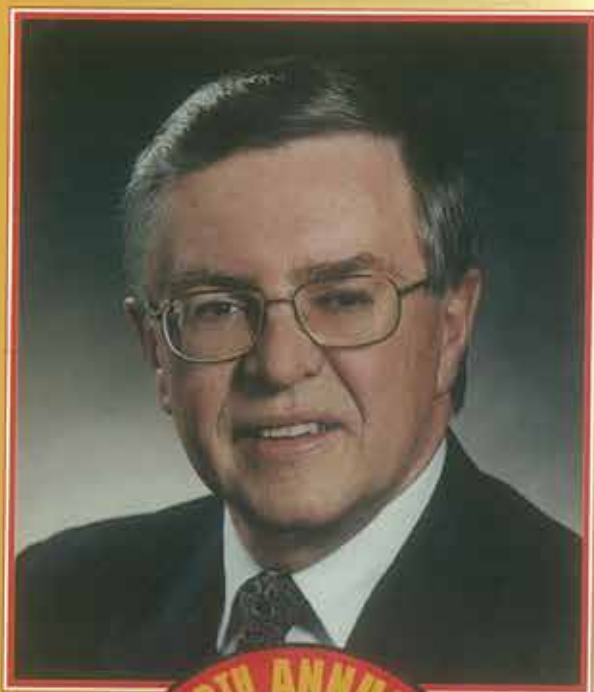

Given the tremendous contribution you have made to amateur sport in Calgary and Canada through volunteer time committed to the 1988 Winter Olympic Games, to the Canadian Olympic Association and the many other sport organizations, as well as your community involvement, this Award could not have been presented to a more deserving individual.

Congratulations



Bill Warren, Q.C. was born in Lacombe, Alberta on March 24, 1939. His parents moved to Calgary when he was seven years old so, all his public education occurred in the city. This Crescent Heights High School graduate participated, for coach, Ken McKenna, in track and field and as a member of the school curling team, going to the Southern Alberta Finals in his graduating year. While completing his Bachelor of Arts and Law degrees at the University of Alberta, it was the intramural and recreational sports scene that consumed his free time.

Like many pre-baby boomers, Bill established himself in business before his marriage to Peggy Graham in 1966. When his first son Robert began to participate in the sports program at Rosedale Community, to be followed by brothers Peter and Jonathan, he also became a participant. Bill's days of coaching hockey and soccer included managing and contributing to the community neighbourhood scene. These activities quite naturally led to a deeper involvement in the administrative side of athletics and recreation. He became the President of the Rosedale Community Association and the Calgary Booster Club, then Chair of Calgary Parks and Recreation and the Calgary Olympic Development Association. Directorships followed with the 1988 Olympic Winter Games Organizing Committee, the Saddledome Foundation, and he is currently on the Executive Committee of the Pan American Society for the 1999 Winnipeg Pan Am Games. He is an Executive Director on the Toronto 2008 Olympic Games Bid Committee, while he fulfills his duties as President of the Canadian Olympic Association.

When talking to Bill about his athletic involvement, it is the relationship with the athletes that gives him his greatest satisfaction whether as a community coach or as attaché to the Canadian 1988 Olympic Winter Games team, or as the Chef de Mission for the 1994 Canadian Olympic Winter Games team. Bill became involved with Bobsleigh Canada when asked by Bob Story to substitute for Cliff Kakish who had been injured in a hang gliding accident. The position became permanent at Cliff's death shortly before the 1988 Olympic Winter Games. This commitment continued at the national and international level until 1994 when he became President of the Canadian Olympic Association.

The naming of the Bill Warren Training Centre in Canmore, Alberta in 1994 is indicative of the esteem the athletic community holds for Bill Warren. It follows a long list of honours in both his professional life as a lawyer and in his avocational life as a sports builder. He is a Queens Counsel, has an Alberta Achievement Award, a 125th Anniversary Commemorative Medal of Canada's Confederation, and is an Honorary Life Director of Bobsleigh Canada, Calgary Olympic Development Association, and the Calgary Booster Club.

It is with great pleasure the Calgary Booster Club welcomes Mr. Bill Warren as the 1999 Sportsman of the Year.

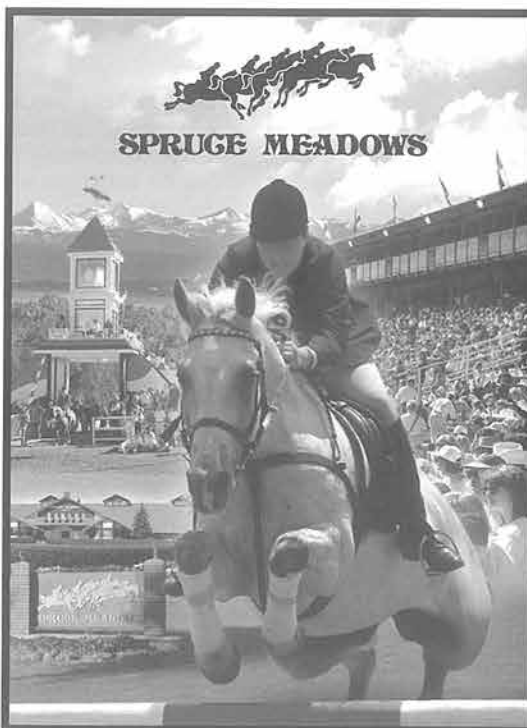
As a final note, I wish to thank each and every director of the Calgary Booster Club whose efforts throughout this year have guided the success of this evenings' events and all Booster Club activities.

**LES GRAMANTI** - ATHLETICS

Coach Gramantik received his education in Romania, gaining his Physical Education and Education and his Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of Bucharest, and his Masters Degree in Coaching Science from the same institution. He also attained a Level 3 Coaching Certification from the Romanian Track and Field Federation, and a National Coaching Certification Program Level 4 in hurdles, sprints, jumps and combined events. This background has taken Les from lecturing and coaching at the Institute of Physical Education at Oracka, Romania, Director of Coaching in Maccabi Hajfa, Israel, to the University of Calgary's Faculty of Kinesiology and the Head Coaching position of track and field. This wealth of knowledge in both theory and practical aspects of coaching track and field led to many appearances at International conferences from Canberra, Australia and Christchurch, New Zealand, to San Jose and Salinas, Puerto Rico.

The Calgary Spartans was his first coaching assignment in Calgary in 1978. The next year he added field events coaching at the University of Calgary, an association that he has maintained till today in his capacity as Head Coach for track and field. He maintains his club coaching duties, now with Calgary Track West since 1988. That same year he has been Coaching Director at the Southern Alberta Track and Field Centre, Calgary.

Les has coached at the Commonwealth Games in Kuala Lumpur in 1998, Victoria in 1994 and at Auckland in 1990. Teams and athletes coached by him have appeared at World Championships in Arrary, France, Goteborg, Sweden and Rome, Italy. Over the past twenty one years in Calgary he has coached at World Junior Championships, Pan American Games, International Combined Events and in 1996 at the Olympic Summer Games in Atlanta, USA. To name a few of his honours he has been Athletics Alberta Coach of the Year three times and twice its High Performance Coach of the Year, C.I.A.U. Coach of the Year in 1991 and the Whittnauer Coaching Excellence Award recipient from the Coaching Association of Canada in 1995 to name a few of his honours. The Calgary Booster Club is very pleased to present Mr. Les Gramantik as an Honoured Athletic Leader for 1999.

DALE HENWOOD - SPORT BUILDER

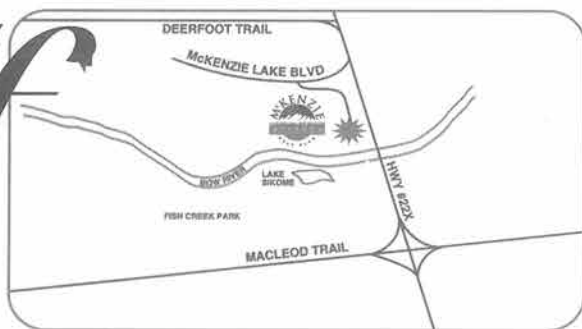
Dale is a University of Alberta graduate with a Bachelor of Physical Education (Hon.) in 1974, Professional Diploma (Education) in 1976 and a Masters of Arts (Physical Education) in 1976. He began his career as a coach in 1976 at Northern Alberta Institute of Technology. He has always coached in the communities in which he has lived first in Edmonton, then Red Deer and presently in the community of MacEwan in Calgary. He became an assistant hockey coach at the University of Calgary in 1980 until 1982 when he joined the National and Olympic Hockey teams as an Assistant Coach until 1992. He has a Level 5 Practical in hockey and a Level 3 in Theory of the National Coaching Certification Program. He has been a NCCP course conductor for nineteen years. His movement towards administration began back in 1980 with

Alberta Hockey and in his volunteer work as a mission staff person for the Alberta Team at the 1983 Canada Winter Games. Dale has been a member of Hockey Canada Technical Committee for nine years and the Chair of the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association Coaching Committee for five years. **DR. ROGER C. JACKSON, OC, PhD, DSc. - SPORTS BUILDER**

It is just a guess but the Order of Canada and the Olympic Gold Medal in Rowing would be two of the most cherished awards that Roger Jackson has received. This three time Olympic Games competitor in Tokyo 1964, Mexico 1968 and Munich in 1972, as well as two World Championships, was also the Lou Marsh Trophy co-winner as Canada's Outstanding 1964 Athlete. Roger gained his Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of Western Ontario, his Masters from the University of British Columbia and his PhD in Biodynamics from the University of Wisconsin. He did post graduate research and taught at the University of Copenhagen, Denmark while he continued his competitive rowing career at the International level. It is no wonder that he is a member of Canada's Sports Hall of Fame as well as the Olympic

Hall of Fame. He has also received the Vanier Award as an 'Outstanding Young Canadian', was made an Officer of the Order of Canada in 1985 and received an Honourary Doctor of Science from the University of New Brunswick. He has been selected as Canada's Sports Volunteer, and has been given the Canadian Olympic Order and the Olympic Order of the International Olympic Committee. Since his days as a competitor Dr. Jackson has been deeply involved in athletics, first as Technical Director then Director of Sports Canada, the Federal Government Sports Program from 1971 to 1978. He became Dean of Physical Education at the University of Calgary from 1978 to 1988 and is now Director of the Sports Medicine Department at the University of Calgary. One of the four original members of the Calgary Olympic Bid Committee he also served on the Board and Executive of the XV Olympic Winter Games Organizing Committee. He was elected President of the Canadian Olympic Association in 1982 and re-elected in 1985 and 1989, resigning in 1990. He is currently a member of the International Olympic Commission that assists cities to organize Olympic Winter Games as well as being the Technical Commission Chair and Executive committee member for the Pan American Games Sport Organization. He was also Chair of the Organizing Committee for several World Speed Skating Championships. But perhaps his most lasting efforts in sport will be the development of the sport leadership and the sport medicine training programs that are taught around the world while he serves as the educational expert for the International Olympic Committee. He was named Development Coach of the Year by Athletic's Alberta in 1995 and reprised his role in organizing with the Organizing Committee of The World Police and Fire Games last year. He began a new running program for teens, Tuesday Night at Lindsay Park Sports Centre', because he wanted to. From a ten year competitive career highlighted by the competitive experience of the 1973 Canada Games, to the Presidency of the Calgary Track Council, (whose logo is a pair of hands exchanging a baton, an excellent symbol of cooperation through competition) Ed has tried to fulfill those ideals formed at the Olympic Academy of Canada.

Ed is fortunate to work as a computer programmer at Canadian Hunter Exploration Limited, a company that supports and encourages employees to volunteer in the community. Later after his high school graduation and as a member of the Royal Canadian Air Force, he captained a team that placed second in an Allied Armed Forces Ski Competition in France during the 1950's. As Ski School Director in Wentworth, Nova Scotia, he raced and coached the Nova Scotia team at the first Canada Winter Games at Quebec City in 1967. The following year he was appointed Ski School Director at Happy Valley in Calgary. He became Coordinator of Leadership Development in 1980 to begin to develop instructors for the Calgary Disabled Ski School. It was while working in Edmonton that Bob became

involved with the Mentally Challenged Student at the Edmonton Ski Club's Learn to Ski Program. Since those days he has had a continuing association with Disabled Skiing. In 1984 he co-produced a movie "Skiing with a Difference" a technical movie used to teach people with various disabilities to ski. He is presently the Ski School Director of the Calgary Disabled Ski School.

On the provincial level Bob has served on the Board of Directors for the Alberta Association of Disabled Skiers, has been the Alpine and Technical representative, served four years as President, managed the Alberta Disabled Ski Team for several years and was a member of the Calgary Olympic Committee for the Disabled Ski Exhibition Races. He is a twenty-five year member of the Canadian Ski Instructors Alliance, a Level 3 Instructor, a level 2 Coach and a member of the Canadian Federation of Ski Coaches. In the World Cup standings, she is first in the 500 meters, 3rd in the 1000 meters, the 500 meter world record holder at 0:37.55. She was the 1998 Olympic Winter Games Gold medal event winner and also won a Bronze Medal in the 1000 meter event. She is the 1998 World Sprint Champion for the 500 meter and 1000 meter events. Her best times to date are 1:15.26 in the 1000 meters, 0:37.55 in the 500 meters and 1:57.87 in the 1500 meters, all Canadian records. She has recently won two Gold Medals in the 1999 World Sprint Championships and was overall Silver Medallist.

As a 12 year veteran on the Canadian Speed Skating team, Catriona seems to be only hitting her stride as an athlete. Looking forward to more years as an international competitor she has begun to diversify her participation in sport. While earlier on in her athletic career she competed in track at the Canada Games, her extra curricular competition has slowed down somewhat, as she is now an avid golfer. She now spends much of her free time trying to lower her handicap while she and her husband Bart are frequent visitors on local courses. This Saskatoon native now makes Calgary home while she studies Sociology at the University of Calgary. Jeff Garcia



The Calgary media has honoured Jeff Garcia by naming him Calgary Male Athlete of the year. He led the Calgary Stampeders to a 26-24 victory over the Hamilton Tiger-Cats in the November 26, 1998 Grey Cup. He was named Most Valuable Player of the 86th Grey Cup, a fitting finale to a five year career as a Stampeder. As of this date, he is the team's leader in passing completions, with a 61.7 percent average, he is second in all-time career pass completions and third in all-time passing yards. He is only 292 yards shy of Peter Liske's second place position and 282 yards ahead of Jerry Keeling in fourth place. This is an excellent record with the Stampeders when one realizes that in 1994, his first year as a professional, he was activated and played in only two games. He rushed for 2 yards and passed for 17 yards on two completions out of three attempts, a 66.7 average and indicative

of what was to come. Jeff entered into the Calgary community with gusto, much like his playing style. He was very active in the off season with many of the local charities such as Connection Housing, the Corporate Challenge and the Canadian Liver Foundation. In 1998 he was co-spokesperson for the Serval High School Football program and opened his own Mexican Restaurant 'Garcia's.'

Jeff was born in Gilroy, California on February 24, 1970. He attended San Jose State University, a college up the road from Gilroy, on the way to San Francisco. While at San Jose he was a United Press Honourable All-American and a pre-season All-American in his final year 1993.

Jeff had his first professional starting game on August 26, 1995 leading the Stampeders in a 27-14 victory over the Birmingham Barracudas. He became a free agent in February 1999 and has signed a contract with the San Francisco 49ers. Calgary wishes him well in his new endeavors with the National Football League and will remember him fondly for all the excitement he provided while playing with the Calgary Stampeders. Congratulations Jeff on your selection by the Calgary media as their 42nd Scott-Mamini Award recipient.

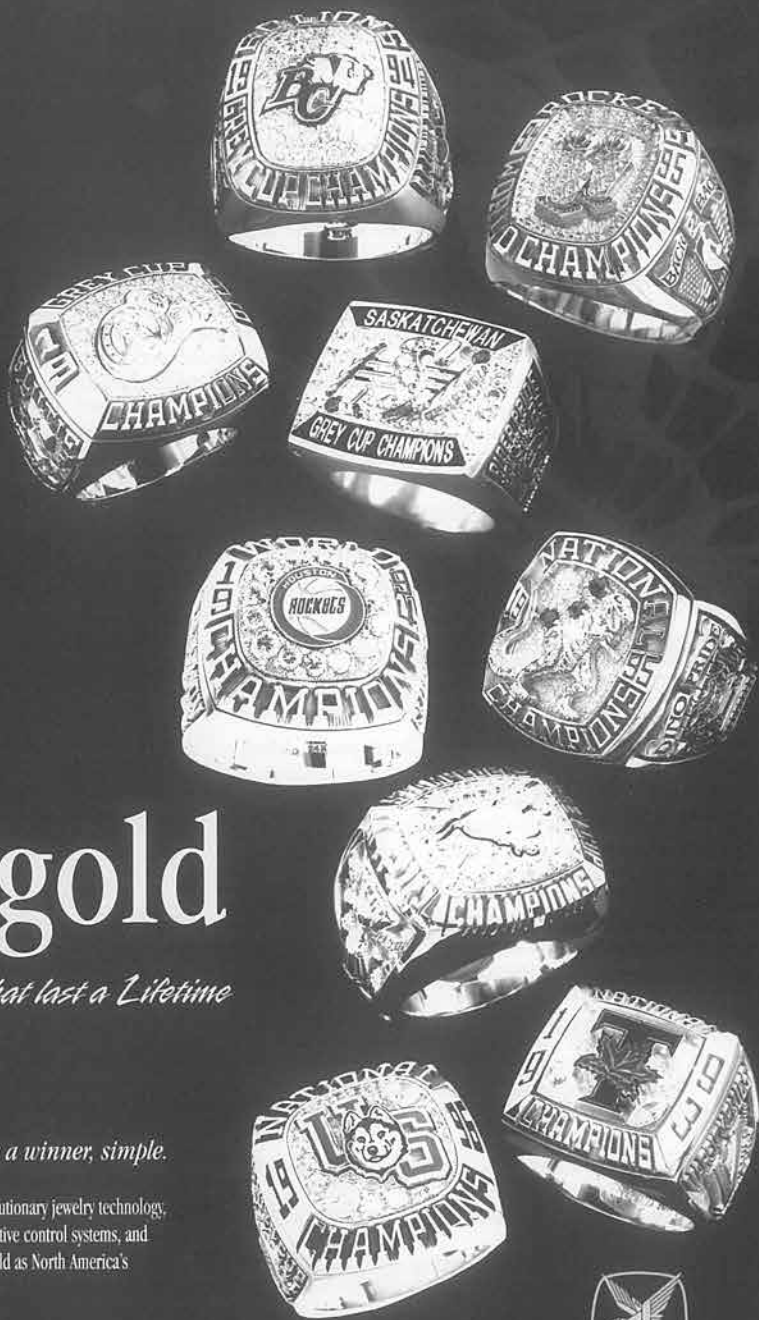

Sports Wall of Fame

In 1984, the Calgary Booster Club approved the concept of a permanent display of recognition for its leadership and athletic award winners. After reviewing potential locations and arranging the necessary funds, an agreement was reached between the Club and the Board of Directors of

Lindsay Park Sports Centre to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility.

The Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame was opened to the public on December 9, 1987. As each year's group of award recipients is announced, their names will be added to the display providing a complete history of the best in Calgary athletes.

Sportsman's Wall

Since 1954, the annual Sportsmen's Dinner has been dedicated to the person(s) selected Calgary Booster Club Sportsman of the Year. The Sportsman has customarily been one of the city's athletic leaders who have greatly contributed to the local sport scene. To further recognize these outstanding Calgarians, the Booster Club

maintains a permanent pictorial showcase of all Sportsman of the Year honourees.

The Sportsman of the Year Wall was unveiled at Canada Olympic Park Atco V.I.P. Centre on March 25, 1990 and at the time of the unveiling contained the pictures of the Calgary Booster Club's 45 award recipients. As each year's winner is announced, their picture is added to the display.

The award, named in honour of Henry Viney the long-time Sports Director of CFCN Radio-Television, was established in 1987 by the Calgary Sports Media Club. Scott-Mamini Award

The Scott-Mamini Award, initiated by the Calgary Press-Radio-TV Sports Club in 1958, was presented annually to the city's Athlete of the Year as chosen by the media. That format continued until 1987 when the Scott-Mamini became the Male Athlete of the Year recognition. It is named for Harry Scott, Sports Editor at the Calgary Albertan and Bob Mamini, the Sports Department Head at the Calgary Herald. Both men were highly respected across the country during the 1930's and 1940's.
