2024 SPORTSPERSON OF THE YEAR

Pat Jarvis



Patrick has a life-long passion for sport, as demonstrated by his involvement at many levels and in many capacities. For decades, he has empowered people to seek their full potential through sport.

He has been a part of the Calgary Booster Club's history since 1976, when he was selected as the Harry Hood Memorial Award winner for being the outstanding high school football player in Grade 12 at Crescent Heights High School.

For 36-plus years Patrick has been an athlete, coach, administrator and organizer for the Paralympic movement, which is his passion.

As an athlete and builder, Patrick has provided leadership to the Canadian Paralympic community for several decades. He competed at the 1990 World Track & Field Championships, as well as in the 1992 Summer Paralympic Games.

"After his retirement from competition, Patrick turned his attention to team management. He volunteered his time to the Alberta and Canadian Amputee Sport Association, as well as the Canadian and International Paralympics Committees. Through these and other roles, he has guided hundreds of Canadian Para-athletes and transformed multiple sports organizations," said Darrell MacLachlan, an alpine ski builder and friend.

Patrick has been involved with the Canadian Paralympic Sport Association as a volunteer since 1987, including 13 years on the Canadian Paralympic Committee (CPC) board, serving seven years as president. He also held an executive position as CEO of the Canadian Paralympic Foundation. In 1994, Patrick was the team leader for the World Athletics Championships in Berlin. From 1983-1995, he was president of the Canadian Amputee Sport Association. He followed this up in 1996 as a member of the Canadian Team Mission staff at the Paralympic Games in Atlanta, Georgia. His next achievement was his appointment as Chef de Mission Canada at the 1998 Paralympic Games in Nagano, Japan. In 2000, as CPC president, he was part of Canada's official delegation to the Paralympic Games in Sydney, Australia and in 2004, Patrick continued on as a member of the Canadian delegation to the Paralympic Winter Games in Salt Lake, Utah.

Patrick was inducted into the Canadian Paralympics Hall of Fame in 2007. In 2010, he was on the board of directors for the Paralympic Winter Games in Vancouver, B.C. and he was made a member of the Order of Canada in 2011. He was twice awarded the prestigious Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Medal.

The Calgary Booster Club selected Patrick in 2013 as an Honoured Athletic Leader for his many years of service to Calgary and area athletes.

Patrick continued to show his versatility when he held the role of executive director of the Canada Snowboard Association from 2015 to 2019. He was approached by Bobsleigh Canada Skeleton in 2023 to be their interim chief executive, where he was tasked with helping create a supportive culture for the organization.

Patrick has also been named to the 2024 class for the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame.





CALGARY BOOSTER CLUB Honoured Athletic Leaders

The Calgary Booster Club recognizes individuals with established track records of dedication to the sporting landscape as Honoured Athletic Leaders. Winners have demonstrated long service — typically more than 15 years — and made contributions in a volunteer or administrative or athletic capacity. These are Calgary's difference-makers, sport promoters and tireless influencers.

This year's selections include:



Celeste Bazinet

She's been described as a remarkable pillar of the Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association (CSHSAA). Celeste - better known as "Baz" - earned that description for her efforts as an athletic director, teacher and coach. The athletic director at both Bishop McNally High School and Notre Dame High School has coached several sports, including soccer, football, basketball and volleyball.



Martyn Bentley

If you know about rugby in Calgary, then you know Martyn. His achievements include a decade of playing time with the Canucks Rugby Club and another decade as a junior coach for the Canucks. Martyn did everything, from directing cars in the parking lot to coaching all age levels. He worked with kids at Lord Beaverbrook High School and also served in executive positions, including president, with the Canucks, helping to make the club successful on the field while growing enrolments.



Wade Buteau

Wade is a multi-sport talent who has coached football, wrestling, rugby, track and other athletic endeavours for 38 years. The teacher at Our Lady of the Rockies High School helped guide his teams to 17 city championships and one provincial title. Wade has built character in his athletes in a positive environment, allowing them to thrive in competition and in life.



Al Coates

Al's hockey roots in Calgary go back decades. He was an executive with the 1989 Calgary Flames team that won the Stanley Cup and he was an original organizer of the Calgary Flames Foundation Golf Gala event, which has raised millions of dollars for charity. Al was the executive director of the IIHF 2012 World Junior Hockey Championship and he remains an active member of the Alberta Hockey Hall of Fame selection committee.


Cody Ehrmann

Cody is a gridiron guru who has earned the respect and admiration of the student athletes he has taught over the years. The junior and senior football head coach at Calgary's Henry Wise Wood High School has been described as dedicated, passionate and inspiring by both his players and the teachers he's worked with. He has also coached track and field, basketball, and driven the bus for the school's basketball teams.



Theresa Garagan

Theresa has been a dedicated volunteer with Special Olympics Calgary for over two decades. She has attended numerous Special Olympics events at the local, provincial and national and international levels, working as a coach to push athletes to achieve their goals. Theresa coaches both track and field and alpine skiing, and she was the Co-Chair for the 2019 Special Olympics Alberta Provincial Winter Games, which were held in Calgary...



Ian Gordon

He was an intense competitor as a sprinter and that intensity allowed him to represent Canada at the Commonwealth Games, the Pan-Am Games and the Olympics in the early 1970s. Ian followed that up by coaching with Calgary Track West in the 1980s before setting his sights on working as an official, where his duties included track referee and start referee. He was also the statistician for the Alberta Officials Committee, has worked as a member of the National Officials' Committee, and he served on the Athletics Alberta Board. In 2017, Ian was named to the Athletics Canada Wall of Honour.



Catriona Le May Doan

She's a decorated athlete and an inspiring sports leader. As a speed skater, Catriona claimed two Olympic gold medals and another five World Championship gold medals. She was Canada's flag bearer at the closing ceremony of the 1998 Nagano Olympics and at the opening ceremony of the 2002 Salt Lake City Olympics. In addition, she won the Lou Marsh Award as Canada's Athlete of the Year in 2002. Catriona has been inducted into Canada's Sports Hall of Fame and was appointed as an Officer of the Order of Canada. She is currently the president & CEO of Sport Calgary.

Art O'Dwyer

Art is part of the fabric of Calgary's volleyball scene. After playing the sport at the University of Calgary in the late 1970s and early 1980s, he went into coaching. He served as an assistant volleyball coach at UCalgary before coaching other sports, including baseball, soccer and hockey. Art was named the Volleyball Alberta Coach of the Year in 2009 and he was the head coach of the SAIT women's volleyball program from 2011 through 2020. He continues to mentor young coaches.



Todd Richards

He's worked as an exceptional teacher and coach at Forest Lawn High School and James Fowler High School. Todd has coached track, basketball, hockey and football in those twenty-plus years. In that time, he has had a positive impact on thousands of student athletes.



Lisa Schott

She has spent countless hours volunteering her time to artistic swimming. Initially drawn to the sport by her daughter's involvement with a Calgary swimming club, Lisa went on to become a board member for Canada Artistic Swimming in the early 2000s. She then became the president of that organization from 2007 through 2011. Lisa's volunteer efforts continued as the president of Aquatics Canada, a role she held between 2011 and 2020. In 2017, she was elected as chair of the World Aquatic Technical Committee. Lisa is an internationally respected leader.



Murray Sigler

Murray has been an avid supporter of multiple sports in Calgary. The former CEO & executive director of Sport Calgary, continues to support athletics on several fronts. He is the founder of the Sport For Calgary Foundation, which seeks to build a healthy community through participation in sports, as well as the president/CEO of the Calgary Health Foundation. In addition, Murray sits on the boards of the Lindsay Park Sports Society, KidSport Calgary and the Glencoe Golf & Country Club.



Pamela Young

Getting everyone rowing in the right direction is no problem for Pamela. Her experience with the Calgary Rowing Club is extensive and includes time spent as a director, secretary, treasurer, vice-president and president. A thoughtful and effective leader, Pamela has also worked for 15 years on the Glenmore Canoe and Rowing Clubhouse Foundation Board.

HENRY VINEY TROPHY WINNER

Alexandria Loutitt

Captivated by ski jumping when she watched athletes compete in the 2010 Olympic sport in Whistler, B.C., Alexandria Loutitt spent the next three-plus years begging her parents to let her join in on the high-flying fun. Now, the Calgarian is helping to take the sport to new heights for Canada.

The 20-year-old made her Olympic debut in Beijing in 2022, where she won bronze in mixed team ski jumping, and last year she became the first Canadian woman to win a FIS Ski Jumping World Cup event. That marked one of many firsts for Loutitt, who also won the women's large hill event at the 2023 FIS Nordic World Ski Championships in Slovenia and landed a 225-metre jump that set an all-time Canadian record.

"I have finally been able to soak it all in. But I really see it as the beginning of something bigger," said Loutitt of her success in 2023.

"It's often scary to go into the unknown and to chase what's never been done before, but I find it thrilling. I'm an adrenaline junkie who loves a challenge and I'm always up to break barriers."

Loutitt moved to Germany at the age of 14 to focus on her training and pursue her dream of competing in the Olympics. It was a major step that her mother, Tracy McKay, reflected on when she accepted the Henry Viney Trophy on Loutitt's behalf at a Calgary Booster Club press conference.

"It has been a long, difficult road," said McKay. "And Alexandria has really demonstrated a lot of grit and determination to get to where she is today."

Added McKay: "Thank goodness for the National Sports School and Ski Jumping Canada for supporting her ... that launched Alexandria off into a trajectory that I don't think we expected. And she's got big goals for the future."

We cannot wait to see what that future holds for Loutitt

SCOTT-MAMINI AWARD WINNER

Dustin Wolf



Known for his distinctive pre-period stretching routine that is punctuated by a leap in the crease, goalie Dustin Wolf has made the jump to the Calgary Flames.

Before becoming a regular netminder in the National Hockey League (NHL), Wolf proved himself with the Calgary Wranglers. In only his second season of professional hockey, at the American Hockey League (AHL) level, the Californian claimed every major goaltending award, and more. His 55 games in the 2022-23 season led all AHL goalies and he finished 42-10-2, ranking tops in the league in wins, goals against average (2.09), save percentage (.932), and shutouts (seven).

The honours Wolf claimed for his 2022-23 season included the Les Cunningham Award (league MVP), the President's Award (player excellence), the Harry "Hap" Holmes Memorial Award (lowest GAA) and his second consecutive Aldege "Baz" Bastien Memorial Award as the AHL's best goalie.

Wolf made his NHL debut with the Flames in 2023 before splitting time in the AHL and NHL in 2024. The seventh-round pick in the 2019 NHL Entry Draft appeared in 17 games for the Flames in 2023-24, picking up seven wins in those games.

"It means a lot," Wolf said of winning the Scott-Mamini Memorial Award, which had previously been won by Flames alumni Jarome Iginla and Mark Giordano, as well as NHL star defenceman Cale Makar.

"They're pretty exceptional hockey players. To add yourself to a list of recipients like that is certainly a big honour."

Added Wolf: "This is only my second year full-time in the city of Calgary ... and you can tell just from being out in the public and being around the arena that people care a lot about their players and their city and hockey."

Scott-Mamini Award

The Scott-Mamini Award, initiated by the Calgary Press-Radio-TV Sports Club in 1958, was presented annually to the city's Athlete of the Year as chosen by the media. That format continued until 1987 when the Scott-Mamini became the Male Athlete of the Year recognition. It is named for Harry Scott, Sports Editor at the Calgary Albertan and Bob Mamini, the Sports Department Head at the Calgary Herald. Both men were highly respected across the country during the 1930's and 1940's.

This has helped her achieve a silver medal at the 2022 Pan Am championships, and a bronze in the 2022 Canadian National championships and has been a valued team member of the junior national team for the past 5 years.

Besides her time spent on the water as an athlete, she has also been a dedicated volunteer to waterskiing. She has been involved as a side skier and dock starter for adaptive waterski clinics and is always willing to give back. Amy currently ranks second overall for the last two years. This year, Amy won the Mammoth Mountain, California World Cup. She consistently stands on the podium in the World Cup and X-Games. Nationally, Amy ranked 3rd last year and moved to second this year.

Amy is unparalleled in her work ethic and commitment to her sport. She delivers outstanding consecutive performances and is really showing a dominance in the sport of halfpipe. Her creative approach to training and her enthusiasm to the sport of skiing is contagious. Amy often hosts free all female introduction clinics for halfpipe. Amy represents her community and strives to achieve the highest level possible.

Amy's goal is to win the Crystal Globe which ranks her first overall for halfpipe skiing in the world. She hopes to bring home the Gold at the 2026 Olympics in Italy. Amy strives to bring her own personal style to skiing by incorporating new tricks and creativity into her programs. Amy is an awesome representative in her sport for Canada and we will continue to hear her name in the world of Halfpipe for years to come.

Beyond his athletic results, Liam is a leader in his community and uses his platform to inspire youth. Liam is a member of the Liidlii Kue First Nation and is motivated to provide access to recreational participation for indigenous youth. Liam held his own event called 'Liam and Friends', which allowed indigenous youth to try snowboarding and celebrate their identity, culture, and traditions. His event was so successful that Liam has decided to found a non-profit that will offer more programming to indigenous youth nation-wide.

Liam believes that sport has the power to unite, create joy and inspire hope and pride. We are proud to award Liam the Art Smith Endowment Grant.

Andrew Hubbard - Rowing

Andrew Hubbard began rowing at the age of 14 with the Calgary Rowing Club. Through Andrew's fabulous work ethic, natural athleticism, and disciplined focus he made his first international debut on the world stage at the U23 World National Championship where he placed 16th in the Men's doubles.

Andrew has numerous National Rowing U23 accolades under his belt winning a bronze and 6th overall in 2023. In 2022, Andrew won a Silver with a 3rd place overall. In 2022, at the Canadian Speed Orders Andrew won a Gold with a 3rd place overall finish.

Despite, Andrew's busy academic load at the University of Victoria, he still finds time to be one of the most encouraging and positive teammates. His dedicated leadership to his craft and those around him has spurred him on to wonderful successes. Andrew received two 4th place finishes at the 2023 Canadian University Rowing Championships. He placed 6th in the men's doubles at the Pan Am Qualifiers. The 2022 Canada Summer Games, saw Andrew win a Gold in the Men's Pair and a Bronze in the Men's Quad. Andrew also won a gold in the Men's pair and a bronze in the men's Quad at the Alberta Summer Games.

Andrew Hubbard's goal is to compete for Canada in the FISU World Rowing Championships in Rotterdam, Netherlands. He continues to strive to be in the top three overall in the Senior Canadian Rowing Championships. Andrew's outstanding rowing talent and dedication to excellence will help him achieve his goals.

Tyson Langelaar - Long Track Speed Skating

Tyson is an Olympian who has been competing internationally since he was Junior.

Tyson made his Olympic debut at Beijing 2022 as a member of Team Canada. He competed in the 1500m where he was a member of Canada's 5th place finish in team pursuits and 22nd in the 1500m.

During the 2023 competitive season, Tyson had an impressive 9th place finish in Men's 1500m at ISU World Cup 5, and at the ISU World Championships he placed 13th in the Men's 1500m. At the Canadian Championships, Tyson placed 3rd in both the Men's 1000m and the 1500m.

Tyson's hopes were to podium at the 2024 Canadian Championships, but unfortunately his season was cut short due to a lingering injury. Tyson's goal is to get back into the World's Top 10 ranking in the Men's 1500m.

Tyson spends his time outside of sport as an undergrad student studying Urban Studies at the University of Calgary and volunteering for the organization Classroom Champions. He also puts in countless hours as a director of the Calgary Booster Club working to boost sponsorship for athletes and their programs. His support of the future generation of athletes attests to his excellent character.

Tyson continues to work towards achieving international podium finishes leading into the 2026 Olympic games.

Zach Lavin – Para Hockey

Zach Lavin started playing Para ice hockey with the Calgary Scorpions in 2016 after being introduced to the sport by Chris Cederstrand, a former member of Canada's National Sledge Team... Zach had both legs amputated below the knee after getting lost on a hiking trip in the Rocky Mountains for three days and suffering frostbite in February 2016.

As an active, multi-sport athlete, Zach chose not to let his accident be a tragedy, but rather to turn it into a new challenge and opportunity for himself. Although he never actually played hockey growing up, he found para hockey through a chance encounter in Okotoks.

"After my accident, I felt like I got a second chance at life, and I just wanted a fresh start," he said. "So, I ended up at a gym in Okotoks, and met Chris Cedarstrand, and he brought me out to the rink and introduced me to para hockey for the first time. I was instantly hooked by seeing his speed and the way he could maneuver the puck, so I started training with him."

Zach first made Canada's National Para Hockey Team 2017-18. In 2019 made his international debut for Canada at the World Championships winning the silver medal. He again represented Canada in 2021 and 2023 at the World Championships where the team won silver medals both times.

When Zach Lavin first made Canada's National Para Hockey Team in 2017-18, he set a new goal for himself - to don the maple leaf at the in Beijing at the 2022 Paralympic Games, which he accomplished, winning a Silver medal. With that goal accomplished, his sights are now set on winning a gold medal.

It is with great pleasure that Zach Lavin is awarded the Art Smith Endowment Grant for 2024.

Olivia Li - Modern Pentathlon

Olivia Li represents Canada on both the Junior and Senior National Pentathlon teams. Modern Pentathlon is a very diverse multi-sport consisting of fencing, freestyle swimming, equestrian show jumping, pistol shooting and cross country running.

She is the highest ranked Junior athlete and second-highest ranked Senior athlete, in Canada. Olivia's most recent highlight was competing at the 2023 Pan American Ga mes(Santiago, CHI) where she finished 24th. Olivia is a bronze medalist at the 2023 National Championships and a silver medalist at the 2022 National Championships. At the 2022 Pan American Championships, she finished 9th in the Junior Women's event.

Olivia fences in National and Provincial tournaments (a discipline of pentathlon), where she consistently finishes on the podium. Most recently, she finished first and third in Provincial Circuit tournaments (ARES Open and Don Laszlo Open, respectively).

In addition to her athletic success, Olivia is a Psychology student at the University of Calgary, on the Faculty of Science's Dean List. In 2022 she was a Hotchkiss Brain Institute Research Assistant working in the Wilson Lab (where she co-authored her first published paper). Olivia's also a Junior Coach at Ares, and a past recipient of its annual Leadership Award.

Olivia is striving in her training to represent Canada at this year's Junior World's Championships in Egypt and making the finals. It is with great pleasure that Olivia Li is awarded the Art Smith Endowment Grant for 2024.

Brooklyn McDougall - Long Track Speed Skating

Brooklyn McDougall represents Canada in Long Track Speed Skating and competes in the 500m sprint. Currently, Brooklyn is on the Canadian Long Track Next Gen Team.

Brooklyn's passion and strong work ethic has led her to the Olympics and several World Cup Championships. In the Beijing Olympics, Brooklyn placed 22nd in the 500m. In 2022/23, she had a 20th ranking in World Cup Standings for the 500m and that year at the World Speed Skating Championship took a 16th place finish in the 500m.

In our Canadian National Championships, Brooklyn took home a Bronze, Silver, and a Gold over the past three years. Currently, Brooklyn is sitting in 33rd in the World Cup Ranking. With perseverance, Brooklyn is working her way back from an illness. She is passionate for her sport and demonstrates hard work and determination. Brooklyn aims to consistently be in the top 20 in World Cup Standings and place in the top 10 at a World Cup Championship. She wants to represent Canada at the 2025 World Speed Skating Championships and the 2026 Olympics. We will continue to hear about Brooklyn McDougall as she represents Canada in the Sport of Long Track Speed Skating for years to come.

Maddison also volunteered her time during the Special Olympics Canada Winter Games.

Maddison's leadership on and off the ice has made her a deserving recipient of the Art Smith Endowment Grant.

Karissa Riley - Rowing

"I aspire to show the world that, although I may be small for the average rower, small does not equal slow." A born and raised Calgarian, Karissa Riley started rowing in 2018. With no previous experience and being undersized relative to others her age, Karissa nonetheless made an immediate impression that she was not to be underestimated. Showing a willingness to commit the time and energy that might have turned others away from the sport, Karissa chose to stick with Rowing and the hard work that goes along with it. With a determination to develop beyond her stature, she was soon selected to represent Alberta at the 2019 Western Canada Summer Games. Since then, she has earned an undergraduate degree from The University of Western Ontario, while representing Canada at the 2021, 2022, and 2023 U23 World Championships. She has distinguished herself as the first Albertan to win a medal (Bronze) in a single at a U23 World Championship, and most recently took a Silver Medal at The Canadian National Championship in lightweight women single. Her primary athletic focus is now to work toward representing Canada at the 2024 World Rowing Championships, with the goal of bringing home a Gold Medal in the Lightweight Women's Single Sculls. With the games being hosted in St. Catharine's, Ontario, she relishes a rare opportunity to compete for and win Canada Gold on a Canadian course! Her future goals include a transition to open weight sculler, knowing that Lightweight Rowing will be phased out by the L.A. Olympic Games in 2028. Until then, as Karissa sets her sights on the 2024 World Championship, the Calgary Booster Club commends her relentless pursuit of excellence and is proud to be a supporter!

Miki Rowbottom - Wrestling

With the ultimate goal of competing at the 2026 Winter Olympic Games in Italy, Kaiya Ruiter is well on her way with a flurry of National and International competitions, and encouraging results, over the last three years. She came in 20th place at the 2024 ISU Junior World Championships in Taiwan this March, and won a Team Bronze and an Individual 11th place at the 2024 Youth Olympic Games in South Korea. She has also captured a 2024 National Senior Women's Championship last January in Calgary, and a Skate Canada Challenge Silver medal, both in Senior Women's! Scott Davis, National Certified and Olympic Level coach, has worked with Kaiya for the past several years, and describes her as one of the most dedicated, self-motivated, and focused athletes he has ever taught. "She loves every minute of being on the ice, from the daily training to the intense, competitive atmosphere ... Kaiya works extremely hard both on and off the ice..." He also recognizes and admires the sincerity and kindness he shows to teammates, crediting her with support and encouragement of others to help them realize their goals. With continued support and healthy development, the sky is the limit for Kaiya, and The Calgary Booster Club is very pleased to be a part of Kaiya Ruiter's athletic journey as she sets her sights on the Olympics!

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


Female Athlete of the Year Award Willow Lewington

CSHSAA ATHLETICS SINCE 1913

Updated January, 2024

The Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association was established in 1913 to provide competitive athletic opportunities for students in Calgary high schools. The Association believes that the Interscholastic athletic program, as a recognized part of the school program, is educationally sound and will enhance the physical, mental, emotional and social development of young people.

Annually, over 10,000 student athletes participate in twelve sports including football, cross country, soccer, volleyball, diving, wrestling, basketball, swimming, rugby, track and field, badminton and field hockey.

The C.S.H.S.A.A. is unique in many ways, but is recognized nationally for its belief that the amalgamation of Calgary's two educational systems into one common athletic association is in the best interest of the residents of Calgary. As such, the Calgary Board of Education and the Calgary Catholic School District have worked together harmoniously for decades. As well, the partnership with the Calgary Booster Club over the past eight decades has been beneficial to hundreds of student athletes.

Our partnership with the Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association goes back to 1956 when we presented our first scholarship to Jack Sharpe of Western Canada High School for the inaugural Harry Hood Memorial Football Award. Since then, we have honoured and recognized 729 individual high school winners for a total of \$518,500 and an additional 295 student athletes with maximum participation scholarships over three years of high school, for another \$105,000. This amounts to 1,024 athletes with a total investment of \$623,500 by the Calgary Booster Club for outstanding student athletes in the C.S.H.S.A.A. programs.
