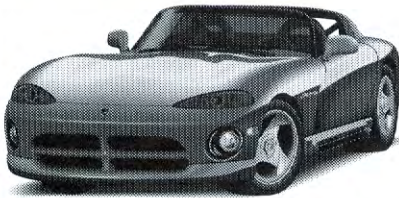

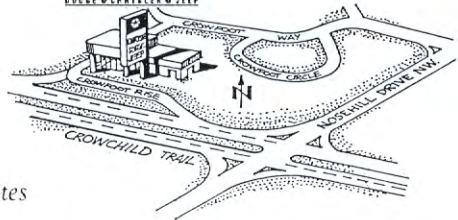

## Donna Rudakas



"Sports have played a major role in my life," says Donna Rudakas, the 1995 Sportsmen's Dinner master of ceremonies. She has been involved as an athlete, as a highly respected basketball coach and as a volunteer and "sports mom."

Donna, born in Sudbury, Ontario played varsity basketball at Laurentian University (B.P.E.) and at Queen's University (B.Ed.). Her outstanding coaching career began immediately after graduation with a two year stint at the helm of the University of Lethbridge women's basketball team. Then came the move to the University of Calgary and a noteworthy 15 years during which her teams compiled a 167-73 (.696 winning

percentage) in Canada West conference play and 271-126 (.683) overall. She led the Dinos to the CIAU (National) basketball title in 1989, to silver medals in 1988 and 1990 and to bronze medals in 1980 and 1984. Twice named CIAU Coach of the Year, she was conference coach of the year on five occasions. Donna led the Dinosaurs to 14 playoff appearance over her 15 year tenure. Between October 21, 1988 and March 10, 1990, the University of Calgary women's basketball team put together a record (since broken) 69 game win streak.

Donna resigned her coaching position following the 1994 season and is presently an instructor at the University of Calgary Faculty of Physical Education, a job she very much enjoys. She and husband Peter (president, New Energy West Corp) are also active in their sons Alexander (7) and Benjamin (4) budding athletic careers (hockey, soccer, skiing).

Donna, a Calgary YWCA Woman of Distinction Award winner and Alberta Achievement Award recipient is excited about emceeding the annual celebration of sport. "The Calgary Booster Club's broad-based recognition program is very much appreciated by the community. I feel privileged to be part of this important event."

That's the philosophy of the Calgary Booster Club's 42nd Sportsman of the Year, Joe Shea, a 59 year old who has been involved in amateur sports since 1954.

Shea was a student at Penn State University when he began coaching little league baseball. He continued after graduating with a degree in Petroleum Engineering and relocating to Edmonton.

In 1964, Shea transferred to Calgary (Hudson's Bay Oil & Gas) and immediately became involved in little league baseball (Foothills) and in minor hockey (Banff Trail) as a coach.

Over the ensuing years he gradually moved into the administrative side of sport. He coordinated hockey activity, arranged reciprocal visits for various teams from Europe and the U.S. In the mid 70s (1973-76) Joe served on the executive of the Minor Hockey Association of Calgary board of directors.

At the same time he remained deeply involved in baseball becoming the city's first Little League District Administrator (1971-75) and a founding director of Little League Canada (1972). He organized a program solely to keep 13 year olds involved (1972) and served as president of Little League Canada and Director, Little League International (1975 - present). As well he was elected as permanent Director, Little League International (1978) and was instrumental in the formation of Little League Alberta serving as the organizations first president in 1979.

The 1972 Calgary Booster Club Honoured Athletic Leader was a driving force in the development of the 13 year old division, the challenger division and the softball program for girls. Under his direction little league in Canada continues to flourish - 79,000 participants across the country, including 11,000 in Calgary.

The modest Joe and wife Bev have also been active in the community as parents (son Ron in California, daughter Kylene in Edmonton), foster parents, billets for young athletes (currently Fedor Zakusilo of the AJHL Calgary Royals is living with the Shea's) and as volunteers with Uncles at Large.

The tireless worker emphasizes, "There's a place in sport for anyone who wants to contribute. I really feel we should give back to the community. You always get back more than you could ever give."

Of his selection as Sportsman of the Year, Joe says, "It was totally unexpected. I appreciate the honour but it's really a group award that reflects the corps of dedicated volunteers who really believe in kids and developing abilities."

Shea, an employee of Talisman Energy is dedicated, unselfish, unassuming, patient. He has made an outstanding contribution locally, nationally and internationally for 30 plus years. The Calgary Booster Club salutes **Joe Shea, Calgary's 42nd Sportsman of the Year.**

## HENRY VINEY AWARD WINNER

## Susan Auch



1994 was a banner year for Calgary's Female Athlete of the Year Susan Auch. Years of effort were rewarded when she claimed the silver medal in the womens 500 meter speed skating event at the Winter Olympic Games in Lillehammer, Norway. She became only the second Canadian woman to win an Olympic long track speed skating medal (Calgary's Cathy Priestner-Allinger was the first).

An asthmatic, Susan was encouraged to enter the sports world at a young age. The transplanted Winnipegger got her start as a 10 year old with brother Derrick in the short track discipline. She switched to long track competition in 1989 and displayed steady improvement. Her strengths are her rocket launching starts regarded among the best in the world as well as her turns, her aggressiveness and her motivation. The 29 year old has been a perennial Canadian overall sprint champion the past few years; she holds the Canadian 500 m record (38.94 seconds).

A journalism/broadcasting student at the University of Calgary, Susan is also an animal lover who enjoys the outdoors with her Australian cattle dog and her Appaloosa horse. Her Olympic medal made her an instant celebrity with an extremely busy off-ice schedule of appearances, speaking engagements and even television commercials. There has been talk of possible retirement but the 8 year National Team member decided to return "to see how far I can go,"

And that decision has certainly paid off with more World Cup medal performances (including gold) as well as scintillating world record duels with retiring American star Bonnie Blair during the 1994-95 season. To literally millions of sports fans, worldwide, Gordie Howe IS "Mr. Hockey."<sup>TM</sup> Born in Floral, Saskatchewan, March 31, 1928, he achieved one of the most illustrious careers and distinguished records in the history of professional sports. He began his career at the age of sixteen with the Detroit Red Wings and spent 25 of his 26 years in the National Hockey League as "Number 9" with that organization. During a two year retirement, Gordie served as a Vice President for the Detroit Hockey Club.

Consider the "firsts." In 1973, in an unprecedented return to the ice, Gordie came out of retirement to become a player for the Houston Aeros of the World

Hockey Association after already setting eleven NHL records. He was voted the WHA's Most Valuable Player that season. He then took the new position for the Aeros of becoming the first player/president in hockey's history. When his sons, Marty and Mark, signed with the Aeros, it was the first father/son combination ever to be seen playing together in a major professional sport. Their four year, triple contract, negotiated by Colleen Howe, was an unprecedented agreement in the history of hockey or any other sport.

In 1978, Colleen once again completed a ten year player/personal service arrangement with the Hartford Whalers of the WHA for the trio. In the first playing year, Gordie lead the team in scoring which includes his 1,000th career goal making him the only player to reach that plateau. Gordie Howe played his last season with the Hartford Whalers in 1978-79.

Gordie, always referred to as a modest superstar, was voted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1972 and was recognized as an all-star for most of his NHL and WHA seasons.

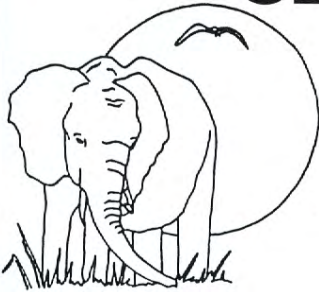

Don Harron is one of Canada's most extraordinary talents. He is a modern "Renaissance Man" whose entertainment career has included achievements as an actor, writer, broadcaster, comic and producer.

A native of Toronto, Don began his awesome career at the age of ten – speaking at banquets. By the age of 11 he had already made his radio debut, and except for an interruption during World War II, Don has never looked back in his entertainment career.

It is a career by which one can almost follow the development of Canada's cultural scene – for Don was present and actively involved, in the launching of almost every major venture. Don's voice was first heard on CBC radio in 1936 – the same year it commenced public broadcasting. He first acted at Stratford the same year it began operation – and had a lead role opposite a relative unknown named Alec Guinness.

Don has worked in television since its very inception. In television's first season alone, Don was actively involved in almost every facet of the medium – from starring in serious dramas to writing a comedy series. Since then, Don has appeared in most major television dramatic series including: *Twelve O'Clock High*, *The Outer Limits*, *Dr. Kildare*, *Walt Disney Presents*, *Burke's Law*, *Mr. Novak*, *The F.B.I.*, *Profiles in Courage*, *Mission Impossible*, *The Fugitive* and *The Man From U.N.C.L.E.*

Don Harron is also recognized as an accomplished actor on stage. His distinguished theatre career, which began in Toronto, has taken him to all the world's major stages including Stratford, London's West End, and Broadway. He has worked with many of the great names in theatre including: Sir Alec Guinness, Paddy Chayefsky, Joseph Papp, Christopher Plummer, Tyrone Power, Katherine Hepburn and Maggie Smith.

In his capacity as a writer, Don has to his credit books, plays, radio and television scripts. One of the proudest achievements is a musical which he wrote from the children's novel *Anne of Green Gables*. Originally written for television, the stage version has been a resounding success. It is in its 25th season at the P.E.I. Festival, and has won rave reviews in London, New York, Japan and Sweden as well as every major centre in Canada.

Don is also the author of seven best-selling books. An eighth, biography, "A Parent Contradiction" was written by his oldest daughter Martha and enjoyed ten weeks on the best seller lists.

As a broadcaster, Don is probably best known to Canadians for the five years he spent as the popular host of the CBC radio series *Morningside*.

Don Harron, the actor, has usually been cast in dramatic roles. However, Don has made many people laugh with his alter ego characters – especially Charlie Farquharson. "Charlie" was first introduced to Canadians in 1952 at the "Spring Thaw Revue" – a show that Don has been involved with since its creation. Since then, "Charlie's" career has been almost as impressive as Don's. He has worked in revues and television, resides at conventions, has made a number of albums, is the author of several best-selling books, and has completed his 18th season as a star of the long-running TV series "Hee Haw."

Don Harron is the recipient of numerous honours and awards for the many contributions he has made to this country and its culture. Among them are: The Order of Canada (1980), Honorary LL.D. from Mount Allison University for being a long-standing contributor to public broadcasting, and ACTRA Award as best radio host/interviewer (1982) and a North American Volunteer of the Year Award (1982).

Don Harron is married to performer Catherine McKinnon and resides in Toronto. He has three daughters and two grandchildren.

In 1984, the Calgary Booster Club approved the concept of a permanent display of recognition for its leadership and athletic award winners. After reviewing potential locations and arranging the necessary funds, an agreement was reached between the Club and the Board of Directors of Lindsay Park

Sports Centre to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility.

The Sportsman of the Year Wall was unveiled at Canada Olympic Park Atco V.I.P. Centre on March 25, 1990 and at the time of the unveiling contained the pictures of the Calgary Booster Club's 37 award recipients. As each year's winner is announced their picture will be added to the display.

## *Scott-Mamini Trophy*

The Scott-Mamini Trophy was initiated by Calgary's Sports Media in 1958 and was awarded annually to the City's Athlete of the Year as chosen by the media. That continued until 1987 when it became the Male Athlete of the Year Award. It is named in honour of Harry Scott, the gruff Sports Editor of the Calgary Albertan and his counterpart at the Calgary Herald, the more lovable, Bob Mamini. Both men were held in high esteem across Canada during the 1930's and 1940's.
