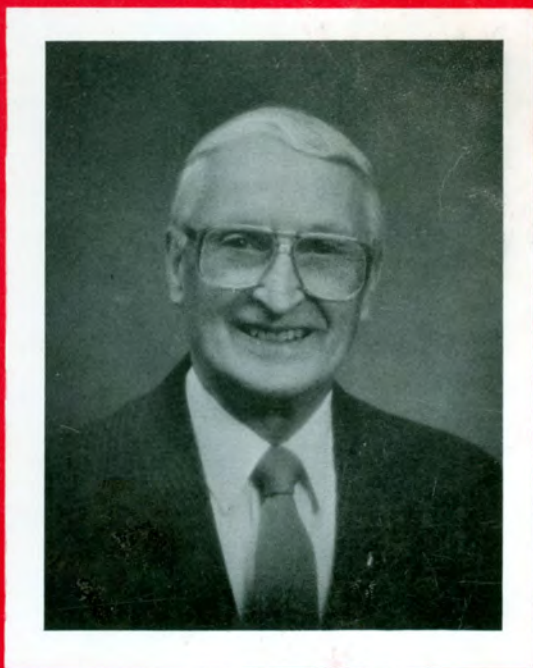

Born in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Joe Carbury started in radio some 40 years ago in Medicine Hat, Alberta. Since entering the broadcasting business, Joe has become a true veteran of radio sports broadcasting.

Over the years, Joe has done the play-by-play for the Calgary Stampeder Football Team (1953 - 1958, 1971-1973), the Hamilton Tiger Cats (1959 - 1960), and the Edmonton Eskimos (1961 - 1962). In addition, he has done play by play for well over 1000 hockey games, including broadcasts of the Calgary Stampeders of the Western Hockey League and the Calgary Centennials of the WCHL. He was also a frequent radio host on the Toronto Maple Leaf Hot Stove League from 1959 to 1960. Joe has also broadcast boxing, curling, golf and baseball.

For the past 20 years, Joe has been the track announcer for the chuckwagon races at the Calgary Stampede. And, for 25 years, he has been the track announcer for thoroughbred racing at Stampede Park, broadcasting over 15,000 races during that time.

Joe was recently inducted into the Calgary Stampede Hall of Fame.

Prior to his recent death, a Calgary arena was named in his honour. The Calgary Booster Club takes pride in recognizing a "true Calgarian."




LAWRENCE KING - SCHOOL ATHLETICS

PAUL GEDDES - HOCKEY

A 4th year University of Calgary hockey player, Paul now holds all of the scoring records at the University of Calgary. He recently broke the scoring record for the entire CWJAA on "Paul Geddes Night."

Paul was a member of the Gold Medal winning Team Canada at the Spangler Cup in 1986-1987. He was the leading scorer in the tournament.

A consistent All-Star, Paul has also been the CIAU Most Sportsmanlike Player.



JOHN GRAHAM - TRACK AND FIELD

Currently ranked #1 in Canada in the 300, 400, and 600m, and 400m hurdles, John enjoyed outstanding success in 1986.

He won a bronze medal in both the 400m hurdles and 4 x 400m Relay at the Commonwealth Games. In addition, he set a new Canadian record in the 400m event at the Canadian Senior Indoor Championships.

Currently the #4 ranked amateur in Canada, Marilyn has enjoyed tremendous success in the sport of golf.

THE HISTORY OF THE CALGARY BOOSTER CLUB

The Calgary Booster Club originated from an idea during a get together of a group of sports minded individuals in the Old Club Cafe on eighth avenue east.

Those who attended the first unofficial meeting of the Calgary Booster Club were some rather prominent Calgarians:

The idea generated was very basic — to organize a Club in the City of Calgary of sport enthusiasts to boost amateur sports and sports in general.

This group gathered within its ranks other sports and they in turn moved their location (for coffee) to the old Pump Room in the Petroleum Building on 9th Avenue and 2nd Street West where they met once a week and made plans and had discussions relative to their new found interest. The "Calgary Booster Club" which name was decided on early in their organizational stage.

One of the highlights of the Booster Club in the early years was the Sunday evening sports panels that met in the Palace Theatre. In addition, Art Smith and Ron Butlin moderated a radio show on amateur sports on CFAC once a week.

From its inception the ranks of The Calgary Booster Club have been filled with prominent Calgarians, several who served in the capacity of President. In the founding year 1953, Art Smith served as President and he was followed by the likes of Bob Freeze, Ken Moore, Bill Dickie, Ron Butlin, Lou Goodwin, Stu Adams and Doug Mitchell. Every one of these gentlemen devoted countless hours to the promotion of amateur sport and all Calgarians owe them a vote of thanks.

The present Calgary Booster Club is "dedicated to the development of athletic endeavour". It achieves its purpose by three methods:

- (a) Administrative and publicity assistance to organizations putting on athletic events. In this it supplies manpower.
- (b) Consultant service for organizations wishing advice on promotion of their particular sport.
- (c) By making grants to organizations to help such organizations achieve their purpose and benefit their particular sports.

The Calgary Booster Club believes that athletic endeavour in the City of Calgary can be best advanced by the development of enthusiastic, highly trained, dedicated individuals. These people can then sell the value of athletics to our youth. Leadership — in sport — as in business — is the key to success. It is our hope that we can give needed assistance to organized athletic organizations that are interested in and capable of making a definite contribution to the youth of our City.

It is our aim that assistance obtained from the Calgary Booster Club will help encourage, promote and develop athletic endeavour in our City through the development and extension of existing activities and services and the training of personnel. Such training should include courses for lay and professional personnel with a view to increasing the number of qualified leaders and coaches in our community.

1987 SPORTSMAN OF THE YEAR

DOUG ROOKE

Doug was born on September 24, 1917, in the small town of Pollockville, Alberta. After attending elementary school in Pollockville, Doug graduated from high school in Hanna. He joined the Air Force and served four years as an Air Frame Mechanic and was stationed overseas with the Moose Squadron. In 1946, he joined Revenue Canada in the U.I.C. office and in 1948 transferred to the Income Tax Department, where he remained until his retirement on December 31, 1982.

Doug has contributed countless hours to the sports of baseball, hockey, and football in addition to his outstanding contributions at the community level. In baseball, Doug coached the Sun Oil Team in 1957-58 and coached and managed Little League teams in the South West Baseball Association for six years. He is still active with Continental East Little League teams, as coach and/or trainer, volunteering his time each summer for the kids in his community.

In the sport of hockey, Doug has coached, managed, and been the trainer for minor hockey teams from Tiny Mite "BB" up to and including Juvenile "BB." He started the 1948-50 season with the Mount Pleasant Community as coach of the Midget "BB" Hockey Club before moving to the Glamorgan-Richmond Community in 1960, where he coached from Tiny Mite "BB" up to Juvenile "BB" until 1973. In 1973, Doug moved to Lake Bonavista where he coached Midget "B" and was trainer and manager for the Juvenile "BB" club. Doug was always available when the ice needed flooding, cleaning, or if transportation was needed to transfer the teams from one community to another.

Doug also has made a significant contribution to the sport of football. He was associated with the Cowley and Keith Colts Bantam Football Club as trainer and equipment manager for more than ten years. Doug and Bruce Dubbin, a City of Calgary Police Detective, started Flag Football in 1967 for the youngsters of our city. Doug was also involved in the organization of the Frank Andruski Football School in 1971-72. In addition, when time permitted, Doug helped as trainer for the Junior and Senior football teams at E.P. Scarlett.

Doug has recently completed working as a volunteer during the Calgary Cup Hockey Tournament and has been a volunteer at the Calgary Booster Club Hockey School for the past five years.

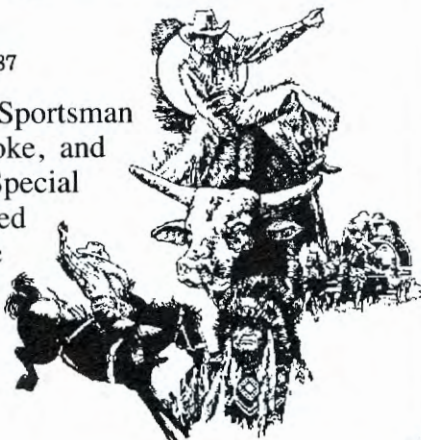

RICK JOHNSON

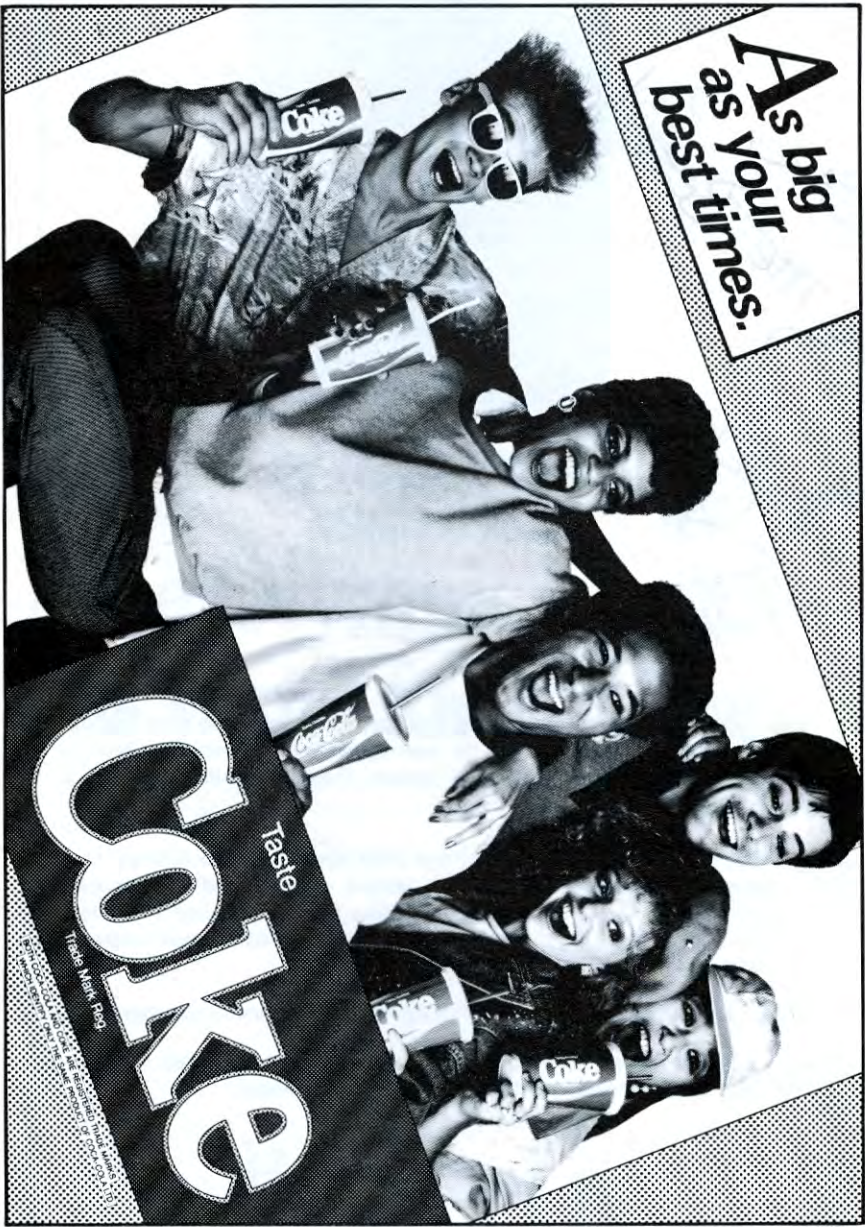
Born in 1961, Rick Johnson came to the Calgary Stampeders after graduating from college at Southern Illinois. He was signed to the Stampeders from the neg list in 1985. During the 1985 season, Rick shared the quarterbacking duties with the Stampeders.

In 1986, Rick assumed the number one pivot position for the Stamps. He led the league last season in total yards passing (4,379), and the number of touchdown passes (31). He led the Stampeders to an impressive 11 - 7 record and a playoff berth last season. For his efforts, he was voted the most outstanding offensive player by his teammates.

Rick recently was selected as the CFL's All-Pro Quarterback for the 1986 season.

He is single and has established his home in Calgary. A well-spoken and popular player, Rick is an excellent ambassador for the Stampeders.

GUEST SPEAKER

DARRYL SITTLER

Darryl Sittler was one of the most popular athletes ever to play in Toronto. Drafted by the Maple Leafs in the 1970 Amateur draft as the team's 1st choice, 8th overall, Sittler spent 12 years in Toronto and was captain of the club for six seasons, 1975-81.

He retired from professional hockey in August 1985 after a 15 year NHL career with three teams, Toronto for 11½ seasons; Philadelphia for 2½ seasons and Detroit Red Wings for his final season. Sittler finished with 484 goals, 637 assists for 1,121 regular season total points, standing 15th on the list of all-time NHL point getters.

Sittler holds the NHL record for most points in a single game, 10, when he scored 6 goals and 4 assists in a game against Boston Bruins, February 7, 1976. He also tied an NHL Stanley Cup playoff record with five goals in a single game, against Philadelphia on April 22, 1976.

He, of course, owns a number of Leaf records, including most career goals (389), most career assists (527), most career points (916). He is the club record holder for assists in a single season (72 in 1977-78) and total points (117 in 1977-78). Sittler also holds the Leaf record for most consecutive games (18) scoring at least one point. He led the Leafs in scoring for eight consecutive seasons (1972-80) and set the Leaf single game goal record (6) in that memorable game against Boston.

Despite never advancing further than the semi-finals in Stanley Cup play with the Leafs, Sittler established the club record for most points (21) in the playoffs, in 1976-77, including a record 16 assists.

He was named to the NHL All-Star team once, as the second team centre in 1978 and also was a prominent member of Team Canada in World Hockey Championships and the Canada Cup.

In 1976, he scored the winning goal in overtime to beat Czechoslovakia and give the inaugural Canada Cup to Team Canada.

Sittler resides in East Amherst, N.Y. with wife Wendy and children Ryan (12), Meaghan (10) and Ashley (5). He also spends time at the family cottage near Orillia.

He has been actively involved in charity work over the years, including Ronald McDonald House and the Disabled Athletes Program at Maple Leaf Gardens.

He also has worked as a television colour commentator for Canada Cup and World Hockey Championship games.

Sittler has been a member of Team Labatt for the past two years and travels the country making public relations appearances on behalf of the company.

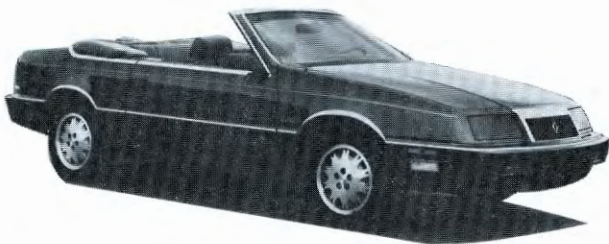

GUEST SPEAKER

FRANK GIFFORD

ABC Sports Commentator Frank Gifford marks his 16th consecutive season as a member of ABC's NFL "Monday Night Football" broadcast team in 1986.

In addition to his work on the two-time Emmy Award winning series, Mr. Gifford has served as a host of ABC Sports weekend programming and is seen on a variety of "ABC's Wide World of Sports," programs and ABC Sports specials. He has covered the 1972, 1976 and 1984 Olympic Games, the Winter Olympics of 1976, 1980 and 1984 and Super Bowl XI in January of 1985. Mr. Gifford also serves as a guest host of ABC's "Good Morning America."

Mr. Gifford began his broadcasting career in 1957, while still an active player with the New York Football Giants. In 1959, he was a commentator of the NFL pre-game show on CBS-TV. He joined the WCBS-TV staff in New York as a part-time sports reporter in 1961. Upon his retirement from football three years later, he joined the CBS staff full-time. He came to ABC in 1971.

The highly respected Mr. Gifford received major honors in the summer and fall of 1977. He was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in July, in recognition of his brilliant career with the New York Giants. Later that year, he won the Emmy Award as television's Outstanding Sports Personality for 1976-77.

He also is a member of the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame, having been inducted in 1975 for his gridiron exploits at the University of Southern California, where he earned All-America honors as an offensive and defensive back.

In February, 1984, Mr. Gifford received the prestigious Christopher Award for his work on "ABC's Wide World of Sports" coverage of the 1983 International Special Olympics. The Multiple Sclerosis Society of New York honored him in March of 1984 with its Founders Award that included a research grant of \$100,000 in the name of Frank Gifford. And in March of 1985, the NFL Alumni bestowed upon him the Career Achievement Award for "demonstrating the higher values of football through his career and after."

The Giants' first draft choice in 1952, Mr. Gifford earned All-Pro honors six times as a halfback, and was the NFL's Most Valuable Player in 1956 when he led the Giants to the World Championship. He was twice voted to the NFL's Pro Bowl and was MVP in the 1959 game. In 1964, his final playing season, he was named Sportsman of the Year.

An injury forced his temporary retirement in 1961, but he returned the following season at the new position of flankerback and was named NFL Comeback Player of the Year by UPI.

Mr. Gifford set Giant records that still stand, including most touchdowns (78) and most yards gained pass receiving (5,434). He scored 484 points during his 12-year career, leading the Giants to two titles in his last three years as a player.

Among his charitable activities, Mr. Gifford has been a member of the National Society of Multiple Sclerosis for ten years. He has been the Chairman of the Sports casting Committee for the Special Olympics since 1974 and a member of its board of Directors since 1983.

In addition to writing several magazine articles on sports and sportscasting, Mr. Gifford is the author of several successful books, including "Gifford on Courage" - a book not about Mr. Gifford, but about ten of the most courageous athletes he knows.

INSTRUCTIONAL SCHOOLS

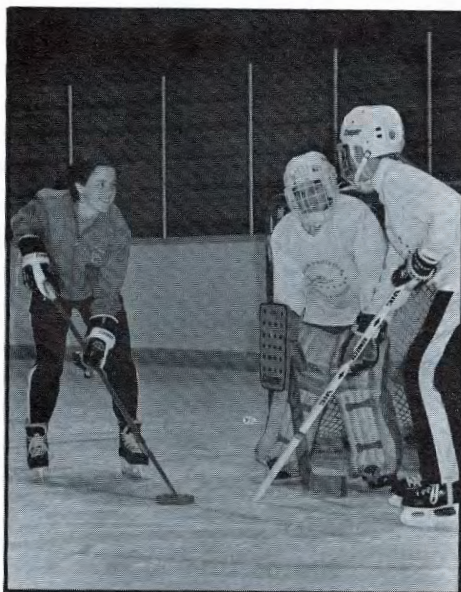
