Both Russ Peake and Ron MacLean 'learned the ropes' as teenagers at CKRD Red Deer. Russ began his broadcasting career at age 17, and a year later was the play-by-play voice of the Central Alberta Hockey League. Now, after 37 years of successful radio-TV sports broadcasting, Russ is a respected member of Calgary's CFCN-TV's sports team.

In 1961 Russ moved to Calgary and quickly established himself as a leading sportscaster. His assignments have included World Championships in Rodeo and Curling, as well as the Olympic Games. Last season, Russ covered the World Series as the Blue Jay's won it all. Outside the studio he has contributed immensely to curling, softball, little-league baseball and rodeo at the amateur level.

Russ has been honoured for his outstanding sportscasting. In 1981, he received the Scotty Harper Award for the best curling story as he covered the Brier. In 1983 Russ received the Bell Memorial Award for support and coverage of the amateur sports in Alberta.

Born in Marwayne, Russ now resides in Calgary with wife Helen, and is the proud father of two daughters, Jodi and Debbi.

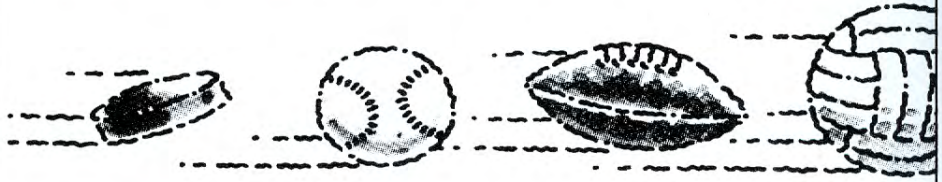



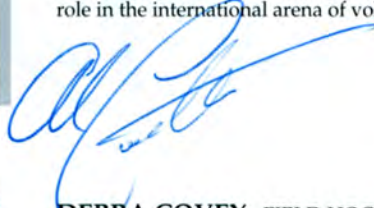


AL COULTER - VOLLEYBALL

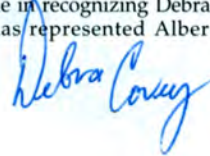

Passing for 5,945 yards, Doug finished as the second leading passer in the CFL. He has 15,524 yards passing in his CFL career, 86 career touchdown passes and 28 career rushing touchdowns. CHRIS MCGREGOR - JOCKEY

An inspiration to Calgarians young and old, Chris has made a remarkable athletic comeback after a brush with death and paralysis in October 1991. A lifetime Calgarian since being adopted in Europe in the '60's, Chris has overcome insurmountable odds and debilitating injuries to reach the top of the Alberta and Canadian Jockey standings.

At 11 months old he weighed 11 pounds and had a heart defect. He is now 33, stands 5'2" and weighs 108 pounds. In each of the two years preceding his accident he had won more than any other jockey in Canada. He has twice been a finalist for Canada's Sovereign Award – the highest award in Canadian Racing. When he rode 204 winners last year he joined Ron Hansen as the only jockeys who have won more than 200 races in Alberta seasons. "He has proven to himself and others that with dedication, determination, clean living and hard work that you can succeed and realize your dreams."
