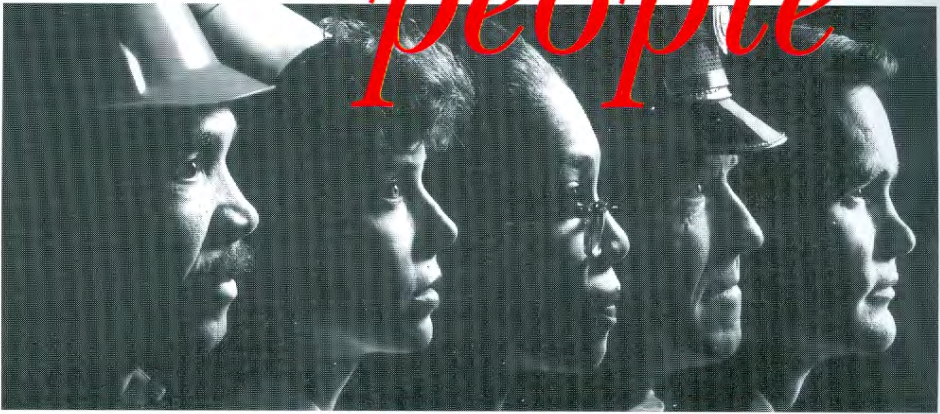

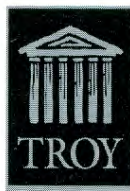

A man with a distinctive voice – and a somewhat weird sense of humour, Jack is well respected for his knowledge of the local sports scene.

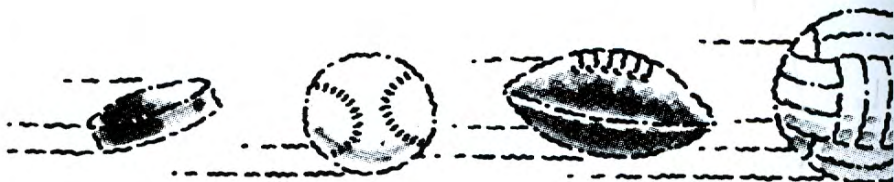

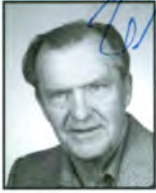

The Calgary Press Radio Sports Club was formed in 1954 – George Bilych; Eric Bishop, Joe Carbury, Ray Guay, Gorde Hunter, Denny Layzell (deceased); Tom Moore, Duna Scott (deceased) and Henry Viney (deceased) made up the original membership. The story goes Gorde Hunter twisted Eric Bishop's arm to take the first term as president.

In 1958 with Henry Viney at the helm, the club hosted it's first Athlete of the Year celebration. Al Rollins, the hockey Stampede's goaltender was the initial winner of the Scott-Mamini Memorial Award, named in honour of Harry Scott, and Bob Mamini, former sports editor of the Calgary Albertan and Calgary Herald respectively.

Over the years the face of sports media changed with television and additional radio outlets emerging. Ed Whalen arrived in 1955, Russ Peake (1961), Al Dahl (1963), Bill Powers (1965) and Ken Newans (1968). The Club became the Calgary Sports Media Club and in 1987 made the decision to honour a male and female athlete of the year. The Scott-Mamini became the male award; the Henry Viney Trophy, named in honour of the former CFCN Radio and Television sports director was instituted as the female award. Synchronized swimmer Carolyn Waldo was chosen as the first recipient. The Calgary Booster Club is proud to recognize the long term impact of the Originals and the 25 plus years that these media sports representatives have had in our city.

We take great pleasure in congratulating you and thanking you for your impressive years of service and your valuable contributions to Calgary's outstanding sports tradition!

Lisa Harvey, the 8th winner of the Henry Viney Trophy enjoyed a superb season capturing the National Cross Country Championship, the national 10,000 metre (outdoor) title, the CIAU cross country crown and the provincial cross country championship.

In addition, she was top Canadian (45th) at the World Cross Country Championships in Spain in March and was a member of the National Athletics team, which competed in the World Championships in Germany in August. She was named Athletics Alberta Athlete of the Year and led the field in numerous local road races.

The 24 year old Western Canada High School, University of Calgary and Calgary Spartan product was thrilled with the award. "It's quite an honour, I'm really happy to get this (Award). The past year was great, but I

know there's more to come. It's part of the stepping stones that will lead to the Commonwealth Games in Victoria this summer and the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta."

Lisa continues to supplement her phys. ed. degree at the U of Calgary, while training four hours a day. Her immediate focus is on the World Cross Country Championships in Budapest, Hungary at the end of the month (March).

Dave Sapunjis, the 37th recipient of the Scott-Mamini Award had an outstanding CFL season, catching 103 passes for 1,484 yards and 15 touchdowns. It marked the first time in Canadian Football League history a Canadian receiver had made more than 100 receptions in a season.

His talent and statistics earned him recognition as the CFL's Most Outstanding Canadian (for the second consecutive year) and All-Canadian slotback honours.

The 26 year old, four year Stampeders was "greatly honoured. I take a lot of pride in living in Calgary and playing for the Stampeders the last four years. I have come to appreciate the city, the West and especially the people."

Dave, a graduate of the University of Western Ontario (B.A.) is presently working as a sports reporter for CFTO-TV, the CTV affiliate in Toronto and also renovating an investment property. He's an avid participant in many sports and is active in the Stampeders Community Services Program and the Uncles at Large Program. As for gridiron goals, a Grey Cup victory in 1994 is the focus.

In 1984, the Calgary Booster Club approved the concept of a permanent display of recognition for its leadership and athletic award winners. After reviewing potential locations and arranging the necessary funds, an agreement was reached between the Club and the Board of Directors of Lindsay Park Sports Centre to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility.

The Sportsman has customarily been one of the city's athletic leaders who have greatly contributed to the local sport scene. To further recognize these outstanding Calgarians, the Booster Club recently decided to investigate the idea of a permanent pictorial showcase of all Sportsman of the Year honourees.

The Sportsman of the Year Wall was unveiled at Canada Olympic Park Atco V.I.P. Centre on March 25, 1990 and at the time of the unveiling contained the pictures of the Calgary Booster Club's 37 award recipients. As each year's winner is announced their picture will be added to the display.
