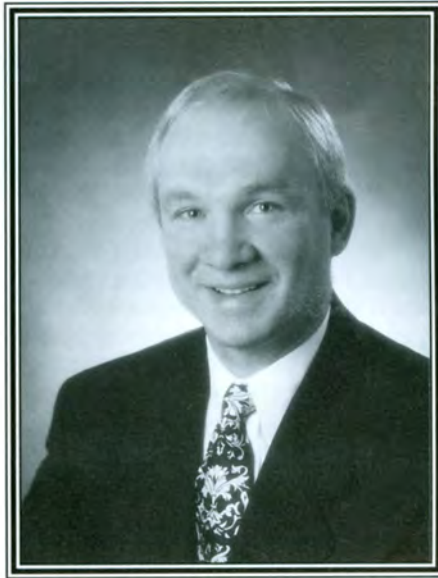

"The big thing for me is honesty," said Don, "I have always been candid with my players, the parents, the officials and opponents." This is an attitude that has had impact on the young people whom he has coached throughout his career. It was the manner in which Roy Kelly, coach of the Drumheller Miners when Don played there, demonstrated in his management of the diverse personnel of that team. He was the person closest to being a mentor for Don and the person he credits for his candor. The unique mandate of the Calgary Canucks complements this background of Don's. It is a completely volunteer group whose players pay to play for the team. While this sometimes becomes difficult for players and families, the payoff is the many who are

rewarded with scholarships to colleges and universities.

Don grew up in the Tuxedo Park community where he participated in many of the sports activities but especially hockey. From Tiny Midget and Bantam teams, then onto the Midget and Juvenile Rangers before playing for the Junior Buffaloes, then the Calgary Cowboys. He finished his active playing days with the Western International Hockey League Drumheller Minors and the Calgary Stampeders. He is a product of the Calgary Board of Education, graduating from Crescent Heights High School in 1965. He takes some pride that the Junior Varsity and Senior Varsity football teams on which he played, won the City Championships from Saint Francis, a rarity at the time. His education continued at S.A.I.T. where in 1969 he graduated with a Mechanical Engineering Certificate. Don is currently the Assistant Manager of McMahon Stadium. Rita, his wife of 26 years, and he have three children: Daniel, currently at S.A.I.T. in Computer Science; Jennifer, a U. of C. Education Graduate; and Jeffery, a Computer Technician in the city's computer industry.

Don is one of the people who began the Southern Alberta Major Midget League (SAMB) now known as the Alberta Major Midget League, and the sponsor of the MACS Major Midget Tournament. His coaching career began in 1972-73 with the NEAA Juvenile Melton Realtors. This was followed by six years with Junior, Bantam, Midget and Tiny Mite Teams before he settled in with the NEAA Midget AAA North Stars from 1980 through to 1985. In the 1986 season, he took over the NEAA Jr. A Canucks of the AJHL until 1990-91 when it was back to the Bantam level for two years, up again to the Jr. A Canucks where he coaches today. His resume for coaching includes four AJHL Coach of the Year citations, along with a similar designation for taking the 1981 North Stars to the Air Canada Cup. There have been additional recognitions from the Alberta Amateur Hockey and 3M Coaching Awards. It is unfair to try and single out a best year and/or a best team but a great thrill is something else, and that occurred in 1995. In the playdowns for the Junior A Canadian Championship, The Centennial Cup, the team faced seven 'must win' situations finally winning over Gloucester, Ontario in an exciting final game. Don credits his very understanding and supportive wife Rita, Calgary Canucks Junior A President Ken Bracko along with the players, for making his coaching duties rewarding.

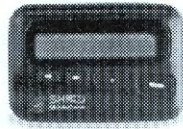

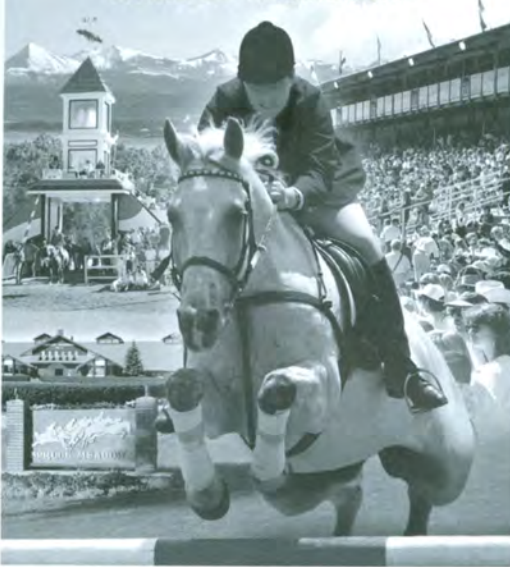

I am sure that your sojourn in Saskatoon, Regina and Toronto were very rewarding. We in Calgary are pleased that these past five years as Sports Director for CBC Calgary News also appear to be rewarding to you and the mother corporations present interest in this city.

This Montreal native holds a Degree in Education from McGill University in Montreal, a Diploma in Sports Administration from Calgary's Mount Royal College, and a Certificate in Radio Journalism from Humber College in Toronto. MARGIE BEREZOWSKI (nee Crosland) - FIGURE SKATING

Margie began her career in figure skating in 1946 as a CFSA test skater. She continues this association today as a Technical Advisor for the Glencoe Invitational. Between then and now, Margie has been Canadian Junior Ladies Champion (1956), Canadian Senior Ladies Champion (1958, 1959) and placed as high as 10th at World Championships (1957-59). She was also a Team Leader and Coach at the 1976 Olympic Games at Innsbruck, Austria. Her appointment as a CFSA Judge in 1956 began an apprenticeship that resulted in ISU World Judging and International Referee status in 1975. Besides judging numerous International Competitions, including Prague

Skate, Skate Canada, Skate America, Japan's NHK, Germany's Nations Cup and England's Richmond Trophy to name some, she also has three World Junior Championships and six World Championships, plus the 1984 Sarajevo Olympics, in her judging resume. Margie was awarded the Government of Alberta 'Outstanding Albertan' Achievement Award. She was inducted into the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame and Museum in 1983. In recognition of the many hours of involvement on local, provincial, national and international committees, the Calgary Glencoe Club presented her with the Club's Achievement Award in 1990. The Calgary Booster Club is pleased to add to the Honoured Athlete Award given in 1959 by naming you, Margie Berezowski, to its 1998 Honoured Athletic Leader List.



SHIRLEY BOYCE - FIGURE SKATING

It was in 1929 that Shirley began to figure skate, an avocation that lasted through to 1959. Those years saw her compete in the many Glencoe Club's competitive levels, receiving the championship title at each level. In addition, she was Provincial Juvenile Champion in 1935 and 1936, and also competed at Canadian Championships in Junior Pairs in 1948. Long before her skating career ended, her judging and administrative career began, becoming a CFSA test evaluator in 1939, a position she still fulfills. During the 1960's and 1970's, Shirley began to do administrative work for the Canadian Figure Skating - Alberta Section first as Assistant Judge Chairman, then as Judge's Chairman. At the same time, she served on the Music

committee for the Olympics, Skate Canada and Canadian Championships. It was in the next decade that her administrative work load increased as she was the Alberta Team Manager for Divisional Championships, and Chair of Operations for Skate Canada. She has accepted positions as Technical Representative for Western Divisionals, Central Divisionals and Canadian Championships throughout the years, while Operation Chair for Skate Canada in 1987, and the 1988 Olympics in Calgary. The Canadian Figure Skating Association presented the Alberta/NWT Section Evaluator/Judge Award (1995). At this award banquet, Shirley had forgotten to bring her glasses and unable to read the program was very surprised when her name was announced for the award. I hope Shirley that you have your glasses tonight, for the Calgary Booster club is very pleased to include the name of Shirley Boyce in the 1998 Honoured Athletic Leader List.



NATALE O. DI LEANDRO - BASEBALL

Just maybe, if one were to walk down the south hallway at St. Mary's High School, they would see the face of Nate Di Leandro smiling down at them. This Calgarian was educated and involved in high school and community sports during his formative years in the city. One of his early coaches was Fr. Jim Whelihan, the 1956 Sportsman of the Year. However, it was growing up in Sunnyside that most influenced his becoming involved in baseball. The old Buffalo Stadium, across the river via Louise Bridge near where the former Crystal Swimming Pool/Rink was located, drew like a magnet this young sports enthusiast when the sound of the night's lineup drifted across to the homes in Sunnyside. It was therefore

natural later in life for a young father to volunteer to coach in his community, hockey in the winter, and baseball in the summer. For over thirty years Nate has devoted time and effort to the Calgary Little League. His service and counsel to the organization, together with the integrity, guidance, inspiration and sportsmanship he has displayed, exemplify the ideals of Little League Baseball. During his coaching career, he has taken two Centennial Little League All Star teams to Canadian Championships where they have been the runnerup. That Nate has passed his philosophy of sport onto hundreds of youngsters over the years goes with out saying. And probably the one closest to his heart is his son Darren, who parlayed a Little League beginnings into a college scholarship and a professional career within the San Diego Padres system. Now retired from Esso and from coaching the 12 and under gang of kids, Natale plants his gladiolas, paints his watercolors and still keeps statistics at the Stampeders games. It gives the Calgary Booster Club a great pleasure to add the name of Natale Osfoldo Di Leandro to the Honoured Athletic Leader List for 1998.



CAROLYN MORGAN - FIELD HOCKEY

Field Hockey in Calgary is fortunate to have someone like Carolyn Morgan on its organizing team. As an active participant, she competed with the Phoenix Club while also acting on the executive of the club, first as Treasurer and then as President. Her energy level was not satisfied by only these duties, so she also took on the President position of the Calgary Ladies Field Hockey Association during the years 1981 and 1982. She was involved with the provincial executive as well again as President, then as Treasurer and again as President, the position she holds to date. However, it is with the High School Tournament that the main drive of her developmental efforts for field hockey flourished. This tournament began in 1985 under the sponsorship of the Calgary Ladies Field

Hockey Association, for many years the only opportunity high school teams had to participate in tournament play. To place this event in perspective 20-25 teams play over 50 games on 8 fields requiring over 100 umpires, a horrendous organizing, scheduling and coordinating task. This was and is in addition to the yearly job of umpire coordination for the high school league. As a continuation of development by the CLFHA, Carolyn is the Junior Development Coordinator. Since 1991 this age group (6-12) has grown ten fold with its own Development Tournament. This program has become the Official Little League Education Program sanctioned by the Little League Baseball of Williamsport, Pennsylvania. Their unique method of teaching the skills of baseball is recognized throughout the world for its merit at both amateur and professional levels. Al has retired from the classroom into the life of clinical presenter for this program.

**ALLEN (AL) PRICE - BASEBALL**

Acme, a small town on a railway branch line northeast of Calgary, was the birth place of Al Price and where he began his baseball career. During the time of his active playing, he was an Alberta team member at several national championships. While with the Calgary 'Jimmies' he was selected as All Canadian catcher in 1976, the year they won the National Championship. As a member of the Canadian National Team, he competed at the World Championships in 1977 and 1980. An educator with the Calgary Board of Education in Physical Education with 18 years of CSHSAA coaching experience, he is now on leave from the principalship of William Aberhart High School. In 1993, he completed his Master's degree at Northern

Arizona University, where he was selected to the nations Deans list. Together with Al Herback, he has refined a clinical presentation for managers and coaches into a program called "Know Your Baseball." This program has become the Official Little League Education Program sanctioned by the Little League Baseball of Williamsport, Pennsylvania. This unique method of teaching baseball is recognized throughout the world at both the amateur and professional level.

He has been recognized for his contribution to University athletics by being presented the Fred Sgambati Award, a national award, on three different occasions. He is also a member of the Canadian Boxing Hall of Fame and the Canadian Football Reporters Hall of Fame. Along with his skiing, Ken is also a fanatic about tennis, playing at the Commercial league level. His involvement with community groups like the Calgary and District Amateur Softball Association, the Olympic and Special Olympic organizations, the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame, the University of Calgary Athletic Advisory Committee, Team Canada Hockey Board Directors, Crohns/Colitis Foundation and the Calgary Learning Centre indicate his range of commitment to community. Over the years Calgary and area have enjoyed his numerous in-depth human interest stories on Channel 3, revealing the scope of drama and passion present in sport. To add the name of Kenneth Edward Newans to the 1998 Honoured Athletic Leader List is a pleasure for the Calgary Booster Club.

**STUART PONTING - SWIMMING**

Like many parents Stuart followed his children into community activities first as a scout leader, then as a Minor League Hockey coach and finally into competitive swimming. It was within the swim community that he found his niche of volunteerism. Sandwiched in among the innumerable developmental meets are 25 Provincial Championships, 20 Canadian Swim Championships, 5 CIAU Swim Championships, 3 Olympic Swim Trials, a Police and Fireman Games, a Pan Pacific Games, 4 Commonwealth Trials, the Commonwealth Games in Edmonton and Victoria, the University Games in Edmonton and the Canada Games in Kamloops. With a resume like this, the swim community in Calgary and Canada is blessed with the commitment and enthusiasm Stuart continues to give, along with son Tom, to competitive swimming. He is most often found these days sharing the expertise and knowledge he gained during his years as a swim volunteer with the young swimmers and beginning officials in the local swim community. **HARRIS C. TOTH - LACROSSE**

Calgary is fortunate to have people like Harris, not so different from other cities, it just seems that we have an abundance of such people. He has coached at all levels and been successful at City Championships ten times as well as being a five Canada Day Tournament Champion with PeeWee, Bantam and Midget Teams. In the 10 Provincial Championships in which his teams have participated, they have returned with a Gold, Silver and Bronze, while his 1990 Bantam A team brought home Silver from the National Championships. Harris has served on the executive for the Calgary District Lacrosse Association, the Rocky Mountain Lacrosse League, the Axemen Lacrosse Club, the Blackfoot Hockey Association and the Minor Hockey Association of Calgary. He was recently elected President of the Alberta Lacrosse Association and was recognized by this Association by being awarded the James H. McFall Memorial Statue as outstanding volunteer for 1998. It gives the Calgary Booster Club satisfaction to include Harris C. Toth in its Honoured Athletic Leader List for 1998.

An Olympic Tribute

The quest for a Calgary based Olympic Games began in the 1950's; many prominent Calgarians during that decade and the next keep the vision alive. But the dream didn't take palpable shape until 1978 when directors of the Calgary Booster Club discussed the possibility of hosting the Winter Olympics. At the November 6, 1978 meeting at the Calgary Inn (now the Westin Hotel), it was moved by Jack Wilson and seconded by Lorne Scott that the President (Bill Nield) appoint a committee to study the possible involvement of the Club in obtaining the 1988 Winter Olympics for the Kananaskis area and that the Club pay incidental costs related thereto.

Progress from that point on was strong and steady:

- February 1979 - The Calgary Booster Club donated \$5,000 to CODA (Calgary Olympic Development Association) for planning expenses. Joe Kryzka sold the first CODA membership to Governor-General Edward Schreyer.
- October 1979 - Calgary gains Canadian Olympic Association backing over Vancouver.
- September 1981 - The IOC (International Olympic Committee) meeting in Baden-Baden, Germany awards the 1988 Winter Olympic Games to Calgary.

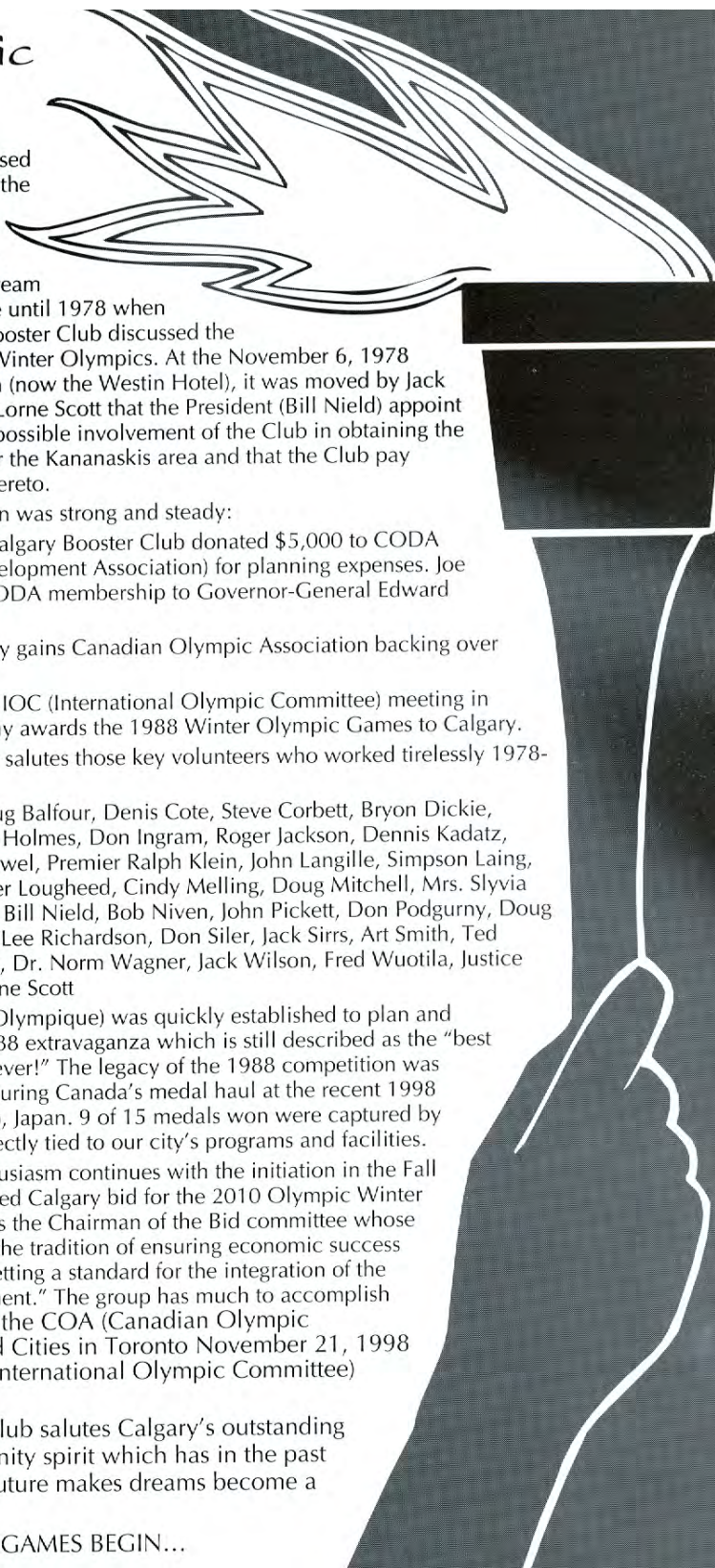

The legacy of the 1988 competition was unquestionably evident during Canada's medal haul at the recent 1998 Winter Games at Nagano, Japan. 9 of 15 medals won were captured by athletes and/or teams directly tied to our city's programs and facilities.

The famous Calgary enthusiasm continues with the initiation in the Fall of 1997 of a CODA backed Calgary bid for the 2010 Olympic Winter Games. Patricia Trottier is the Chairman of the Bid committee whose mandate is to "maintain the tradition of ensuring economic success and viability as well as setting a standard for the integration of the Games and the environment." The group has much to accomplish before presentations to the COA (Canadian Olympic Association) by the Bid Cities in Toronto November 21, 1998 followed by the IOC (International Olympic Committee) process.

The Calgary Booster Club salutes Calgary's outstanding volunteer and community spirit which has in the past and will again in the future makes dreams become a reality.

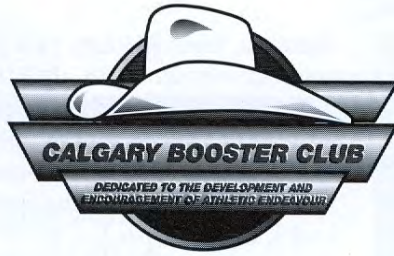
Shannon Miller

Shannon, from Melfort, Saskatchewan and site of her early involvement in athletics is a graduate of the University of Saskatchewan with a degree in Physical Education. She developed the first International High Performance Female Hockey Program, which is located in Calgary at the Father David Bauer Arena and Complex on University Drive N.W. It is a program that she envisions being expanded to a couple of other locations in the country, so that the playing level of women's hockey may be enhanced. Interestingly hockey was not the real reason Shannon found herself in Calgary; no, it was the Calgary Police

Service that prompted her to move here in 1988. She is presently on leave to fulfill her role as Head Coach of the National Women's Hockey Team.

Shannon's successful playing career ended in 1989, a career that saw her play in the first National Championship in 1982, then again in '83, '84 and '85, referee at the University level until 1985, and became Chairperson for the Female Hockey League of Saskatchewan. In 1985, she was a member of Canadian Hockey's Female Council. This was the background that was brought to Alberta and led her to organizing the first girl's minor hockey team in Calgary. She was appointed assistant coach of the Women's Alberta Hockey Team in 1991. This team won the Gold at the Canada Games, the first time the ladies were included in these games. She was the Assistant Coach on Canada's Gold Medal Women's World Champion 1992 and 1994 team and coach of the 1995 and 1996 team with Gold Medal performances at the Pacific Rim Championships. This was in addition to leading the Calgary Classics to Silver (1995, 1996) at the Alberta Provincials and a Bronze at the 1995 National Championships. A pinnacle of her coaching career was the appointment as Head Coach, in July of 1996, of the National Women's Hockey Team, a salaried position and the first such appointment in the world. Coach Miller has won every international tournament this team has entered.

HENRY VINEY TROPHY WINNER

Catriona LeMay Doan



Catriona was a unanimous media choice as the 12th recipient of the Henry Viney Trophy. The 27 year old speedskating sprint star had a stellar 1997 season beginning with a silver medal performance in the 500 m event at the 1997 World Sprint Championships in February. But it was her attack on world records in the fall of the year that propelled her into the international spotlight. She kicked off the 1997-98 season with unofficial world records in the 500 m and 1000 m at a non-sanctioned meet at the Olympic Oval. On November 8, she shattered the marks with a 38.15 second clocking in the 500 and a 1.16.64 in the 1000. A week later at the World Cup opener

in Roseville, Minnesota, she captured two gold medals and a silver.

At the CODA World Cup event at the Oval in late November before supportive family and friends, she grabbed three gold and one silver, setting two world records - 37.90 seconds in the 500, marking the first time a female speedskater had broken the 38 second barrier. She also lowered the standard to 1.16.07 in the 1000 m as 20 world records were set and broken that momentous weekend. As the month of November wound down, Catriona set a new world standard in the 1500 m (1.57.87) at a CanAm competition. She concluded her amazing 1997 run at the Canadian Championships/Olympic Trials in late December at the Olympic Oval with gold in the 500 m (world record time -37.55), 1000 m and 1500 m.

Mike captured his second Calgary Male Athlete of the Year trophy (also won in 1989) for his 1997 Conn Smythe Playoff MVP performance in leading the Detroit Red Wings to their first Stanley Cup victory since 1955. He was magnificent in the Wing's net recording a 16 - 4 playoff record including one shutout and a 1.76 goals against average.

Vernon is a product of the Minor Hockey Association of Calgary who later shone for the Western Hockey League Calgary Wranglers as a junior. He was drafted by the Calgary Flames in the third round - 56th overall of the 1981 draft. He appeared in two Stanley Cup finals with

the Flames (1986 and 1989) and is still the Flames all-time leader in wins with 245. He landed in Detroit in 1994 in a deal for defenceman Steve Chiasson. that led to two Jennings Trophies with Chris Osgood for the lowest team goals against in 1996 and 1997. The 35 year old is now toiling with the San Jose Sharks which acquired him in August '97 for two draft picks.

The 41st Scott-Mamini recipient has posted winning seasons 12 of the last 13 years; he is 4th among active goalies in victories (321) and has made five NHL All-Star appearances. He also has a silver medal earned as a member of Team Canada at the 1990-91 World Hockey Championships. Mike, wife Jane and daughter Amelia spend the off-season in the Calgary and Windermere areas.

This is the gentleman who believed that Canada could and should be a contender in basketball at the international level. His dream became our dream and the players that he recruited from around the country, including Calgarians, Ken Larson, Tom Bishop, Romel Raffin, Karl Tillman and John Hatch, and went on to participate for sixteen years among the top six in the world. The Canadian Basketball Team qualified for 5 Olympics and won the Gold Medal at the University World Student Games in Edmonton under the

direction of Coach Donohue.

This husband of Mary Jane, father of six, grandfather to four grew up in New York City, taught high school for fifteen years and coached his teams to a record of 250 wins in less than 300 games, of course it helps when one of the players was Lew Alcindor (aka Kareem Abdul-Jabbar of the Los Angeles Lakers). Jack continued his successful coaching career at Holy Cross College in Massachusetts before coming to Canada in 1972 to coach the Canadian National Team. He maintains that coaching is 'the purest form of teaching' and therefore it is natural that he turned to 'coaching' managers and leaders in industry in the skills of leadership, communication, motivation, change, relationships and team building.

Recognition for his basketball accomplishments are numerous. He is a member of the New York City 'Coaches Hall of Fame,' New York City Basketball Hall of Fame, and the Canadian Basketball Hall of Fame. He received the King Clancy Award for work with the disabled, and is a recipient of the Canada Medal. In 1992, he was nominated for a Gemini Award for his television series 'Donohue's Legends' and won a Can-Pro Gold Medal that year. This was followed the next year by another Can-Pro Gold Medal and the ACTRA Sportscaster Award for 1993. While lunches with Gorbachev and the Queen, or cavorting with George Burns, Bob Hope and Harry Belafonte, lecturing and conducting seminars, international travel and MC'ing at banquets provide a vast treasury of entertaining stories and experiences, it is basketball to which Jack always returns. He is presently Director of International Relations and Director of Canadian Development for the Vancouver Grizzlies.

Sports Wall of Fame



In 1984, the Calgary Booster Club approved the concept of a permanent display of recognition for its leadership and athletic award winners. After reviewing potential locations and arranging the necessary funds, an agreement was reached between the Club and the Board of Directors of

Lindsay Park Sports Centre to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility.

The Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame was opened to the public on December 9, 1987. As each year's group of award recipients is announced, their names will be added to the display providing a complete history of the best in Calgary athletes.

Sportsman's Wall



Since 1954, the annual Sportsmen's Dinner has been dedicated to the person(s) selected Calgary Booster Club Sportsman of the Year. The Sportsman has customarily been one of the city's athletic leaders who have greatly contributed to the local sport scene. To further recognize these outstanding Calgarians, the Booster Club

maintains a permanent pictorial showcase of all Sportsman of the Year honourees.

The Sportsman of the Year Wall was unveiled at Canada Olympic Park Atco V.I.P. Centre on March 25, 1990 and at the time of the unveiling contained the pictures of the Calgary Booster Club's 37 award recipients. As each year's winner is announced their picture is added to the display.

The award, named in honour of Henry Viney the long-time Sports Director of CFCN Radio-Television, was established in 1987 by the Calgary Sports Media Club. Scott-Mamini Award

The Scott-Mamini Award, initiated by the Calgary Press-Radio-TV Sports Club in 1958, was presented annually to the city's Athlete of the Year as chosen by the media. That format continued until 1987 when the Scott-Mamini became the Male Athlete of the Year recognition. It is named for Harry Scott, Sports Editor at the Calgary Albertan and Bob Mamini, the Sports Department Head at the Calgary Herald. Both men were highly respected across the country during the 1930's and 1940's.
