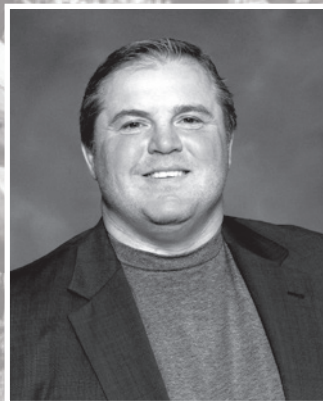

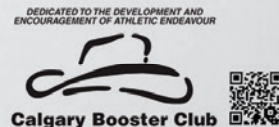

The Calgary Booster Club is very honoured to have Tony Spoletini as our 60th Sportsman of the Year for 2013. Tony is the oldest son of Italian immigrants. He has brought honour and pride to the Spoletini family name in Calgary through his many achievements and successes. Successful individuals are those whose drive, commitment, vision and passion set them apart. Tony has all of these attributes and more!

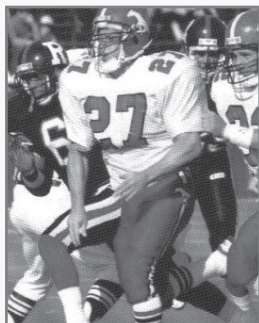
Success has always been an integral part of Tony's life. As a youth he succeeded on the soccer pitch and the football field. His high school team, the St. Francis Browns, were undefeated and City Champions for two seasons. He joined the University of Calgary Dinos, as a 17 year old freshman, he was a member of two Vanier Cup Championships and Canada West Rookie of the Year. He was signed by the CFL Edmonton Eskimos and was a member of the 1987 Grey Cup team. He signed as a free agent in 1989 with the Calgary Stampeders, played in the Grey Cup and lost to the Toronto Argonauts in 1991.

Tony retired from professional football in 1992 and joined his Stamp teammate Mike Palumbo and cousin Tom Spoletini in the highly successful restaurant /catering, Spolumbos, Fine Foods and Deli. Spolumbos is a name recognized by many Calgarians not only for their fine products but also for their ongoing support for diverse organizations from church groups to the sport and fine art community.

Tony's passion for football has never wavered. He has been one of the key people in the growth of Calgary minor football. He has coached Atom, Bantam, and Midget football dedicating hundreds of hours to young athletes. A parent of his Bantam football team wrote of his passion, fairness and remarkable sense of humour. "Win, lose or draw Tony could be found leading his team in song, in a humorous game or exercise. His young charges felt the real joy of playing the game".

Tony was instrumental in developing grass roots football within Calgary and surrounding rural areas. He was a leader in the development of the Calgary and Area Midget Football Spring league which has provided many players a new opportunity to play football.

Tony is credited as being the driving force behind the improvement and development of football venues in Calgary. He teamed with Calgary Cowboys Football Association executives and the Calgary Shriners to fund and build "Shriners Field" complete with lights: home field for the Midget and an Atom football leagues. As vice president of the Greater Calgary Amateur Football Association, he was in charge of fund raising and one of three members overseeing construction of the facilities at Shouldice Athletic Park. The facility is cited as one of the finest of its kind in Canada made up of three artificial turf fields, grandstands, press boxes, scoreboards, lights and entry plaza.



Tony has given back to his Alma Mater. He was a volunteer coach and is a significant supporter and important member of the annual Dino's 5th Quarter fund raising dinner as Co-chairman and Co-Master of Ceremonies. He is valued as a mentor and resource for the officer group and board of directors of this group. His personnel efforts have raised substantial dollars for Dino football scholarships. Tony has also volunteered his time as the color commentator for the Dino football games on QR77 radio.

He has been responsible for coordinating the Stampeders alumni spring football camps which not only provides young players a chance to learn the game from former CFL players but also raises money for the Alberta Children's Hospital. Tony is a former board member and currently an active member of the Stampeders alumni.

Tony also supports his Italian roots as a member of the Italian Sportsman Dinner Board. His personality, wit and charm as co master of ceremonies annually attracts sold out dinners. His amazing humour and talent has Tony volunteering at countless speaking and emceeing engagements for charities.

Tony has been recognized by Dinos Athletics - Lou Goodwin Award for Outstanding Service 2008 and Football Alberta- Outstanding Service Award for Football in Alberta 2009. In 2013 he was awarded The Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal. He has also been inducted into the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame in 2010 as a member of the 1983 - 1985 Dinos.

Tony has brought his passion to every facet of his life: dedication to his family, Lisa and their three sons, philanthropic, he and his business partners support numerous causes and as a committed but humble volunteer. His vision and drive has resulted in the development of football facilities which will benefit thousands of young athletes and adults for many years to come. His coaching and contributions to the development football leagues for Calgary youth insures his "love of the game" will continue to inspire.

Tony is truly a unique personality in the fabric of Calgary's sporting community. For his efforts in promoting youth football programs and developing facilities, the Calgary Booster Club is proud to honour Tony Spoletini as our 60th Sportsman of the Year.

**DOUG BIRD - Swimming**

Doug is described as a consummate volunteer, a skilled leader and a respected mentor by those who know and have the pleasure of working with him. Doug was introduced to the world of competitive swimming when his children joined the University of Calgary Swim Club, a community he continues to embrace long after his children have left the sport. Doug has been involved with the U of C Swim Club, the Southern Region of Swim Alberta, Swim Alberta and Swimming Canada for more than 25 years. He has taken on just about every role from volunteer official to chair of Swim Canada's Presidents Council, an advisory body to the Chief Executive Officer. Doug is the current president of Swim Alberta, a position he has held since 2004 and has served on the board since 2000.

A Master Official, Doug regularly works local, provincial and national meets at all levels from developmental to Olympic Trials, Senior and CIS Championships. He contributes to Swim Alberta's officials committee as a teacher, as mentor to new referees and by assisting in updating and revising clinics. His greatest love is working with computers and mentoring officials learning to operate the electronic timing at swim meets.

Doug is Past President of the Lindsay Park Sports Society. He was chair of the building committee that guided the major expansion of the Talisman Centre with the addition of the second 50M pool, three gymnasiums, the large public weight room and the sports medicine clinic. This expansion has provided not only athletes but also Calgarians with greatly needed training and exercise facilities. He is currently a member of the Talisman Centre, John Currie Amateur Sport Legacy Fund committee, which oversees the distribution of Western Canada Games legacy bursaries.

Doug is married with two children, is a master swimmer and who along with his wife Karen stay in shape by running and biking.

For his outstanding leadership and significant contributions to the Sport of Swimming and the Talisman Centre, The Calgary Booster Club is pleased to recognize Doug Bird as an Honoured Athletic Leader.

**BRIAN HANES - Baseball**

Brian has coached youth baseball at every level for over twenty years, including college. Starting in 1988 until 1995 he was active with the Calgary East Little League program and All Star Teams. He moved on to coach with the Babe Ruth Baseball Giants and Dodgers Organizations. During this period he was also responsible for the 16-18 age group all Star Travel Teams. He has coached a number of league champions and regional finalists and has taken teams to the Senior Babe Ruth World Series in Ohio in both 2006 and 2008. He is a former associate scout with Major League Baseball's Texas Ranger organization.

Through numerous training camps, club teams, travel teams and individual training sessions, Brian has coached thousands of young players. Current and former players consistently express their appreciation for his team management skills and for his ability to instill values of teamwork, self-discipline, respect and love of baseball. Brian is recognized as one of the most knowledgeable people in developing young players. Parents and coaches often seek his advice, which he readily and patiently shares.

Brian's efforts on behalf of Babe Ruth Calgary have been tireless. He has been a long serving member on the board of Babe Ruth Calgary and has been president of the Coaches Association since it was founded in 2003. He has been instrumental in evaluating and instituting rule changes, scheduling, planning preseason evaluations and practice schedules and liaising between the Board of Directors and the Umpires Association.

Founder and president of a company called "Total Baseball" which assists Babe Ruth baseball players in the search and selection of suitable college programs. He has assisted more than 40 players in playing college baseball and pursuing their education.

In 2012, Brian was named Babe Ruth Calgary, AAA Manager of the Year.

For his efforts in developing young players and for his long service to Babe Ruth Calgary, Brian is most deserving of recognition as a Calgary Booster Club Honoured Athletic Leader.

**PATRICK JARVIS, Paralympics**

Patrick has a life-long passion for sport as demonstrated by his involvement at many levels and in many capacities.

A Paralympian, Patrick competed at the 1992 Paralympic Summer Games in Barcelona (Athletics) switching to track after having started as an alpine ski racer. He was the Chef de Mission for the Canadian Team at the 1998 Paralympic Winter Games and the official CPC representative at three Paralympic Games: Sydney, Salt Lake City and Athens.

Patrick has been involved with Canadian Paralympic sport as a volunteer since 1987, including 13 years on the Canadian Paralympic Committee (CPC) Board serving seven years as the CPC President. He also held an executive position as CEO of the Canadian Paralympic Foundation.

He was a member of the Secretary of State's Working Group on Sport for Persons with a Disability, the first National Sport Advisory Committee to the Secretary of State for Amateur Sport. Patrick has served on a number of boards and committees including the Board of Directors of the Organizing Committee for the Vancouver 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games; IOC Evaluation Commission for the 2012 Games and subsequent IOC Coordination Commission for the London Olympic and Paralympic Games: WinSport; 2010 Legacies Now (Vancouver); the University of Guelph Board of Governors and the governing Board of the International Paralympic Committee.

Still active in sports, including basketball, curling, skiing and cycling he ran the Chicago Marathon for the "fun of it" and then ran the Boston Marathon in a "Run Jarvis Run" fundraiser for Paralympic sports.

For decades Patrick has empowered people with disabilities to seek their full potential through sport. Based on his extensive involvement with Paralympics movement, he was named as a Member of the Order of Canada in 2010.

It is with pride and admiration, that the Calgary Booster Club recognizes Patrick Jarvis as an Honoured Athletic Leader.

**Christine Laverty - Athletics, Cross Country**

Christine Laverty has been a track and field coach in Calgary for the past 16 years. Christine began her coaching career as a youth age coach with "Calgary Track West" and later with "Calgary Track and Field". She was the distance and x-country coach with CalTaf, and was later promoted to the head coaching role. Early in her coaching career in Calgary she began her provincial coaching interests where she was selected to many Provincial teams. Some of her athletes performed well at the national level and her hard work and dedication to the sport was being recognized at the National level and she was soon representing Canada as one of the top coaches in Canada. She continues to coach athletes to the national level. She has been a National team coach from 2006 – 2013.

Prior to coming to Calgary Christine grew up in Quebec where she began her volunteering and coaching in the sports of x-country, track and field and gymnastics. In total Christine has been involved in Athletics for 39 years and counting. Christine has had many accomplishments in her short time in Calgary. Christine was chairperson for the Canadian National Championships in 2011 and the Canadian Olympic Trials and National Championships in 2012 here in Calgary.

She is also Chair of the Calgary Track Council the main organizing body which brings all track clubs together to plan current and future meets along with coordinating local facility use.

Christine has won many awards for her work in track and field over the years. In 2001 and 2006 she was presented with the Development coach of the year Award and 2010 the George Gerner Award for her years of contribution to the sport of Athletics in Alberta. Her most recent honour was in 2012 as she was named the Volunteer of the Year for Athletics Alberta.

**Don & Mylene Saxton (Volleyball)**

Both Don and Mylene Saxton are former players on the Canadian Volleyball Teams. In ensuing years, they played on and coached a number of very successful teams. In 1994, they purchased the Tennis Bubble and converted it into a hard court and beach volleyball facility – The Volleymine. While it is sometimes difficult to separate the business side of the Volleymine from their volunteer work, it is clear that most of their work with the youth programs has been done on a volunteer basis. Their accomplishments have been recognized by the volleyball community with coaching and builder awards and selections as provincial team coaches.

**Vini Sciore - Football**

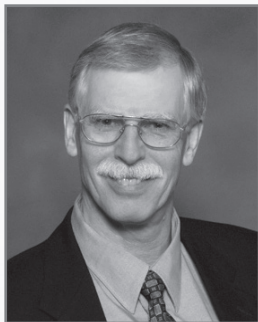
Vini Sciore has spent over 30 years contributing to football and athletics in the City of Calgary's High Schools. Vini has been an outstanding educator, coach and mentor in the Calgary Catholic School District for over 30 years and during that time has coached football, rugby, and soccer.

Vini has been instrumental in developing the junior football program at its roots at St. Mary's High School since 1990. His dedication to coaching has not been an easy task as he has struggled to get enough student athletes to participate on these inner city High School teams.

Vini is a man of character and integrity and enjoys seeing students come into the program with no football skills and leave with the knowledge and understanding to play at the senior level and beyond. Even though Vini would say that his major accomplishment is providing students an opportunity to participate in athletics, his football teams have captured 8 City Championships and 7 City Finalists awards. He also captured a City title in Soccer.

Vini is also an outstanding husband and father and he is also involved in the community as a volunteer. He has been a hockey manager and director from 2001 – 2011 with the NWCA hockey association; and was involved in the inception of the NWCAA Michael Gee hockey scholarship. Vini is a former director of the Calgary Italian Club. Vini is also an accomplished musician, he and his band have entertained many Calgarians at their weddings, birthdays and retirement parties.

It is for his passion and dedication to young athletes that we recognize Vini Sciore as an Honoured Athletic Leader in 2013.

**DR. DAVID SMITH - Sports Science**

For the past 30 years Dr. David (Doc) Smith has been instrumental in designing and implementing training programs for elite athletes.

Dr. Smith is a "leader of leaders" and a "mentor of mentors" for Canadian sport. His contribution to Canadian sport performance is undeniable. He has had a major influence on 9 national sports: Swimming, Speed Skating, Volleyball, Synchronized Swimming, Cross Country Skiing, Biathlon, Paralympic Skiing, Women's Olympic Hockey Team, and Track Cycling. He has been an Exercise Physiology consultant for the Canadian Olympic Committee initially beginning at Sarajevo, Winter Games 1984, and most recently at his tenth Olympic Games at London, 2012. His leading edge research and leadership have directly contributed to Canadian Olympic medals and World records.

As Director of Sport Science for the Canadian Sport Centre Calgary (CSCC), Dr. Smith has provided a critical link to the U of C, Human Performance Laboratory with his research and expertise in training systems. Dr. Smith's work is recognized throughout the world. He has particular expertise in altitude protocols and no one is "doing it like he does". His understanding of sustained intensity has been a key to performance improvement in endurance sports. His protocols, as they pertain to blood and lab testing to monitor the advancement of athletes, are unique. His mentorship has resulted in tremendous growth in the Canadian sport system and his graduate students and exercise physiology technicians have played key roles.

Dr. Smith's knowledge and insights are impacting a significant population beyond sport. His work with patients and doctors at the Tom Baker Cancer Centre in developing fitness programs for cancer survivors has significantly improved fitness, energy levels, and overall quality of life.

Doc Smith, as he is called by his students, recently retired as a professor in the Faculty of Kinesiology, University of Calgary but he continues to be actively involved as the Director of Sport Science at the Canadian Sport Centre, Calgary and WinSport Canada.

The Calgary Booster Club is proud to recognize Dr. David Smith for his leadership, mentorship and ground breaking research.

**Leslie Sproule - Synchronized Swimming**

Leslie Sproule started as an athlete in Synchronized Swimming and transitioned into coaching where she has coached from Grassroots to the Olympic Games for the past 32 years. Besides working with athletes, she has mentored coaches and helped develop programs in Calgary, Alberta, Canada, Malaysia, India and Brazil. She has consulted in 22 countries worldwide. Her book "Coaching Synchronized Swimming" has sold in 25 countries since 1998.

Although Leslie is not an official, she has trained officials both nationally and internationally. She is seen by FINA, the International Federation for Aquatic Sports, as a leading expert and visionary for Synchronized Swimming.

Leslie has also developed dryland training programs for swim and water polo clubs as well as the Men's National Water polo team. She is a recipient of the 3M Canada Coaching Excellence Award and was inducted into the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame as a builder in 2008. Her volunteer work involves her passion; coaching. She sits on the Board of Directors for Coach Alberta, Sport Alberta, Coaches of Canada and the Technical Synchronized Swimming Committee for the Pan American countries.

**Len T. Wong - Basketball Official**

Len started his involvement in basketball in 1974 as a Basketball manager for the Western Canada High School Senior girls Basketball team. Len has also contributed to the game of Basketball in various behind the scene capacities as an Executive Member of the (CBOA) Calgary Basketball Officials Association assuming various volunteer positions including those of President, Past President, Vice President, and Treasurer. 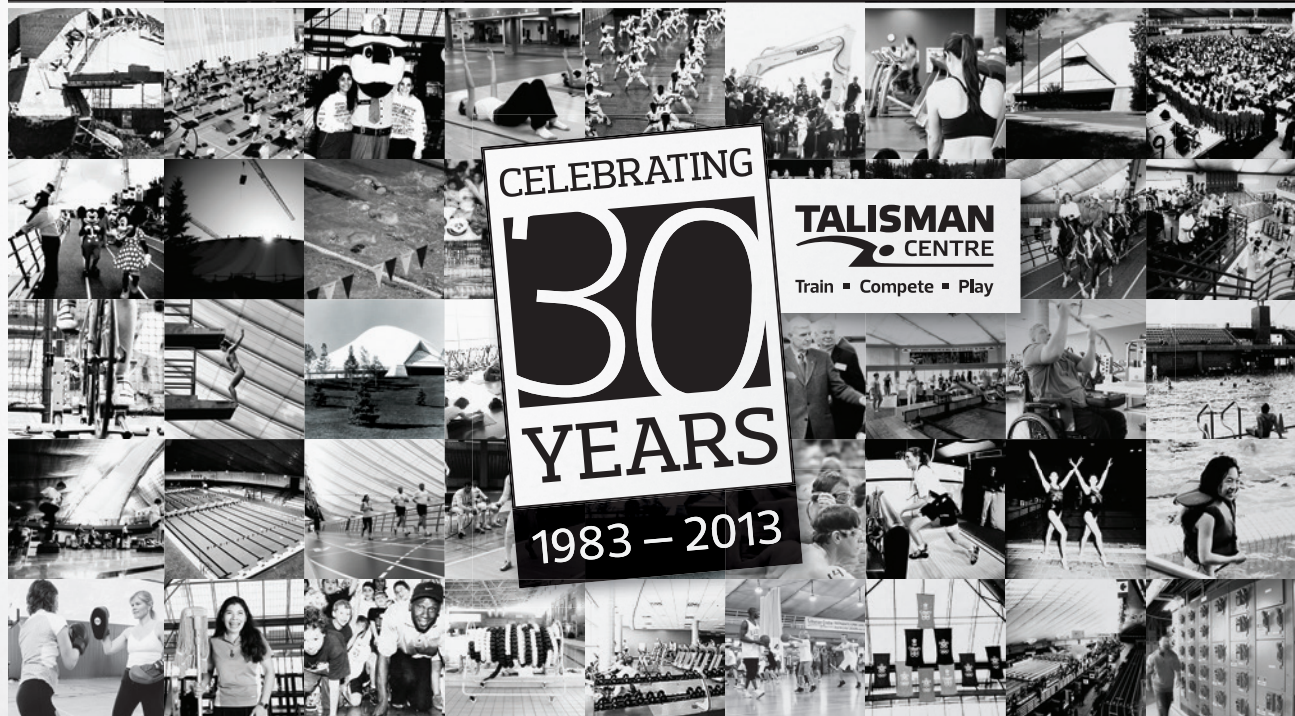

SPORTS WALL OF FAME AND OLYMPIC TORCH DISPLAY

For over 60 years the Calgary Booster Club has woven itself into the fabric of our community. Often standing behind the scenes, the Club has endeavoured to recognize the leadership that has made Calgary athletic programs so vibrant and to celebrate and support individual athletic accomplishments.

In 1984 the Calgary Booster Club approved the concept of a permanent display of recognition for leadership and athletic award winners. An agreement was reached between the Club and Board of Directors of the Talisman Centre to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility. The Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame was opened to the public on December 9, 1987. By 1998 no more names could be added and the display was beginning to deteriorate.

The original wall was removed during 2010 renovations when Talisman Centre was closed for roof repairs. On November 15, 2012 a new "living" Sport Wall of Fame was installed. A TV monitor displays photos and biographies of Calgary sports leaders and athletes recognized by the Club since 1953.

The 2010 torch was donated by Ernie McCullough, a founding member of the Calgary Boost Club and president of the Calgary Olympic Development Association (CODA) which submitted Calgary's first Olympic bid.

This torch is of special significance not only because of Ernie's early contributions but also because he represented Canada as a track and field athlete at the 1948 London Games. Sixty two years later, he carried this torch as part of the cross Canada relay tour.

The Calgary Athlete of the Year Award was started in 1958 by the Calgary Press Radio TV Sports Club. The award was given to the top male or female athlete in Calgary until 1987 when the Henry Viney Trophy was instituted for the top female athlete of the year. The Calgary Booster Club has coordinated the recognition program since 1990 after the Sports Media Club folded. The Calgary Booster Club honoured its first athlete at the 1956 Sportsman of the Year Dinner - a young football star named Normie Kwong, who was Alberta's Lieutenant-Governor from 2005-2010.

This award, named in honour of Henry Viney, the long-time Sports Director of CFCN Radio-Television, was established in 1987 by the Calgary Sports Media Club. Viney, over a career that spanned some 50 years, covered every major sporting event around the globe and received many major awards including Canadian Sportscaster of the Year (1967 Foster Hewitt Award) and the Calgary Booster Club Sportsman of the Year (1976). The "little man with the big cigar" passed away in 1980.

Kaillie Humphries



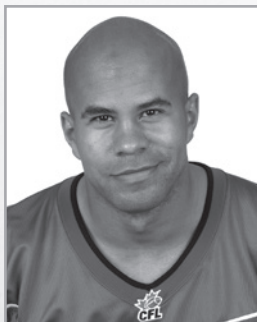
Kaillie dominated the international women's bobsleigh scene during 2012 and early 2013 by capturing 8 straight wins and making 12 podium appearances including ten victories and the 2012 World Women's Bobsleigh Championship. During that span she teamed with three brakemen - Emily Baadsvik, Jenny Ciocchetti and since the Fall, Chelsea Valois. The 27 year old Calgarian started in the sport as a 17 year old after retiring as an alpine ski racer. She served four years as a brakeman before stepping into the driver's seat in 2006-2007. She became the first Olympic champion claiming gold with brakeman Heather Moyse at the 2010 Vancouver Games.

Kaillie is also committed to the community. During the Christmas season she and her family are involved in a dinner program for the homeless; she is also active with elementary schools as a speaker and mentor.

It was a banner year for Jon Cornish who in his first year as a starter won the CFL rushing title accumulating 1457 yards and breaking Normie Kwong's 56 year old single season rushing record for Canadians. The result of the record breaking effort was the 2012 CFL Most Outstanding Canadian award as well as runner-up honors as the league's Most Outstanding Player. He was member of the West Division, CFL and CFL Player's Association all-star teams in 2012.

The 29 year old New Westminster, BC native now lives in Calgary year round. He was chosen by the Stamps in the second round (13th overall) at the 2006 CFL Draft. He served as a member of the special teams unit and as the back-up running back before stepping into the spotlight during the 2011 season. Jon repeats as the winner of the Scott-Mamini Award and joins twelve previous football winners.

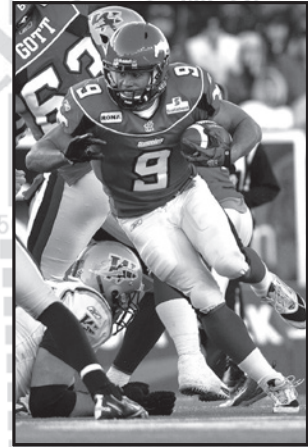
