On behalf of the Directors of the Calgary Booster Club, it is my pleasure and privilege to welcome you to the 35th Annual Sportsmen's Dinner.

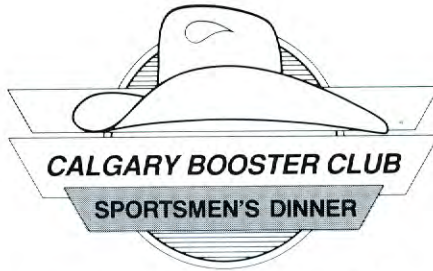

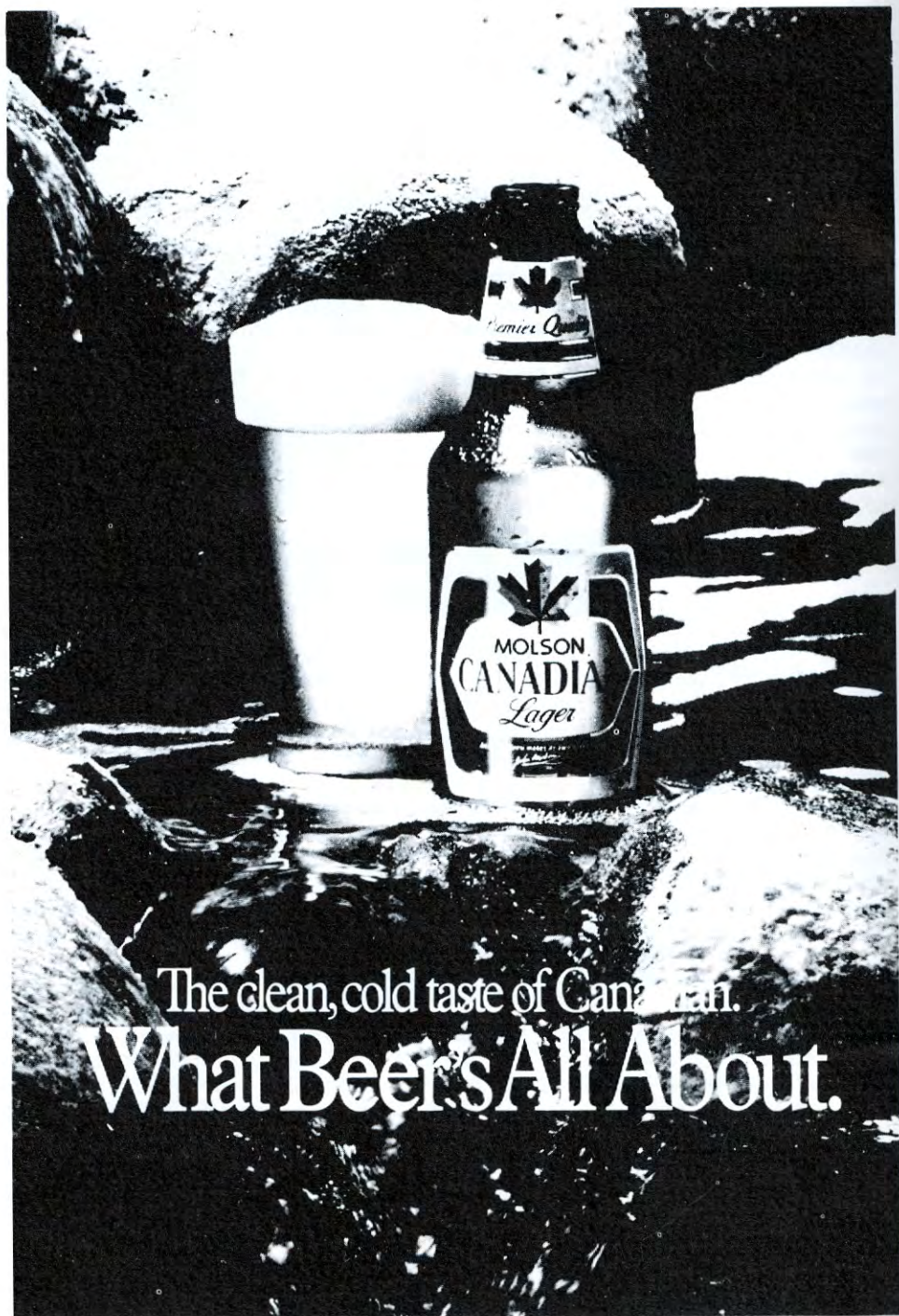

A few years later, Bill moved south to join the staff of the Calgary Albertan; he was moved into the Sports Department then directed by Hal Sigurdson in 1965.

Bill turned his sights to the electronic media in 1969. During almost 18 years with CKXL Radio, he covered every major sporting event staged in Calgary as well as handling daily sportscasts. At various times he hosted a talk show and served as play-by-play man or colour commentator during football broadcasts.

Bill left the radio biz in 1987 to work in the automotive business (Renfrew Chrysler) and later spent a season as Public Relations and Media Co-ordinator of the Calgary Stampeder Football Club.

Then it was back to the microphone. In August 1989, Bill became the QR77 sportscaster and also host of the popular Hockey Talk program which follows all Calgary Flames games.

Bill, recently married to Donna Lee, resides in southwest Calgary. Through 25 years of sports and community involvement, he has become famous (many would say infamous) for his sense of humour, his storytelling ability and his knowledge and love of people and sport.

Dee Read has dedicated her entire life to the betterment of her sport - alpine skiing. In the process, she has achieved a level of respect that is international in scope.

In the 1940's she was a world-class competitor and a Canadian Champion. She captured the 1948 National Downhill and Combined titles at Mt. Norquay. Dee entered the coaching ranks following her competitive career assisting in age-group programs. During the 1960's she coached the University of Calgary Women's Ski Team and was also involved in the organization of the Lake Louise Ski Club.

Mrs. Read moved into the administrative area during the 1970's serving in various posts from club to international levels. Her technical expertise became internationally regarded. As one of very few female technical delegates in the 1970's she worked at grassroots to World Cup and Olympic calibre races.

Dee has worked tirelessly for the Canadian Ski Association locally, provincially, and nationally. She offered her experience to CODA and OCO during the planning and presentation of the 1988 Winter Olympic Games. She has published numerous ski-related papers, has received an Alberta Achievement Award (1978) and still strives to improve skiing.

She has been married to Dr. John for some 42 years and is the mother of four former top ski racers (Janet, Ron, Ken, and Jim). The 63 year old is also a doting grandmother of four (Kim, Davey, Andrew, and Stephan).

Dorothy A. (Dee) Read, whose dedication, determination, charm and common sense have benefited skiing in Calgary and throughout the world is a very worthy recipient of the Calgary Booster Club's 1990 Sportsman of the Year Award.

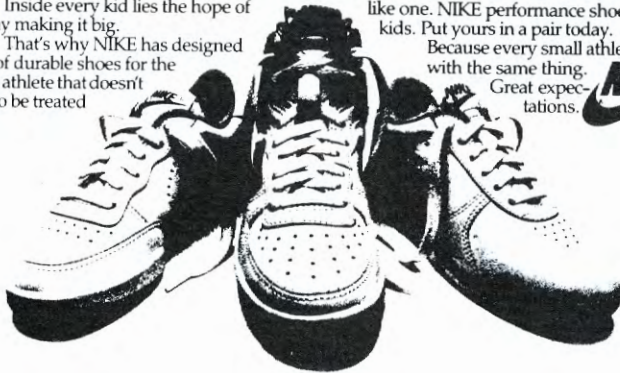

The Calgary Booster Club is pleased to recognize Mark Tewksbury as Calgary's 1990 Male Athlete of the Year.

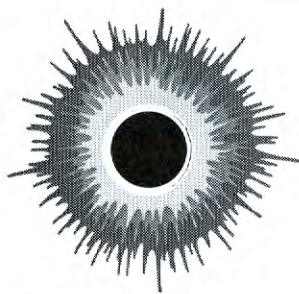

## CALGARY BOOSTER CLUB SPORTS WALL OF FAME



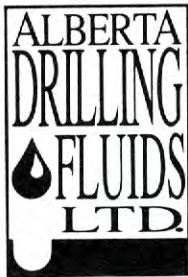

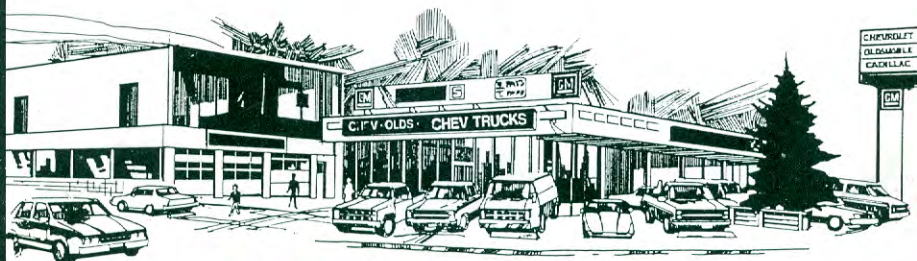
