THE HISTORY OF THE CALGARY BOOSTER CLUB

The Calgary Booster Club originated from an idea during a get together of a group of sports minded individuals in the Old Club Cafe on eighth avenue east.

Those who attended the first unofficial meeting of the Calgary Booster Club were some rather prominent Calgarians:

The idea generated was very basic — to organize a Club in the City of Calgary of sport enthusiasts to boost amateur sports and sports in general.

This group gathered within its ranks other sports and they in turn moved their location (for coffee) to the old Pump Room in the Petroleum Building on 9th Avenue and 2nd Street West where they met once a week and made plans and had discussions relative to their new found interest. The "Calgary Booster Club" which name was decided on early in their organizational stage.

One of the highlights of the Booster Club in the early years was the Sunday evening sports panels that met in the Palace Theatre. In addition, Art Smith and Ron Butlin moderated a radio show on amateur sports on CFAC once a week.

From its inception the ranks of The Calgary Booster Club have been filled with prominent Calgarians, several who served in the capacity of President. In the founding year 1953, Art Smith served as President and he was followed by the likes of Bob Freeze, Ken Moore, Bill Dickie, Ron Butlin, Lou Goodwin, Stu Adams and Doug Mitchell. Every one of these gentlemen devoted countless hours to the promotion of amateur sport and all Calgarians owe them a vote of thanks.

The present Calgary Booster Club is "dedicated to the development of athletic endeavour". It achieves its purpose by three methods:

- (a) Administrative and publicity assistance to organizations putting on athletic events. In this it supplies manpower.
- (b) Consultant service for organizations wishing advice on promotion of their particular sport.
- (c) By making grants to organizations to help such organizations achieve their purpose and benefit their particular sports.

The Calgary Booster Club believes that athletic endeavour in the City of Calgary can be best advanced by the development of enthusiastic, highly trained, dedicated individuals. These people can then sell the value of athletics to our youth. Leadership — in sport — as in business — is the key to success. It is our hope that we can give needed assistance to organized athletic organizations that are interested in and capable of making a definite contribution to the youth of our City.

It is our aim that assistance obtained from the Calgary Booster Club will help encourage, promote and develop athletic endeavour in our City through the development and extension of existing activities and services and the training of personnel. Such training should include courses for lay and professional personnel with a view to increasing the number of qualified leaders and coaches in our community.

THE CALGARY BOOSTER CLUB SPORTS WALL OF FAME



Over a number of years, the Calgary Booster Club discussed the concept of a permanent display of recognition for its leadership and athletic award recipients. At a "Future Directions Workshop" held on Saturday, January 21, 1984, a workshop attended by a majority of Club Directors of that year as well as a number of Honorary Directors, approval was given to proceed with the Sports Wall of Fame Project.

After reviewing a number of potential locations and putting together the funds necessary for the project, an agreement was reached between the Club and the Directors of Lindsay Park Sports Centre to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility. Initial plans for the project were developed in March, 1987, and the Sports Wall of Fame was opened to the public on December 9, 1987.

As each year's group of award recipients is announced, these names will be added to the display, providing a complete history of persons honoured by the Calgary Booster Club.

Born in Manitoba, Jack started his career in journalism in 1955 with the Brandon Sun. He worked as a photographer and did some writing as well. After a stint in Kamloops at the local newspaper, Jack turned to the hockey business and was involved for six years with the Calgary Centennial's organization under Scotty Munro. Jack was General Manager of the successful Centennials for a period of two years.

Following his brief career in hockey, Jack moved to the Calgary Albertan in 1976 as a desk man. In May, 1977, Jack became City Editor. He then moved to the Calgary Sun in 1980 where he continues to serve as a columnist, writing columns 5 days a week and interviewing Sunshine Girls!

Jack also owns and publishes three weekly newspapers in the Calgary area - the "Airdrie Echo", the "Rockyview Times", and the "Cochrane This Week". In addition, Jack owned and published the "Spirit of '88", the first Olympic newspaper in history.

As a member of the Canadian Olympic Team in 1988, Jon placed 7th in the 200m breast stroke. Also in 1988, he won a Gold Medal at the Canadian Summer Nationals, Gold at the Canadian Olympic trials, and set an Alberta Age Group Record in the 200m breast stroke.

Jon was an integral part of the record-setting teams at the Canadian Summer Nationals in the 4x50m and 4x100m medley relays.

He is considered one of Canada's best prospects for future international competition in the 200m breast stroke.



IAN JAMES - FOOTBALL

Ian was a Team Captain of the 1988 Vanier Cup Champions, the University of Calgary Dinosaurs. The last two years, Ian has been named to the C.I.A.U. All-Canadian Team.

Ian's skills and leadership capabilities have contributed greatly to the team's success.

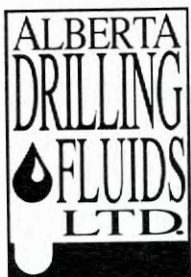


ROMEL RAFFIN - BASKETBALL

A Gold Medal performance at the 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul, in the synchronized swim solo competition, combined with her duet Gold made Carolyn Canada's only dual gold winner.

In addition to her gold medals at the Pre Olympics, Canadian Senior Nationals and Fina World Cup, Carolyn went on to attain Gold in the solo events at these same competitions. A solid duet performer and superb singles synchronized swimmer in a class of her own, recognized by the world in 1988.



MICHELLE CAMERON SYNCHRONIZED SWIMMING

A Gold Medal performance at the 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul in the synchronized swim duet competition. Michelle also won a Gold in the Pre Olympics meet in Seoul, the Canadian Senior Nationals and the Fina World Cup. The partnership of Michelle Cameron and Carolyn Waldo had perhaps their best year ever in duet synchronized competition. The Booster Club recognizes Michelle and her integral role in the success of this duet team.

ANDREA NUGENT - SWIMMING

As a member of Canada's Olympic Team, Andrea was part of the Bronze Medal 400m medley relay team at the 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul. Andrea won a Gold in the 50m freestyle at the Canadian Summer Nationals this year and is the current Canadian and Commonwealth record holder in this event.

Andrea represented Canada in the 50m freestyle, 100m freestyle and the 100m butterfly at the Seoul Olympics.



TOM PONTING - SWIMMING

As a member of Canada's Olympic Team, Tom was part of the silver medal 400m medley relay team at the 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul. This was Tom's second Olympics, he competed in 1984 in Los Angeles. Tom represented Canada in the 200m Butterfly and the 100m Butterfly at Seoul. At the Canadian Summer Nationals, Tom won a Gold in the 200m Butterfly, a silver in the 100m Butterfly and helped set Canadian records in the 4 X 200m Free Style relay, 4 X 100m medley relay, 4 X 50m medley relay.

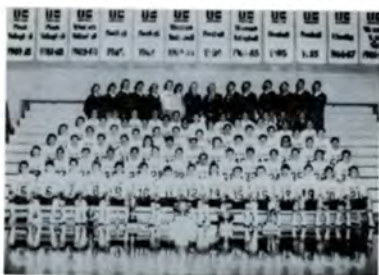


MARK TEWKSBURY - SWIMMING

As a member of Canada's Olympic Team, Mark was part the silver medal 400m medley relay team at the 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul. Mark represented Canada in the 100m backstroke and the 200m backstroke. At the Canadian Summer Nationals, Mark won a Gold in the 100m backstroke and helped set Canadian records in the 4 X 50m medley relay and 4 X 100m medley relay. Mark won Gold in the 100m backstroke at the Arena Festival in Bonn West Germany and the C.I.A.U. Championships.



He began coaching minor football and in 1962, he served on a committee that pioneered the Calgary Bantam Football Association (CBFA). 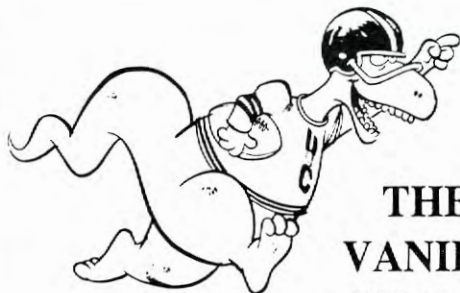

GUEST SPEAKER

JIM NELFORD

Jim played Redwood Meadows on Sunday, June 30, 1985 and shot a 37-32 for a 69 total shot round.

On September 8, 1985, Lake Saguaro, Arizona, the gifted Canadian golfer was run down by a run-a-way ski tow boat in a bizarre water skiing accident.

Jim was born in Vancouver, June 28, 1955. He started golfing at the age of nine and is an ambidextrous player, hitting right but putting left. In his early teens he started to think more seriously about golf, and one day he read in a magazine about how colleges gave scholarships for golf. Happily he received a scholarship to Brigham Young University. Jim was a fine amateur, winning the Canadian Amateur in 1975 and 1976 and the Western Amateur in 1977. He won the 1976 Pan American and Pacific Coast inter-collegiate events. He was All-Western Athletic Conference for three years and twice named to the second team All American.

The native Canadian turned pro in 1977 and may never come as close to victory as he did in the 1984 Bing Crosby Pro Amateur, only to have it pulled from his grasp in the most unusual finish of the year.

Jim shot a four under par 68 at Pebble Beach and was in the club house at 10 hunder par 278. Hale Irwin was nine under par with two holes to play. Hale parred the 17th and then on the 18th tee he pulled his drive far to the left. The ball appeared to be headed for Carmel Bay but it hit among the rocks and somehow bounced back on the fairway.

Irwin then reached the green in regulation, placing his approach only five feet from the cup on the par 5 hole, he made it for the birdie and the tie.

On the second extra hole, Irwin hit a poor drive into a bunker, and then hit a career two iron shot nine feet from the hole. He made it for the victory.

Following Jim's accident, he was very positive, "I will play again". During his playing absence from the tour—in part made possible by a precedent setting PGA tour decision, Jim has assisted in commentary for two ESPN tournaments and has worked with CBC Television on the Canadian Open.

After a lengthy rehabilitation, a recovery viewed as miraculous, Jim has rejoined the PGA Tour. The climb back was not an easy task and his dream now would be to win the Masters. His profile of courage will always be remembered, and don't discount anything Jim Nelford "the battler" may do in the future.

JOHN FERGUSON

As a member of the Montreal Canadiens, John played on five Stanley Cup championship teams (1963-1964, 1964-1965, 1967-1968, 1968-1969 and 1970-1971). Following his playing days, John served as the Assistant Coach and General Manager for the famous Team Canada-Soviet Series in 1972.

Following a stint as General Manager of the New York Rangers from 1976-1978, John joined the Winnipeg Jets as General Manager in 1978, the year that the Jets won the Avco Cup. That same year John served as General Manager of the WHA All Stars which defeated the Soviet National team 3-0.

As the Jets entered the NHL in 1978, John served as General Manager bringing the team into the new league, and remained as General Manager and Vice-President until October, 1988. Presently General Manager of Team Canada for the World Championship in Sweden in 1989.

The British Columbia Sports Hall of Fame, in 1979, saw fit to elect John to its prestigious Hall. As a hockey executive, John has received a number of accolades, including twice being voted as Hockey News Executive of the Year in 1981-1982, and 1984-1985 and three times being voted as the Executive of the Year by Sporting News in 1981-1982, 1984-1985 and 1986-1987.

Married to wife Joan, with four children (Christina, Catherine, Joanne and John), John and his family have been permanent residents of Winnipeg ever since he joined the Winnipeg Jets as General Manager in the WHA days.

A fiercely intense, but very private and sensitive individual, John devoted countless hours to putting Winnipeg on the national and international hockey map.

September 11, 1978:

"At a recent conference attended by Don Podgurny, an Alberta MLA suggested that the Calgary-Kananaskis area make a bid for the 1988 Winter Olympics. Bill Nield was to contact Hans Maciej to ascertain possible involvement by the club."

November 6, 1978:

"It was moved by Jack Wilson and seconded by Lorne Scott that the President appoint a committee to study the possible involvement of the Club in obtaining the 1988 Winter Olympics for the Kananaskis area and that the Club pay incidental costs related thereto."

December 4, 1978:

"Frank King and Bob Niven reported on the possibility of the Club becoming involved in the application for the 1988 Winter Olympics. After discussion of the funding and political requirements it was agreed that the Club should continue with its study."

January 8, 1979:

"Frank King reported on the progress he and Bob Niven have made regarding the feasibility and structuring of a proposal to stage the subject Olympics. Any proposal would have to be made on behalf of the City of Calgary and Mayor Alger has voiced his enthusiasm. Frank has met with the heads of various Sport Federation groups and feels we will be strongly supported. Several directors volunteered to assist this committee in the next stage of their program."

February 12, 1979:

"Under Frank King's direction this committee is rapidly progressing. Doug Kowel is to meet with Olympic Sport representatives at the Winter Games in Brandon this week. Bob Niven and Jack Wilson will be attending the pre-Olympic games in Lake Placid to meet with their organizers. It was moved by Frank King that the Booster Club donate \$5,000 to the Canadian Olympic Development Association for planning expenses. Seconded by Don Ingram. Carried."

And the rest, as they say, is history! From these beginnings came the 1988 Winter Olympic Games and a legacy to the City of Calgary that will affect present and future Calgarians for many years. The tremendous sport facilities constructed for the Olympics will no doubt encourage athletes to develop their skills in the hopes of experiencing the Olympic dream, a dream that we witnessed in February, 1988, here in Calgary.

The Calgary Booster Club played an exciting role in the obtaining and staging of the XV Winter Olympic Games. Many of its directors contributed significantly to the success of the Games. We are proud of our involvement and join with all Calgarians and Canadians in congratulating Team '88 for a job well done!

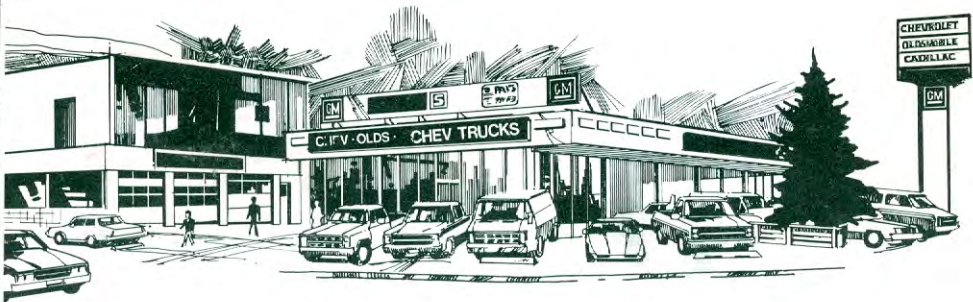
