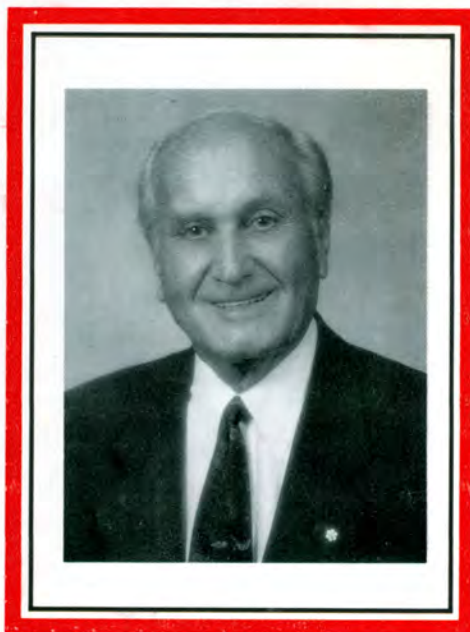

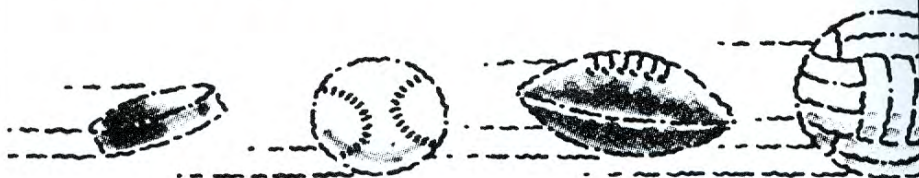
station with the exception of General Manager.

THE HISTORY OF THE CALGARY BOOSTER CLUB

The Calgary Booster Club has a long and proud tradition of involvement in the local athletic scene. Several businessmen (Stu Adams, Roy Beavers, Ron Butlin, Vere Carmichael, Harry Cohen, Pete Egan, Curly Hunt, Les Maxwell, Ernie McCullough Jr., Jack Quigley and Art Smith) formed the idea of a club to promote sport at an unofficial meeting at the Club Cafe in downtown Calgary in 1951. Vere Carmichael served as the first Calgary Booster Club President during 1952-53. In the ensuing years, hundreds of prominent Calgarians have devoted countless hours to Booster Club activities. Included in the Club's many accomplishments is its role as a catalyst for the 1988 Winter Olympic Games bid. In February 1979, planning expenses were donated to the Calgary Olympic Development Association. As a result of Calgary Booster Club's assistance, competition, education and recognition programs, thousands of Calgarians have benefited.

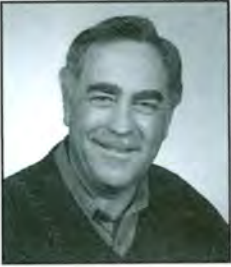

LUIGI PULANO - COMMUNITY SPORTS



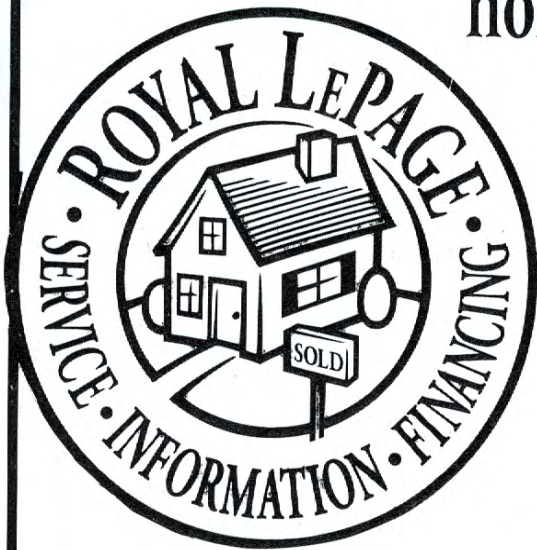

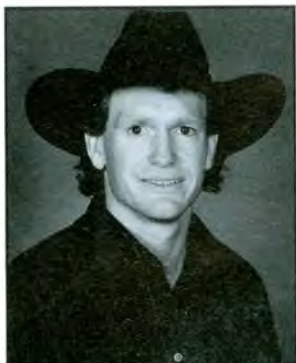

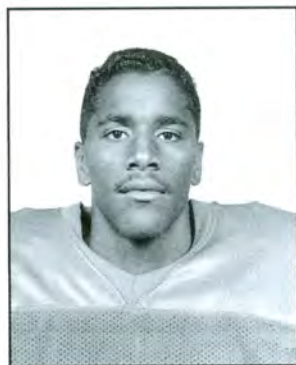

It was once said of Tony "A community will only be good as the people who devote their personal time to that community's betterment. By that yardstick Calgary is indeed a better place because of your commitment over the years."

He was born in 1918, and recently celebrated his 74th birthday. Tony with his wife Minerva have three children, son Garry and daughters Dale and Toni.

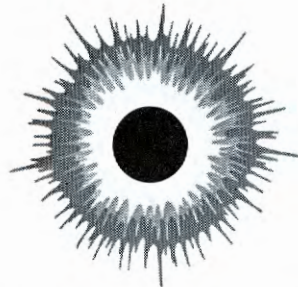

After reviewing potential locations and arranging the necessary funds, an agreement was reached between the Club and the Board of Directors of Lindsay Park Sports Centre to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility.

The Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame was opened to the public on December 9, 1987. As each year's group of award recipients is announced, their names will be added to the display providing a complete history of the best in Calgary athletes.

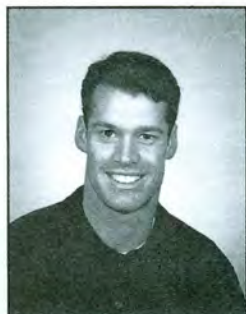


HENRY VINEY AWARD

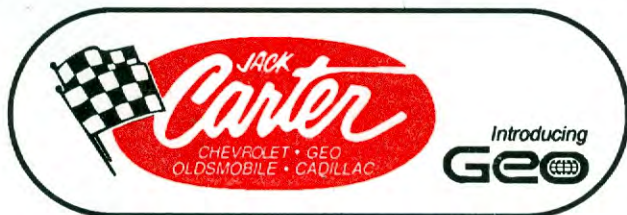
