Congratulations and best wishes to everyone for an enjoyable evening.

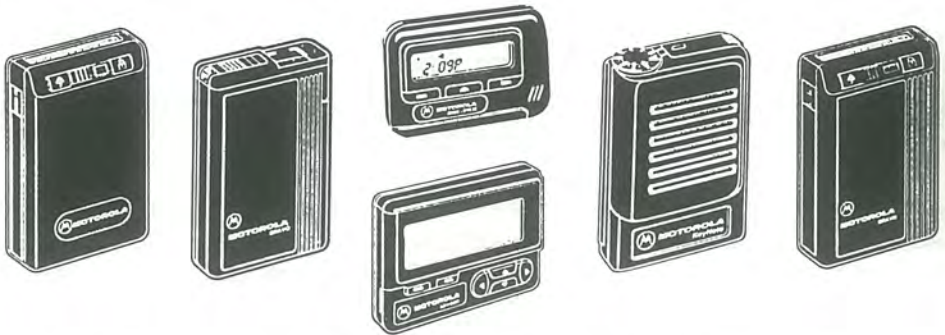

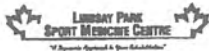

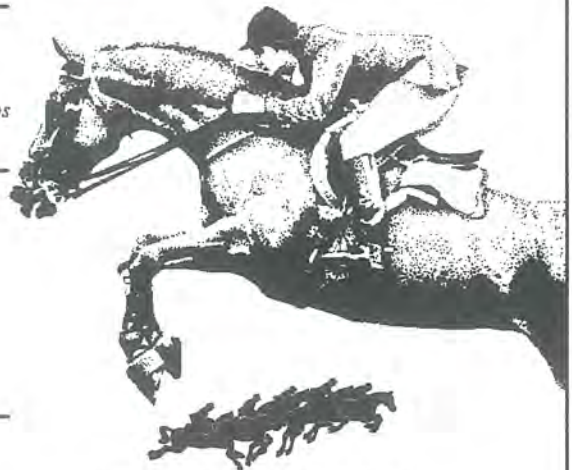

## *Diane Jones Konihowski*



Diane Jones Konihowski has been involved in sport for over 37 years as an athlete, coach, official, administrator, volunteer and now as a parent. She is a three-time Olympian and represented Canada for 15 years in the sport of Track & Field in the events of pentathlon, high jump and long jump.

Jones Konihowski won over 60 National titles, holds the Canadian, Commonwealth and Pan American pentathlon record and was named Canada's "Female of the Year" in 1975 and 1978 based on her #1 ranking in the world. She won Pan American Games gold in 1975 and 1979, and at the 1978 Commonwealth Games in Edmonton Jones Konihowski won Canada's first

gold medal of the Games with a score that ranked her #1 in the world.

In 1980 Jones Konihowski was favoured to win a medal at her third Olympic Games but the American-led boycott of the Moscow Games denied her that opportunity. She won the "Alternate Olympics" and then took some time off from international competition and went into coaching. She officially retired from active competition in 1984, but has remained involved in high performance sport working with Canada's Olympic athletes, promoting and working on behalf of an athlete-focused sport system.

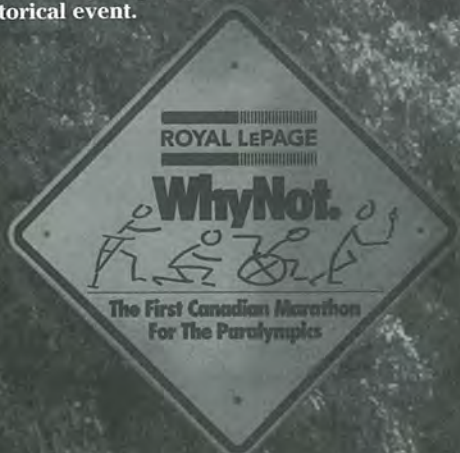
Jones Konihowski has always given back to sport and enjoys her involvement on numerous Federal Boards. She is presently Vice-President of the Canadian Olympic Association, Director of the Coaching Association of Canada, Director of Fair Play Canada and a member of the Canadian Sports Hall of Fame selection committee. She is also Vice-President/Partner with AMJ Campbell, Calgary Division and acts as National Athletic Representative of AMJ Campbell Van Lines, Canada.

In 1978 Jones Konihowski received the Order of Canada and was named *Chatelaine Magazine's* first "Woman of the Year" in 1979. She won the YWCA "Woman of Distinction" Sport & Recreation Award in 1988; the International Toastmasters "Communication and Leadership" Award in 1990; the Commemorative Medal for the 125th Anniversary of the Confederation of Canada in 1992; the Great Canadian Award in 1993 and was inducted into the Canadian Olympic Hall of Fame in 1995.

Jones Konihowski is presently Vice-President of Marketing as well as Manager of Athlete Services at Canada's first and only National Sport Centre based in Calgary. She is a mother of three children — two beautiful daughters, husband John.

That's the philosophy of the Calgary Booster Club's 43rd Sportsman of the Year, Ted Rhodes.

Rhodes, 70, has been the driving force behind the formation and the subsequent success of disabled skiing programs not only locally, but nationally and internationally as well.

Born in Princeton, B.C., Ted got involved in skiing as a youngster and has maintained his love of the sport throughout his entire life. In 1942 he won the Western Canadian Downhill Race. In 1968 the latest Sportsman moved to Calgary and almost immediately began teaching his first disabled student, a polio victim. The next year he attended a clinic where he learned more about the instruction for disabled skiers.

In 1972 Ted started the Calgary Disabled Learn to Ski Program. Since those days he has held various positions at the local, provincial, national and international levels including:

- Director, Calgary Disabled Learn to Ski School (1972 - present)
- President, Alberta Association of Disabled Skiers (AADS)
- President, Canadian Association of Disabled Skiers (CADS)
- Chef de Mission, Canadian Disabled Ski Team at the World Championships
- Vice-Chairman Disabled Skiing Exhibition (1988 Winter Olympic Games)
- Manager, Canadian Disabled Ski Team (1988 Winter Olympic Games)

Ted has been and is still involved in all aspects of the sport – teaching skiers and instructors, recruiting volunteers, raising awareness, fund raising, expanding programs. One of his current positions is that of Chairman of the National Technical Committee which is developing manuals for Health Canada's "Active Living Through Physical Education: Maximizing Opportunities for Canadian Students With a Disability" initiative. The manual will be used by Physical Education teachers to include disabled students into the regular curriculum.

Over the years his dedication and leadership have earned him numerous awards including: Alberta Achievement Award, AADS Volunteer of the Year, '88 Olympic Games Organizing Committee Volunteer Award, 1989 City of Calgary Volunteer Award, 1992 CADS Volunteer of the Year Award. Later this month (February 21) he will be the recipient of the Rotary Integrity Award.

The retired University of Calgary and Mount Royal College teacher has been married to Hilda for 47 years. They have a son in Penticton, B.C., a daughter in Vienna, Austria, a grandson in Cranbrook, B.C. and a great grandson.

**HENRY VINEY AWARD WINNER***Susan Auch*

Susan Auch enjoyed a noteworthy 1995 season on the international speedskating circuit capturing silver and bronze medals at the World Championships. Her efforts lifted her to the #1 world ranking in the 500 m event; her success earned her recognition as Canada's Female Athlete of the Year and her second Viney Award as the top Female Athlete in Calgary.

An asthmatic, Susan was encouraged to enter the sports world at a young age. The transplanted Winnipegger got her start as a 10 year old with brother Derrick in the short track discipline. She switched to long track competition in 1989 and displayed steady improvement. Her strengths are her rocket launching starts regarded among the best in the world as well as her turns, her aggressiveness and her motivation. The 30 year old has been a perennial Canadian overall sprint cham-

pion the past few years; she holds the Canadian 500 m record (38.94 seconds).

A journalism/broadcasting student at the University of Calgary, Susan is also an animal lover who enjoys the outdoors with her Australian cattle dog and her Appaloosa horse. Her Olympic medal made her an instant celebrity with an extremely busy off-ice schedule of appearances, speaking engagements and even television commercials.

The Calgary Booster Club congratulates Susan Auch, one of the best athletes in the world and an overwhelming media choice as the city's Female Athlete of the Year.

**SCOTT-MAMINI TROPHY WINNER***Don Blair*

University of Calgary football star, Don Blair's incredible exploits earned him the nod as the media's choice for the 1995 Male Athlete of the Year.

The 23 year old was named 1995 CIAU Football Player of the Year and was the winner of the Hec Crighton Trophy as the Most Outstanding Player.

Don has set University of Calgary records for Most Points Scored (102), Most Touchdowns (17), Most Touchdown Passes, Received (15) and Most Yards Received in a single season (1,112).

In 1995, he won the Ted Morris Trophy as the Most Valuable Player in the Vanier Cup, thus becoming the first player to win the Hec Crighton Trophy, MVP of the Vanier Cup game, and earn all-Canadian honours in the same year. He tied a

record for the most points scored (24) and most touchdowns (4) in the Vanier Cup game.

Don's outstanding performance in 1995 earned him appearances in the U.S. East-West Shrine Bowl in Palo Alto, California and Hula Bowl in Honolulu, Hawaii.

In 1995, Peter Connellan completed his 13th season as Head Football Coach at the University of Calgary. During his tenure as Head Coach, the Dinosaurs have never had a losing season, making the playoffs on all but three occasions. He has coached the Dinosaurs to eight Conference titles (1977, 1983, 1984, 1985, 1988, 1992, 1993 and 1995).

Connellan has coached the Dinosaurs to National Championships four times – 1983, 1985, 1988 and 1995. In 1995 they made their fifth appearance in the National Final defeating the University of Western Ontario 54-24.

Under Connellan's direction the Dinosaurs have appeared in seven CIAU Semi-Final Bowl games, winning the Churchill Bowl in 1985, 1988 and 1995, and winning the Atlantic Bowl in 1993. The Dinosaurs lost in the Churchill Bowl in 1977 and 1984 and were Atlantic Bowl Finalists in 1992.

During his tenure as Head Coach, Connellan has won 70 conference games, 32 losses and two ties for a winning percentage of 68% in regular season play.

Connellan has been recognized as CIAU Coach of the Year twice – in 1977 and 1985 winning the Frank Tindall Trophy. He received the Norm Kimball Award as the Alberta Football Coach of the Year in 1984 and was Canada West University Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 1995.

Peter missed the 1991 season on sabbatical leave at which time he observed Calgary Stampeders practices and attended the University of Nebraska.

A respected clinician, Peter has assisted at numerous coaching clinics throughout Alberta at all levels of football.

Peter has been a Guest Coach at the Calgary Stampeders Training Camp on several occasions and was a member of the coaching staff for the 1988 Canadian Football League all-star game.

Connellan is a native of Regina, Saskatchewan. He attended the University of Alberta, graduating with BPE and BEd. He obtained his MSc from the University of Oregon.

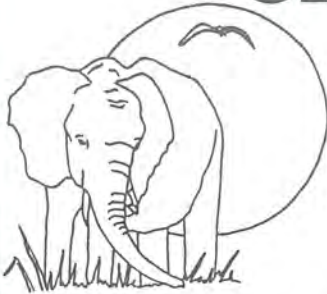

*Nelson "Nellie" Briles*

Nelson "Nellie" Briles is the Director of Corporate Affairs for the Pittsburgh Pirates and the President of the Pittsburgh Pirates Alumni Association, Inc. His duties include administering the daily operations of the Alumni Association as well as representing the Pittsburgh Pirates through public appearances, speeches, serving as Master of Ceremonies, conducting seminars and creating special events with the public in general and the corporate and business community in particular. He also works closely with the Pirates Broadcasting and Regional Sales Departments.

Briles, a native of Chico, CA, signed with St. Louis in September of 1963 after playing baseball for two years at the University of Santa Clara. He spent only one year in the minors (Calgary Cardinals) before becoming a member of the Cardinals staff in 1965. Briles pitched for six seasons in St. Louis (1965-70) and

appeared in two World Series during that period. In 1967 he helped the Cardinals defeat the Boston Red Sox, four games to three, by providing a win in Game #3. Briles won the only game that Bob Gibson didn't in that World Series for the Cards. He led the National League in winning percentage with a 14-5 record and a league leading 2.44 ERA. In 1968 Briles had his best year in the majors, compiling a 19-11 record, and St. Louis went back to the World Series again. This time, however, they lost to the Detroit Tigers, four games to three.

The Pirates acquired Briles prior to the 1971 season along with outfielder Vic Davalillo in exchange for outfielder Matty Alou and pitcher George Brunet. Briles helped the Pirates defeat the Baltimore Orioles in the 1971 World Series by tossing a two-hit shutout in Game #5 facing only 29 batters. He pitched for three years in Pittsburgh (1971-73) before closing out his career with Kansas City (1974-75), Texas (1976-77) and Baltimore (1978). Briles, a righthander, retired from baseball following the 1978 season with a career record of 129-112. Nellie also sang the National Anthem before Game 4 of the 1973 World Series.

Briles started his career in the business world during his playing days. In 1968, he started a video electronics firm called Concord Communications Systems. As owner and president, he developed the St. Louis-based firm from the beginning and brought it to a level of profitability in three years. From 1978 until April of 1984, Briles was general manager of Jones and Brown, Inc., which is a manufacturer and distributor of building and renovation products in Pittsburgh.

Broadcasting has also been a major part of Briles' life since his retirement as a player. In 1979-80 he served as a colour commentator on KDKA-TV's Pirate telecasts. He also worked as a sports reporter and weekend anchor for KDKA in 1971-72 while he was still playing for the Bucs. From 1981-83 Briles teamed with former Pirate announcer Jim Woods on the USA Cable Network's major league game-of-the-week telecasts. In 1984-85 he served as colour analyst for the Seattle Mariners games on KSTV-TV in Tacoma, Wa and in 1988 served as colour commentator for the Buffalo Bisons in Buffalo, NY. Nellie has also appeared on ESPN and KDKA as a freelance broadcaster.

Nellie is Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Pittsburgh Pirates Alumni Association and serves on the Boards of Directors of the Major League Baseball Players Alumni Association, Westmoreland Hospital Foundation and the United Methodist Church Union. Nellie also belongs to the Membership of Adelphi Inc.

Nellie was elected into the University of Santa Clara Hall of Fame in May 1985, the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame, Western Pennsylvania Chapter, in May 1992 and inducted into the Pennsylvania State Sports Hall of Fame in October of 1994.

The 52-year-old Briles has resided in Greensburg, PA since being acquired by the Pirates in 1971. He and his wife Ginger have three daughters, Kelley (age 29), Christina (25) and Sarah (23), and one son David (26).

Dennis Hull will readily admit to not being anything other than Bobby Hull's brother, as long as you add he's the younger brother. And, he's even been known to answer to someone asking for Brett Hull's uncle.

A self-effacing brother and proud uncle, Dennis himself, was known for his powerful shot on net. Bobby once said of his younger brother, "When Dennis is cranked up and lets go, there is no goalie who can stop the shot except by luck and accident."

Dennis began his hockey career with the St. Catherines Black Hawks of the Junior 'A' League where he played from 1961 to 1965. In 1965, he joined the Chicago Black

Hawks of the National Hockey League where he played until 1976. He then spent one year with the Detroit Red Wings before retiring.

During his National Hockey League career, Dennis scored 303 goals and had 351 assists in regular games. In 95 playoff games, he scored 33 goals and 34 assists. Six selections to the All Star team are testament to his hockey skills. His biggest thrill in hockey was the first game he played against his idol, Gordie Howe, but the most significant time in his career came when he was selected to play for the memorable Team Canada of 1972.

Following his hockey career he returned to school and received his degree from Brock University in St. Catherines, Ontario, the scene of his successful junior career with the St. Catherines Black Hawks. He accepted a position with the prestigious Ridley College as a history teacher.

His under-stated after dinner speaking style is fast becoming a trademark and he is one of the most sought after head table guests in the business.

In 1990 the Calgary Booster Club, in association with the Alberta Sport Council, established the Sportsman of the Year Endowment Fund. The interest generated by the Fund is used to provide \$1,000.00 awards to Calgary's finest high performance athletes. The Calgary Booster Club and the Alberta Sport Council recognize and appreciate the commitment and achievements of these athletes and hope the awards help them to attain their goals.

An award is presented in honour of one of the Calgary Booster Club's Sportsman of the Year. The Club considers it a pleasure to have supported the following athletes since 1990:

Since 1954 the annual Sportsmen's Dinner has been dedicated to the person(s) selected Calgary Booster Club Sportsman of the Year. The Sportsman has customarily been one of the city's athletic leaders who have greatly contributed to the local sport scene. To further recognize these outstanding Calgarians, the Booster Club

recently decided to investigate the idea of a permanent pictorial showcase of all Sportsman of the Year honourees.

The Sportsman of the Year Wall was unveiled at Canada Olympic Park Atco V.I.P. Centre on March 25, 1990 and at the time of the unveiling contained the pictures of the Calgary Booster Club's 37 award recipients. As each year's winner is announced their picture will be added to the display.

## *Scott-Mamini Trophy*

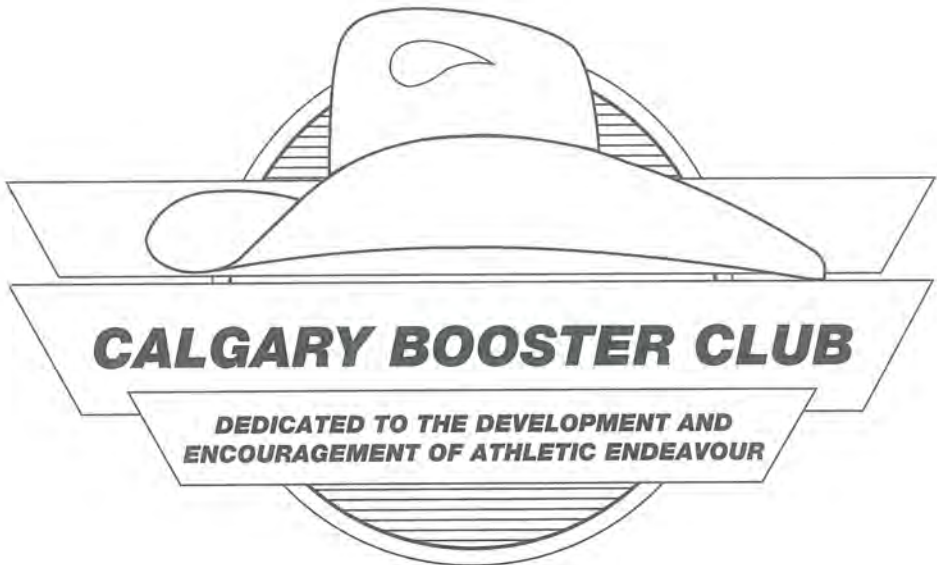
