THE HISTORY OF THE CALGARY BOOSTER CLUB

The Calgary Booster Club originated from an idea during a get together of a group of sports minded individuals in the Old Club Cafe on eighth avenue east.

Those who attended the first unofficial meeting of the Calgary Booster Club were some rather prominent Calgarians:

The idea generated was very basic — to organize a Club in the City of Calgary of sport enthusiasts to boost amateur sports and sports in general.

This group gathered within its ranks other sports and they in turn moved their location (for coffee) to the old Pump Room in the Petroleum Building on 9th Avenue and 2nd Street West where they met once a week and made plans and had discussions relative to their new found interest. The "Calgary Booster Club" which name was decided on early in their organizational stage.

One of the highlights of the Booster Club in the early years was the Sunday evening sports panels that met in the Palace Theatre. In addition, Art Smith and Ron Butlin moderated a radio show on amateur sports on CFAC once a week.

From its inception the ranks of The Calgary Booster Club have been filled with prominent Calgarians, several who served in the capacity of President. In the founding year 1953, Art Smith served as President and he was followed by the likes of Bob Freeze, Ken Moore, Bill Dickie, Ron Butlin, Lou Goodwin, Stu Adams and Doug Mitchell. Every one of these gentlemen devoted countless hours to the promotion of amateur sport and all Calgarians owe them a vote of thanks.

The present Calgary Booster Club is "dedicated to the development of athletic endeavour". It achieves its purpose by three methods:

- (a) Administrative and publicity assistance to organizations putting on athletic events. In this it supplies manpower.
- (b) Consultant service for organizations wishing advice on promotion of their particular sport.
- (c) By making grants to organizations to help such organizations achieve their purpose and benefit their particular sports.

The Calgary Booster Club believes that athletic endeavour in the City of Calgary can be best advanced by the development of enthusiastic, highly trained, dedicated individuals. These people can then sell the value of athletics to our youth. Leadership — in sport — as in business — is the key to success. It is our hope that we can give needed assistance to organized athletic organizations that are interested in and capable of making a definite contribution to the youth of our City.

It is our aim that assistance obtained from the Calgary Booster Club will help encourage, promote and develop athletic endeavour in our City through the development and extension of existing activities and services and the training of personnel. Such training should include courses for lay and professional personnel with a view to increasing the number of qualified leaders and coaches in our community.

The Calgary Booster Club is proud to recognize Marg & Ron Southern as the 1986 "Sportspeople of the Year."

Through his energy and determination, Ron Southern helped advance a modest-sized family business into a major international corporation. Through her imagination and enthusiasm, Marg Southern helped create a world famous equestrian centre. For most of us, either achievement would be sufficient for one lifetime. But not for the Southern's. Individually and together, this remarkable couple continues to promote the best interest of Alberta and Albertans, through a commitment to the community which has extended well over thirty years.

Marg Southern's efforts first gained public attention in the early fifties. As President of Girls Intra-mural Sports at the University of Alberta, and as a member of the intra-varsity basketball, volleyball, badminton, and golf teams, she developed an early interest in the sporting and recreational opportunities open to Albertans. In 1963, Marg was appointed to the City of Calgary Parks and Recreation Board and was instrumental in the formation of Calgary's ambitious land banking program which ensured lands for future recreation space in the rapidly-growing city.

Ron Southern, meanwhile, was making his own presence felt. He donated, as a Centennial project, the development aspect of the 17-acre Centenary Park near the Calgary Zoo, taking a personal role in its design and landscaping. He backed his support of the Boy Scout movement with a donation of trailer units and played a similar role in the development of Camp Horizon.

Starting in 1970, Marg & Ron entered into a project that many thought was an impossible dream — the development of a world-class equestrian centre just outside Calgary. 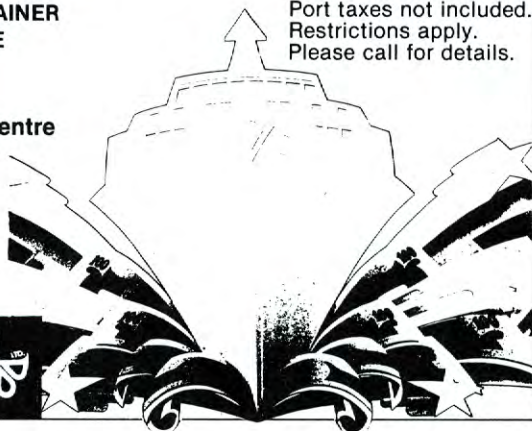

DENNIS HULL

GUEST SPEAKER AL MICHAELS

Al Michaels, the 1983 "Sports-caster of the Year" as voted by his peers in both the electronic and print media, widely acclaimed for his knowledgeable and insightful reporting of baseball, is more than just the principal play-by-play broadcaster on ABC's telecasts of Major League Baseball.

The versatile Mr. Michaels is perhaps best known for his memorable and poignant calling of the USA hockey team's successfully dramatic quest for the gold medal in the 1980 Winter Olympics. This helped him garner his first "Sports-caster of the Year" award, shared

with NBC's Dick Engberg, in 1980. His reputation for Olympic acumen continued with his coverage of figure skating and hockey at the 1984 Winter Games in Sarajevo and track and field and road cycling at the Summer Games in Los Angeles.

He has announced baseball for ABC since the network's most recent coverage began in 1976, including the 1979, 1981, 1983 and 1985 World Series; 1980, 1982 & 1984 All-Star Games; and the 1976-78-80-82-84 League Championship Series.

Mr. Michaels also has worked on ABC's "NCAA Football" series in addition to covering a variety of "ABC's Wide World of Sports" events and the "The Superstars."

An all-around sports enthusiast, Mr. Michaels was born in Brooklyn 39 years ago where he grew up as a Dodger fan. When the Dodgers left New York, coincidentally Al's family did too, and settled in Los Angeles.

A baseball and football player at L.A.'s Hamilton High School, Mr. Michaels decided before college that he would like to remain in sports as a broadcaster. He majored in radio and television and minored in journalism at Arizona State University.

He began broadcasting games of the Hawaii Islanders in the Pacific Coast League in 1968. He also called the football and basketball play-by-play for the University of Hawaii Rainbows. At the same time, Mr. Michaels reported on high school sports and hosted three television sports shows daily.

Al's minor league baseball career did not last long. He went to Cincinnati in 1971, when at 26 years old he became the number one broadcaster for the Reds whom he covered in the 1972 World Series for NBC Radio and Television.

By 1974, he was the No. 1 sportscaster for the San Francisco Giants on KSFO Radio and KTVU-TV, a position he held until signing on with ABC Sports in January of 1977.

Mr. Michaels has been honored as "Sportscaster of the Year" in both Ohio and Hawaii. For two seasons (1973 through 1975) he was the TV play-by-play announcer for UCLA basketball and for four years (1972-76) he was used as a basketball announcer for TVS, handling a variety of Pacific Eight Conference games.

Al and his wife, Linda, have a son Steven age 15, and a daughter, Jennifer 11. The Michaels reside in Menlo Park, California, a San Francisco suburb.

GUEST SPEAKER

RON LUCIANO

Before Ron Luciano's appearance on major league baseball diamonds umpires were paid to be heard, but not seen. Luciano quickly changed that, bringing an outrageous style and infectious enthusiasm to the grand old game unlike anything anyone had ever seen. Standing 6'4" tall and weighing almost 300 pounds, Luciano would have been difficult to overlook just going through the normal umpires' motions, but he would often leap into the air two or three times to make a call, pretend to "shoot" a player 15 times to call him out, talk to the fans between innings, or sail a paper airplane back into the stands. Once,

he even allowed a catcher whom he trusted, to call his own balls and strikes.

Ron Luciano's antics, and obvious love of the game, endeared him to the fans and outraged the baseball establishment, particularly the commissioner, Bowie Kuhn. Still, he was the best, and when All-Star game and World Series time rolled around, there would be Luciano behind the plate.

Luciano retired from umpiring in 1978 to become color commentator for NBC Baseball's "Game of the Week", a position he held for three years despite his own concerns that he had a "face made for radio and a voice trained for pantomime."

Perhaps the biggest indication of Ron Luciano's popularity is the success of his bestselling books **The Umpire Strikes Back** (Bantam, 1982) and **Strike Two** (Bantam, 1984). Serialized in two consecutive issues of *Sports Illustrated* and excerpted in *Playboy*, *Reader's Digest* and *The Daily News*, **The Umpire Strikes Back** promptly distinguished itself in 1982 by becoming the first "sports book" to reach *The New York Times* bestseller list in two and one half years. **Strike Two**, the sequel, enjoyed a similar success, and a third book, **The Fall of the Roman Umpire**, will be published in the Spring of 1986. Moreover, Luciano's appearances on "The Today Show," "David Letterman" and Johnny Carson's "Tonight Show;" his television commercials for United Airlines and Petro Canada; and features in *People Magazine*, *TV Guide*, *The New York Times* and most of the country's major papers have given Luciano a visibility as a humorist and raconteur as well as a sports expert.

Before beginning his involvement with baseball, Luciano's primary sport was football. He earned All-State honors as a scholastic star in his hometown of Endicott, New York, and then went on to earn All-American honors as a tackle at Syracuse University, where he received a B.S. degree in mathematics. He played in the 1957 Cotton Bowl and in the 1959 Orange Bowl with the Syracuse Orangemen, and then went on to play two years of professional football with the Detroit Lions (1959-1960).

Luciano, 43, still resides in Endicott, New York. He is an amateur ornithologist and an avid gourmande who has eaten his way through twenty-six major league cities.

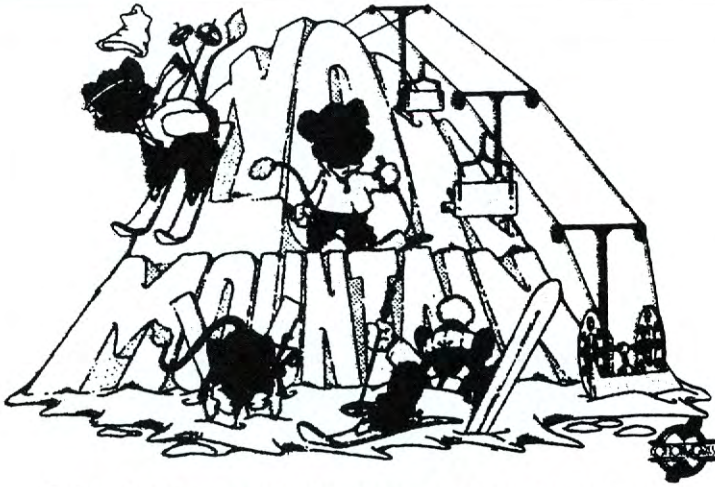

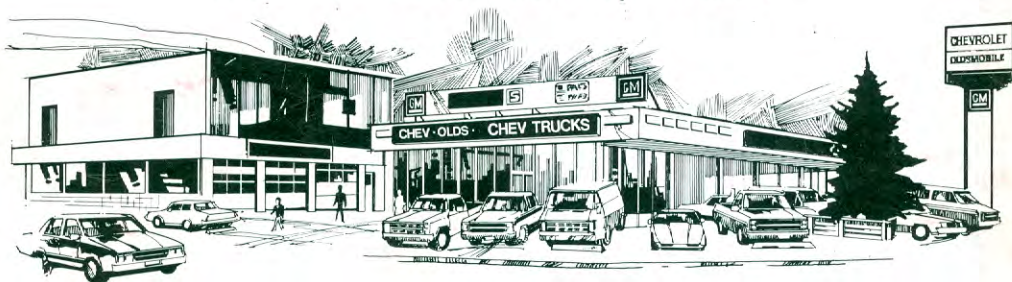
