On behalf of the Directors of the Calgary Booster Club, it is my pleasure and privilege to welcome you to the 36th Annual Sportsman's Dinner.

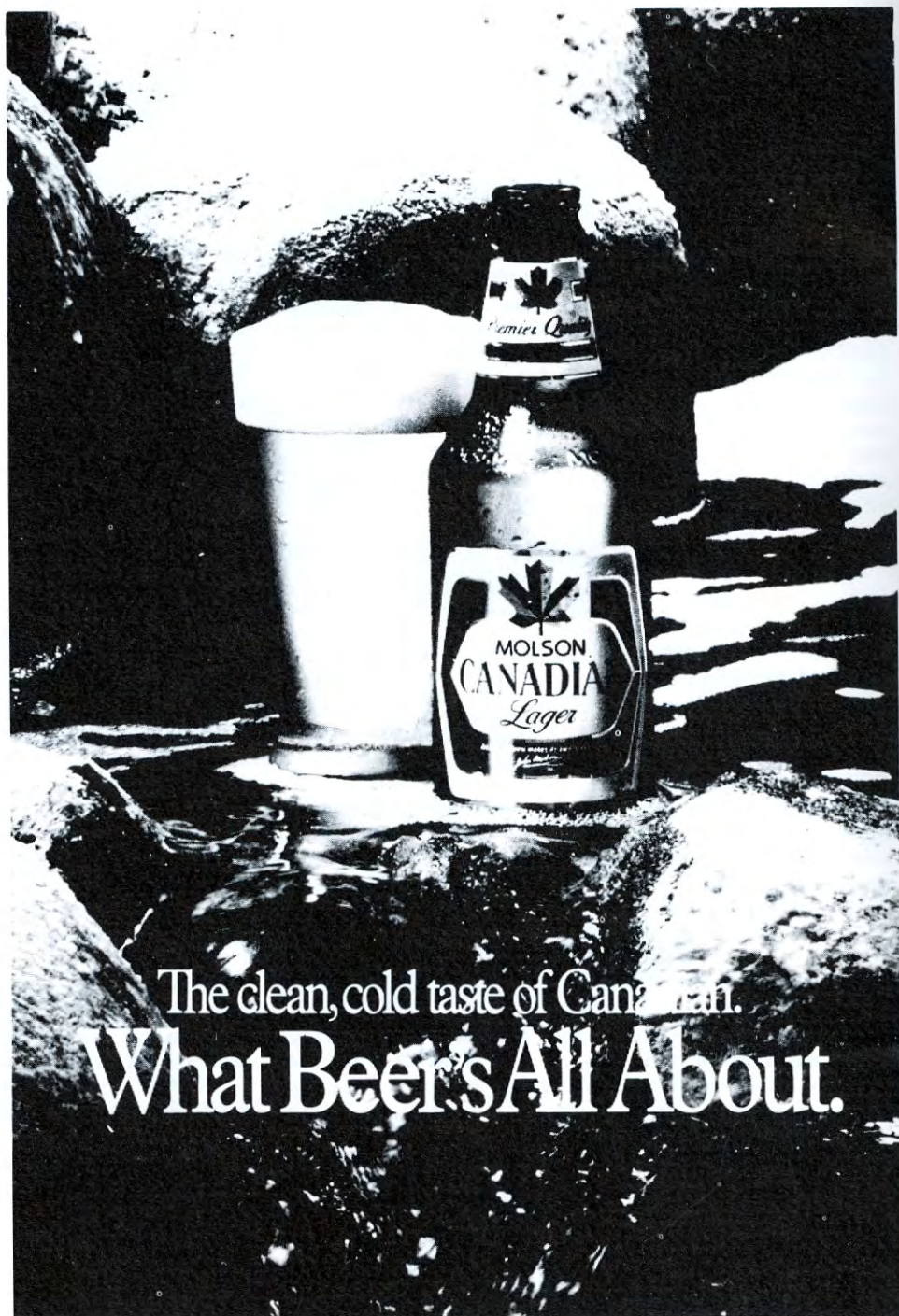

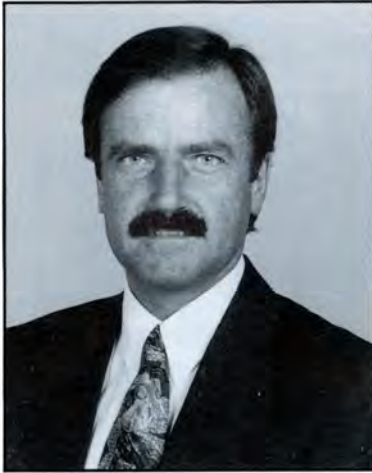

The Calgary Booster Club has a long and proud tradition of involvement in the local athletic scene. Several businessmen (Stu Adams, Roy Beavers, Ron Butlin, Vere Carmichael, Harry Cohen, Pete Egan, Curly Hunt, Les Maxwell, Ernie McCullough Jr., Jack Quigley and Art Smith) formed the idea of a club to promote sport at an unofficial meeting at the Club Cafe in downtown Calgary in 1951. Vere Carmichael served as the first Calgary Booster Club President during 1952-53. In the ensuing years, hundreds of prominent Calgarians have devoted countless hours to Booster Club activities. Included in the Club's many accomplishments is its role as a catalyst for the 1988 Winter Olympic Games bid. In February 1979, planning expenses were donated to the Calgary Olympic Development Association. As a result of Calgary Booster Club's assistance, competition, education and recognition programs, thousands of Calgarians have benefited.

Bill Salt did it for the kids. That in very concise fashion sums up over 30 years of outstanding volunteer effort in community sports.

The 61 year old Sportsman grew to love soccer during his youth in Victoria B.C. Later Calgary received the benefit of that love affair as Bill played a major role in the development of his favorite sport. He has been a leader of the Calgary Minor Soccer Association since 1962 involved heavily in administration, coaching and refereeing. Bill is recognized as one of the best and most

knowledgeable minor coaches in the city. In 1972 he organized the zone system utilized by the C.M.S.A. He has served on the executive of the Calgary Soccer Federation and was a founding member of the Chinook Ladies Soccer Club. During the period 1980-83 Bill was the catalyst behind the ATCO Indoor Soccer Centre, which presently caters to more than 2,000 players of all ages, male and female, minor to senior over the winter months.

Mr. Salt didn't stop with soccer. Since the late 1950's and 1960's he has been a driving force organizing and directing various projects in the North Glenmore community. He was instrumental in planning and constructing the community hall and for most of the past 25 years has been Sports Director of North Glenmore.

In 1974 he was one of the three original organizers of Minor Sports Calgary and served as the first President 1974-76. Bill was also a member of the City of Calgary Parks and Recreation Board for five years and acted as Chairman for two of those years. He has also been very involved in Minor Hockey at the community level.

Mr. Salt has been recognized numerous times for his tremendous contributions:

GUEST SPEAKER HANK STRAM

Hank Stram, one of the most successful coaches in the history of professional football, provides color analysis of National Football League games broadcast on the CBS Radio and Television Networks. During the 1990-91 season and in addition to a full season of games, Stram's multiple assignments include sixteen Monday Night games, Play-Offs, the Super Bowl and the AFC-NFC Pro Bowl in Honolulu.

Stram has been involved in coaching since his graduation from Purdue University in 1948. Honoured as coach of the year four times, Stram led the Kansas City Chiefs to the Super Bowl twice in his 15 years.

He left CBS in 1976 to coach the New Orleans Saints, returning two years later to earn considerable acclaim for his work as a sports analyst commentator.

He was voted commentator of the year by the Indiana Broadcasters' Association in 1979. He played a major role in the Network's award winning coverage of Super Bowl X, an event which drew the largest audience in television history.

Hank had his own Golf tournament, 'The Hank Stram Gatorade Celebrity Tournament in Jacksonville Florida, for the Prevention of Child Abuse'. He has been inducted into several Hall's of Fame and he has written a book entitled, "They're Playing My Game".

Among his recent awards are included the 'Bert Bell Award' for Outstanding Achievement and Contribution to the NFL and the 'Distinguished American Award' by Chicago Metro Chapter of the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame.

In 1990 Hank was the recipient of the March of Dimes Pressbox Award for 'Best Radio Color Analysis'.

Hank and his wife, Phyllis, have six children.

He is in great demand as a speaker in the off season and yet he still finds time for pastimes of golf and paddleball.

GUEST SPEAKER DR. ALEXEI ALEXANDROV

Dr. Alexei Alexandrov is the chairman of an important Soviet sports delegation currently touring North America, conferring with U.S. and Canadian Olympic officials relating to the 1992 Winter Olympic Games in Barcelona. Dr. Alexandrov is currently the deputy of the Soviet Olympics Committee and is an avid athletic supporter. Other members of the delegation travelling with Dr. Alexandrov include Ivan Leikin, General Secretary of the U.S.S.R. Sport Journalists Federation; Mr Sergei Prochorov, Deputy Chief of the Foreign Section of the Committee on

Physical Education and Sports; and Mr. Sergei Pavlov, Chairman of the Committee for Physical Culture and Sports.

In 1985 Dr. Alexandrov was appointed Deputy Soviet Minister of Soviet sports development. This includes responsibilities dealing both with domestic and international Soviet sports affairs relating to planning, administration, training, equipment development, scheduling and related matters for the entire Soviet Union.

Dr. Alexandrov was born in Moscow in 1938. He attended Moscow University where he majored in Sports Administration and Foreign Languages. He also holds a doctorate in Sports Physiology and Medicine. Additionally, he has a degree in Foreign Languages from the University of Leningrad. Interestingly, he is also a former assistant coach of the Soviet National Hockey Team.
