent countless hours assisting students in other interscholastic involvements.

LEADERSHIP



JIM McLUSKEY

Jim McLuskey has been instrumental in gymnastics locally and provincially for several years. He is the head coach and founder of the Altadore Gymnastics Club which provides competitive and recreational programs for boys and girls.

Jim is a member of the Alberta Gymnastics Federation Executive and has served as Coach of the Alberta Women's Junior and Senior Gymnastics teams. He has also served several times as team manager in inter-provincial competitions.

Jim was responsible for establishing the Altadore Invitational Gymnastics Meet which is now one of the largest competitions in Western Canada. He has devoted his time and talent at several Provincial clinics.



ART POLLITT

Art Pollitt has spent most of his life furthering the cause of amateur boxing. He is a fixture at the Renfrew Boys and Girls Club and is considered one of the finest boxing coaches in the Province. Art constantly takes his athletes to competitions throughout Canada and his efforts have been rewarded with several medal winners. Art's eight participants in the Alberta Winter Games in Medicine Hat produced 2 gold, 2 silver and one bronze medal.



MASTER OF CEREMONIES

DON CHEVRIER

Don Chevrier is versatile. In his 22 year career "Chevy" has broadcast everything from stock car racing to wrestling.

He began covering sports while in high school in Edmonton and at the ripe old age of 19 became the voice of the Edmonton Eskimos Football Club.

Don is currently most familiar to Canadian sports fans as commentator on Toronto Blue Jays baseball and Eastern CFL telecasts. Football, baseball and curling are his personal favorites because they are games requiring mental strategy in addition to the necessary physical talents.

Explaining the high viewer interest in sports telecasts, Chevrier says "Television was supposed to be a 'live information' medium and sports coverage has a large following because it's one of the few remaining live events".

Don's career in communications has influenced his family considerably. Sons, Mal and Tim are both employed in the newspaper business while Jeff, 13, and daughter Melanie, 10, are avid fans. Wife, Donna works with CJMR radio in Mississauga.

This season has been one of the busiest for Chevrier. Travel was especially heavy in both Canada and the U.S. covering baseball, football and tennis. When baseball and football seasons conclude it's on to curling and then to baseball spring training in Florida.

Don Chevrier has worked for the CBC, for private radio in Canada, as host of ABC's Radio World of Sports in New York, and for every American network at sometime during his career.

As a duet they merged their very distinctively individual styles to emerge as Canadian Champions and then moved on to win for Canada the duet gold medal at the Pan-Pacific championships which is recognized as the world championship in Synchronized swimming.

Tom is an amazing athlete. In High School he was selected to the Provincial Basketball all-star team and moved to Utah State on a basketball scholarship.

Although he had not played high school football Tom went on to establish several Utah State football records. His 17 catches in one game remains a Utah state record. Tom was selected to participate in two bowl games and received the M.V.P. in the Blue-Grey game for a strong two-way performance which included 11 catches.

Since turning professional Tom has continued this type of performance.

Tom continues to play senior 'A' basketball and was recruited by the Cascades to represent Alberta in the recent Canadian championships.

ATHLETES

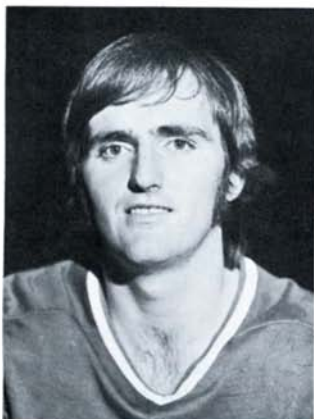


BOB LAYCOCK

Upon graduation from the University of Calgary, Bob Laycock will leave with more than his degree. He also takes with him the Canada-West all-time scoring record which he established in his last game. Bob has been team captain for the past two years and during his tenure won honors as Rookie of the Year and Most Sportsmanlike Player.

Bob's talent is not restricted to hockey as he played shortstop in baseball and was the all-star catcher in the Canadian National fastball playdowns in Saskatchewan last year.

Although he just recently took up the game of golf Bob now holds the course record in Carstairs.



ROBIN LAYCOCK

Robin graduates from junior hockey this year after two remarkable seasons with the Calgary Canucks. In his first year he scored 58 goals and 70 assists for 128 points and this year won the league scoring title with a record 80 goals plus 76 assists.

Robin was recently selected to the 1977-78 Alberta Junior Hockey League all-star team, and was the only unanimous choice. He is also the only first-team repeater from last year.

Also versatile, Robin played first base on the Calgary Big-League All-star 1977 baseball team which represented Alberta in the Canadian Championships.

GUEST SPEAKER

TOM GORMAN

In December, 1976 Tom Gorman retired from active umpiring duty. At the time of his retirement Tom was the senior umpire in the National Baseball League.

After appearing in the major leagues as a pitcher with the New York Giants, he entered military service spending almost five years with the U.S. army. After leaving the armed service Tom turned his talents to umpiring starting his career in the New England League in 1947. His ability quickly carried him to the majors in 1951.

Gorman is a veteran of five World Series, two League Championships, and four All-Star games.

After retirement Tom continued his work in baseball and on behalf of the National League. He has been used on special assignments such as the Hall of Fame Game in Cooperstown and the Mayor's trophy game between the Mets and the Yankees in New York.

Tom has also been used by the National League for special speaking engagements and continues to be in great demand as an after dinner speaker.



GUEST SPEAKER

EDDIE SHACK

"Eddie the entertainer" is the source of many stories; some factual, some fictional and most legendary.

From his early days in Sudbury, through junior hockey in Guelph to the NHL Eddie has had the ability to put others at ease with his outgoing manner. Eddie parlayed this showmanship along with a pretty good hockey talent into 17 seasons of entertainment for the fans of the NHL. By the time he had retired Eddie Shack had scored 239 goals.

The charisma of Eddie Shack has helped him to capture the field of business in the same manner he charmed hockey fans. "Business is mainly meeting people and selling things, and that's what I love".

Eddie likes people so much that one day in Macy's in New York he walked past a naked mannequin, slapped her in the chest and said: "How are ya today?".

Eddie loves to golf and now plays with the NHL Oldtimers.



GUEST SPEAKER

PAUL HORNUNG

Paul Hornung is regarded by many football experts as one of the all-time greats of the National Football League. The former Green Bay Packer great led the NFL in scoring three straight years (1960-61-62); scored 15 touchdowns, kicked 15 field goals and 41 extra points to break the season scoring record set by another Green Bay legend, Don Hutson, 176 points to 138 in 1960; and was the NFL's most valuable player in 1961. When he won the scoring title for the third straight year with 148 points, he'd played at least three games with a pulled leg muscle, missed two because of army service, and played in others without midweek practice because of his military obligation.

It's no wonder that his favourite coach, the legendary Vince Lombardi, called Hornung "the most versatile man who ever played the game".

Upon graduation from Notre Dame, where he twice made All American, and, in 1956, won the Heisman Trophy, he joined the Packers in a barrage of publicity but soon tangled with the then coach. He was shifted from quarterback to halfback to fullback.

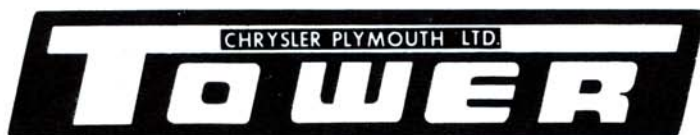
Lombardi arrived three years later, settled Hornung in at halfback and built a legend as the Packers won three western division titles, two NFL championships, and then the first two Super Bowl contests.

Paul Hornung combined theatrics with football when he starred for the Green Bay Packers, so a career in broadcasting seemed like a natural step when his playing days were over.

Paul presently serves as a football analyst on U.S. television and as host of "Paul Hornung's Sports Legend", a syndicated television series.
