DEAK CASSIDY

A native Calgarian, Deak has been involved in hockey, baseball, track and field, football, as a player, coach, official, executive, and administrator. Following his playing days, Deak was a timekeeper in the High School Football League, was a Judge at High School track meets, and refereed hockey in the old Western Canada Junior League, Central Alberta Intermediate League, and the Calgary Oil Hockey League. As a leader, Deak served as a Director on many organizations, such as the Boys' Camp Cadasiu at Bragg Creek, the Canadian Wheelchair Games Association, and was Director and Vice-President of the Alberta Track and Field Association.

Deak Cassidy's first love, however, is hockey, where he was a "rink rat" in the old Victoria Arena from 1936 to 1952. His playing career started in the late 1930's, taking him from Minor through to the Senior level.

Upon retiring from playing in 1953, he turned his attention to the administration part of the game. He has helped to organize several scholarships sponsored by the Calgary Old Timers' Hockey Association, and was one of the original founders of the Calgary Booster Club Hockey School back in 1966, which is still going today.

Deak was General Manager of the University of Calgary Hockey club for four years, and was Executive Director of the Calgary Stampeder Senior Hockey Club from 1968 to 1970, and he is still very active in the Calgary Old Timers' Hockey Association, as well as the Calgary Booster Club, which he is an Honourary Life Member, and also a Past President.

Married to Margie, with a son and a daughter, and three grandchildren, Deak has been employed by Canadian Reserve Oil and Gas as Purchasing Manager.

Deak spends much of his spare time on the golf course, or at the curling rink, and the Booster Club is proud to add his name to the distinguished list of former Sportsmen of the Year.

CALGARY BOOSTER CLUB ACTIVITIES

INSTRUCTIONAL SCHOOLS

The Calgary Booster Club Hockey School consists of two ten day sessions during the month of August. The school accommodates approximately 200 boys between the ages of 11 and 16. The on-ice and dryland training sessions are instructed by graduate and current University of Calgary Players.

The Ringette School is comprised of two one week sessions in August. It is expected that at least 150 participants will receive expert instruction at this year's school.

COMPETITION

The Club sponsors three major high school events each year. The 1983 Golf Tournament was hosted by the Canyon Meadows Golf and Country Club and was won by Dr. E.P. Scarlett. The swimming championship at the University of Calgary Pool was won for the third consecutive time by Sir. Winston Churchill High School while Wm. Aberhart captured the diving honors.

The Second Annual Boys Tip-Off Basketball Tournament was won by E.P. Scarlett and the inaugural Girl's Tournament saw St. Mary's emerge as the eventual champions.

The Booster Club Road Racing Program has been altered this year and the Club along with the Herald, the Firefighters, Palm Dairies and Sport Chek will sponsor the most exciting day of road racing ever seen in Calgary. The day will feature three events centered around the original 10K Grand Prix Race and will include Youth and Family Competitions.

GRANTS & AWARDS

The Booster Club offers financial grants, in various amounts, based on need, to athletes and athletic groups. Submissions may be made to any Director of the Booster Club Organization.

Awards are given to High School Students for their combined athletic skills, leadership qualities, citizenship contributions and academic achievements. The awards are the:

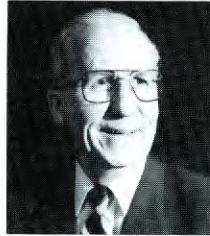
SPORTSMEN'S DINNER

He umpired in semi-pro baseball for five years and then joined the Little League in 1957 and coached, managed and umpired for 13 years.

In 1980, Ray was the Booster Club Sportsman of the year.

Ray, renowned in curling circles, has been very active on the international curling scene during the past few years.

He continues to work in his commercial marketing field and keeps a busy family life. Married to Nancy since 1945, they have four children.

He is presently President of the Canadian Curling Association but still finds time for his hobbies of carpentry, playing guitar and collecting odds and ends.

THE HISTORY OF THE CALGARY BOOSTER CLUB

The Calgary Booster Club originated from an idea during a get together of a group of sports minded individuals in the Old Club Cafe on eighth avenue east.

Those who attended the first unofficial meeting of the Calgary Booster Club were some rather prominent Calgarians:

Stu Adams, "Adams Distillers Limited"
Roy Beavers, Owner Club Cafe
Ron Butlin, Business Executive Central Liquidation (Canada) Ltd.
Ernie McCullough, Jr., Maclin Motors

The idea generated was very basic — to organize a Club in the City of Calgary of sport enthusiasts to boost amateur sports and sports in general.

This group gathered within its ranks other sports and they in turn moved their location (for coffee) to the old Pump Room in the Petroleum Building on 9th Avenue and 2nd Street West where they met once a week and made plans and had discussions relative to their new found interest. The "Calgary Booster Club" which name was decided on early in their organizational stage.

One of the highlights of the Booster Club in the early years was the Sunday evening sports panels that met in the Palace Theatre. In addition, Art Smith and Ron Butlin moderated a radio show on amateur sports on CFAC once a week.

From its inception the ranks of The Calgary Booster Club have been filled with prominent Calgarians, several who served in the capacity of President. In the founding year 1953, Art Smith served as President and he was followed by the likes of Bob Freeze, Ken Moore, Bill Dickie, Ron Butlin, Lou Goodwin, Stu Adams and Doug Mitchell. Every one of these gentlemen devoted countless hours to the promotion of amateur sport and all Calgarians owe them a vote of thanks.

The present Calgary Booster Club is "dedicated to the development of athletic endeavour". It achieves its purpose by three methods:

- (a) Administrative and publicity assistance to organizations putting on athletic events. In this it supplies manpower.
- (b) Consultant service for organizations wishing advice on promotion of their particular sport.
- (c) By making grants to organizations to help such organizations achieve their purpose and benefit their particular sports.

The Calgary Booster Club believes that athletic endeavour in the City of Calgary can be best advanced by the development of enthusiastic, highly trained, dedicated individuals. GUEST SPEAKER JAMES E. FINKS

When Jim Finks was appointed President and Chief Executive Officer of the Chicago National League Ball Club, Inc. last September 21st, the Cubs not only acquired an astute businessman, but an individual who has gone to war at various levels of professional sports.

Jim has excelled in sports as a player, coach, general manager and management consultant. Though he has spent the majority of his working life in football — college and professional - Jim eagerly awaits the task of helping to mold the Cubs into pennant contenders in the National League.

"I know this is a great city, filled with truly knowledgeable and exuberant fans," Jim said. "My career has been devoted to trying to bring success to sports and organizations. By joining the Tribune Company and the Cubs it provides me with both an honour and a challenge to bring a champion to Chicago."

"This appointment completes the organizational structure we had planned two years ago," said Cook, adding that the position of President and CEO had not been utilized in the organization since Tribune Company acquired the Cubs in August of 1981.

Jim had resigned from his position with the Bears about a month before joining the Cubs. He had spent nine years with the Bears, joining them two days before the 1974 season. Prior to that, the Salem, Illinois native spent ten years with the Minnesota Vikings.

He joined the Vikings in 1964 as their general manager and directed the club into the Super Bowl five seasons later. In 1968 while still with the Vikings, Jim became a member of the National Football League's Management Council — the equivalent to baseball's Players' Relations Committee (PRC). He served on the Competition (Rules) Committee for three years (1971-73). In 1974, after the Vikings' second Super Bowl appearance, Jim resigned to go with the Management Council full time until his appointment as Chicago Bears Executive Vice President and General Manager in September of that year.

Jim was a two-sport professional athlete in his early years with the Steelers. He began thirty-three years of service in professional football as a quarterback and defensive back with the Steelers in 1949. The Tulsa University graduate was selected to the Pro Bowl in 1953. In 1949 and 1950, Jim also played baseball in the Cincinnati Reds farm system. In 1949 he played Class B ball in Austin, Texas and in 1950 jumped to the Sally League in Columbia, South Carolina to play Class A ball. Among his teammates in the minors were Wally Post and Roy MacMillian, both of whom later starred with the Reds.

Jim left the professional playing ranks as a player in 1956 and served as a backfield coach for Terry Brennan at Notre Dame. From 1957 until 1964 he worked for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League, first as a scout and later as the club's General Manager.

In addition to his work with the club's playing personnel during his tenure with the Chicago Bears, Jim also had a major role in the renovation of Soldier Field in 1982 and Halas Hall on the campus of Lake Forest College, the Bears' summer training site.

Jim and his wife, Maxine, have four sons — Jim, David, Dan and Tom. They reside in Winnetka, Illinois. When away from his busy schedule at Wrigley Field, Jim lists playing tennis as one of his favorite hobbies.

This is an impressive record of a gentleman we once knew as a Calgarian during a stop-over of several years here, on his way to the top.

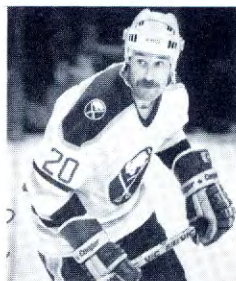
