



Born in Glasgow, Scotland 66 years ago, Bill travelled with his family while only 7 months old to Calgary where he has made his home ever since.

While he was a very active participant in amateur athletics as a youth, Bills major contribution to athletics in this city has been as a trainer and a leader in the treatment of athletic injuries. Although Bill never limited his efforts to any particular sport his primary involvement was in football at all levels, including a brief stint with the professional Stampeders and in hockey at the Junior "B" and Juvenile "A" level where he served as trainer to the whole league, attending hundreds of games and giving invaluable assistance and encouragement to the many young athletes taking part.

A trainer is truly a man behind the scenes. Throughout the years Bill has given unselfishly of his time and effort in maintaining strong, healthy young athletes and he has been a welcome sight on the field of play and we of the Booster Club take great pleasure in adding the name of Bill Phillips to the distinguished list of "Sportsman of the Year."







Sandy's other achievements include selection as the female Athlete of the Year at U. of C. in 1970, and in 1971 she received the Margaret Southern Award for female

contribution to organization as well as athletic ability in the Physical Education program of U. of C.

HOLLY JACKSON-PEDERSEN



Since coming to Calgary from her home in Kelowna, B.C., Holly has been instrumental in the success of the womens basketball team at the U. of C., who this year ended years of domination by British Columbia teams and captured the conference title. Holly was a co-captain of her squad this year and was the second leading scorer in the league. Holly achieved first team all-star status in the Canada West Conference and was named to the second all-Canadian team for 1978/79.

Holly graduates from the U. of C. this year with a degree in Physical Education.

SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

In 1978 the Booster Club honoured Michelle Calkins and Helen Vanderburg for their success as a duet. Between them they won all the gold medals at the 1977 National Synchronized Swimming Championships and were runners up to each other in the individual events.

This year we feel the effort they have put into their sport and the success that they each have achieved warrants recognition for their special achievements individually.

GARDNER DICKINSON

Guest Speaker

It has been said that Gardner Dickinson resembles another great P.G.A. Tour Player, Ben Hogan, in appearance as well as in the smoothness of their golf swing.

Born in Dothan, Alabama in 1927, Gardner turned professional and joined the P.G.A. Tour in 1952 after receiving his degree in Clinical Psychology from Louisiana State University. Perhaps his background in psychology was the answer to Gardner's mastering of the mental aspect of his demanding sport.

While he accumulated 10 tour victories and total earnings of over \$700,000. in his career, Gardner's best year came in 1968 when he won over \$73,000. in prize money and tied for 16th place overall without posting a victory.

Perhaps his most impressive statistic is that in the years 1953 through 1971, Gardner only failed to appear in the top 60 players on the tour twice; an enviable achievement when one thinks of the young pro's of today who must continue to qualify for each tournament if they do not achieve this standing.

Gardner was a member of the U.S.A. Ryder Cup team 1967 through 1971 and in 1969 was named the TPD Player Director. Gardner currently resides in North Palm Beach, Florida with his wife.

DICK POUND

Guest Speaker

Dick Pound's athletic achievements took him to the Rome Olympics in 1960 where he competed for Canada in the 100 metre free style and the 400 metre medley.

Dick has continued to serve the Olympic movement in Canada, now in an administrative capacity. In 1968 Dick was elected secretary of the Canadian Olympic Association and in 1977 he became President of that body. As well, in 1978 Dick was elected to the International Olympic Committee as a second member, resident in Canada.

With these truly impressive credentials, the inclusion of Dick Pound at this years dinner is of particular interest to Calgarians and highly topical with the recent announcement of the formation of the Calgary Olympic Development Association and the proposal of Calgary as host for the 1988 Winter Olympics.

Dick is 37 years of age and practices law in Montreal with Stikeman, Elliot and Co. and teaches a course in taxation at the McGill University Faculty of Law. Dick has been named to both the Canadian Swimming Hall of Fame and the Sports Federation of Canada Hall of Fame.



TOM GORMAN

Guest Speaker

In December, 1976 Tom Gorman retired from active umpiring duty after 25 years in the Major Leagues. At the time of his retirement Tom was the senior umpire in the National Baseball League.

After appearing in the major leagues as a pitcher with the New York Giants, he entered military service spending almost five years with the U.S. army. After leaving the armed service Tom turned his talents to umpiring starting his career in the New England League in 1947. His ability quickly carried him to the majors in 1951.

Gorman is a veteran of five World Series, two League Championships, and four All-Star games.

After retirement Tom continued his work in baseball and on behalf of the National League. He has been used on special assignments such as the Hall of Fame Game in Cooperstown and the Mayor's trophy game between the Mets and the Yankees in New York, and has just recently been named an umpire consultant by the National League.

Tom has also been used by the National League for special speaking engagements and continues to be in great demand as an after dinner speaker.


