

# John Semkuley



In 1977, John became the Secretary Treasurer of the Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association – a unique association of the Calgary Board of Education and the Calgary Catholic Board of Education's interscholastic athletic programs. This association that is the envy of school districts across the nation. It was an additional, and time consuming position to his main day job as Specialist of Athletics with the Calgary Board of Education Physical Education Department. He was also a very dedicated representative for this association at the Provincial and National level. Like his predecessors, John Mayell and Ward Steckle, John is someone who made a difference in the role that athletics plays in our community. He was also a


Director of the Calgary Booster Club and Lindsay Park Sports Centre, President of the Alberta Health and Physical Education Council, a designated delegate to the Alberta Schools' Athletic Association and the Western Canadian Physical Education Supervisors and Consultants Association, and the Canadian Federation of High School Athletic Associations. In addition John volunteered for many community activities and organizations. His leadership and inspiration were indeed invaluable.

A native Calgarian and a product of the education system he eventually served for thirty-six years, John attended Alexandra Elementary School, Stanley Jones Junior High School and Crescent Heights High School. He obtained a Bachelor of Education degree from the University of Alberta in 1956, a Masters of Science degree from the University of Oregon in 1961, and in 1983 completed all the required graduate course work in a Master of Administrative Studies at the University of Calgary. He taught at Viscount Bennett High School, Henry Wise Wood High School, Lord Beaverbrook High School and Ernest Manning High School. His experience with the instructional program in Alberta has been as a student and then as a teacher of English, Social Studies, Health, Physical Education, Music, Guidance, then finally as an administrator with the Calgary Board of Education. While he has coached a variety of athletics, his area of expertise became football which became his favourite extracurricular activity.

It is sometimes easy to overlook the contributions someone like Mr. Semkuley makes in the community because of his chosen career. He has coached in the Junior Prairie Football League with the Calgary Colts, worked for a combined 25 years as assistant timekeeper, then as official scorer and scoreboard operator and head timer and chief of the timing crew at Stampeder football games, track and field Equipment Manager for The World Police and Fireman Games, coach for a Calgary General Hospital team in the Senior Women's Basketball League and Little League Baseball coach being some of the activities that took up his spare time.

John is very close to Jean, his wife of 41 years, his three sons, two daughter-in-laws, five grandchildren and many members of the immediate expanded family. Like most grandfathers, he delights in his opportunities to enjoy play and funtime with his grandchildren.

#### Here is Jody's bio in her own words:

"I got hooked on sports very young, much to the chagrin of my "non-sports-enthusiast" Mother who battled to get me to wear skirts (it's an ongoing battle). My Dad loved it, well, because I spent every other weekend with him. He was head of the P.E. Department at Vancouver's largest High School, meaning, every-other-weekend was another sporting event! I learned early that knowing the rules made a big difference in the fun to be had on the field, ice, court, mat, pool, or pitch.

The Gods of Sport smiled down on me one day four years ago, when Steve Wyatt and Barry Houlihan called me from BCTV for 'my shot.' They put me on the air cold and I went for it. I'll never forget, it was Friday September 13th - night of a lunar eclipse no less. I am not sure if that matters but it was the scariest night of my life. I remember thinking 'I can't feel my hands as I sat on set and watched the clock countdown from 30 seconds. After my 8 minutes of live TV, I was numb. I got into my car and drove home thinking 'I can die now!' Some kids dream of being an astronaut, others a ballerina, or a movie star. I always wanted to be a sportscaster on TV and now I had done it. There's nothing like that feeling ... except having someone ask you to do it again, and again.

When Scott Moore at CTV Sportsnet brought me out to be the first woman on the desk at Sportscentral it was the icing on the cake. To be in such company as these great people is more than I had dreamt of. To have a national show like Sportscentral AM was a great opportunity and moving to the Evening edition was beyond what my imagination allowed me to hope for. I really am a girl living a dream.

Most often asked question: What's it like being a woman in sports?

Answer: I've never been a man in sports, so I have to say being a woman is just fine, thanks."

#### JOHN H. CASSELS: Alpine Skiing

John is the type of volunteer that all amateur athletic organizations should have on their executive. Not only does he understand the need for a sound financial plan to be successful, he has the ability to make it so. A member of Alpine Alberta from 1985 to 1991 John was responsible for the short and long term financial planning and fundraising. He served as Vice Chairman of Administration and Finance from 1989 to 1991. John was a member of the Race Organization Committee for Alpine events during the 1988 Winter Olympic Games. He then became Chairman of the Canadian Alpine Ski Championships in 1990 and 1991.


A founding member of the Alberta Ski Foundation, John's leadership helped to eliminate the deficit of the Lake Louise Alpine World Cup Ski Race Committee. In 1994, he became the Chairman of the "Lake Louise Winterstart World Cup" Race Organizing Committee, a position he held for seven years. While his volunteer time is now spent at the international ski scene, it wasn't always so as John's interest in ski racing began when he competed for Bishop's University. Over the years, this involvement has progressed through the different levels of competition until today where he represents Canada at Federation International de Ski meetings. The 300 volunteers who assist John in annually producing these World Cup Races at Lake Louise are proud of the benefits these competitions provide young Canadian athletes at all levels. "We do it for the kids." The Calgary Booster Club is pleased to welcome John H. Cassells as an Honoured Athletic Leader in the year 2001.



#### GERRI (GERALDINE) PAULINE DORNSTAUDER: Softball

It was in 1974 that Gerri began her long association with the Calgary Minor Softball Association. During the intervening years, she has served as Registrar, Secretary, League Director and Vice President for the association. The co-ordination of the Mite program in 1982 was a result of the assistance she had given to a number of city communities in their start-up softball programs. She was her own community summer sports' co-ordinator while also organizing and conducting coaching and player clinics, competition schedules and city playoffs. Gerri has also been involved with the Alberta Amateur Softball

Association as the District 3 Assistant organizer, Co-ordinator for Alberta Summer Games and evaluated players for the Western Canada and Canada Summer Games. She has worked for the 1987 Canadian Senior Men's Softball Championships, the 1997 World Police and Fire Games and the 1997 Canadian Junior A Women's Championship. A recipient of the Government of Canada Certificate of Merit in recognition of her outstanding contribution to her community, Gerri has received many merit awards from Softball Alberta, Softball Calgary and Softball Canada. In 1995 when the Calgary Women's Fastpitch Association was facing dissolution, Gerri helped to rebuild the organization to the stage where now there are 24 teams competing and international and national events are being hosted by the association. The Association's Special Events Committee hosted the 1998 Friendship Tour and the 1999 Softball Canada Senior/Junior Women's selection and training camps. Under Gerri's direction, all the background organization was provided for the coaches to assess athletes and select the personnel for the Pan American and Olympic Teams. The Calgary Booster Club is fortunate to add the name of this consummate volunteer, Geraldine Pauline Dornstauder, to the 2001 list of Honoured Athletic Leaders.

#### DIANE JONES KONIHOWSKI: Sports Builder

Diane was nominated as one of the "Most Influential Women in Sport for 2000" by the Canadian Association for the Advancement of Women in Sport. This is a very fitting accolade to someone, who throughout her adult life, has strived to represent herself, her family, fellow athletes and her nation in a most honourable and ethical manner. Diane spent sixteen years on the Canadian National Track and Field Team, a member of three Canadian Olympic Game Teams and the winner of over 60 National Championship titles in pentathlon, high jump, long jump and hurdles. She was also a Gold Medallist in the 1978 Commonwealth Games, the 1975 and 1979 Pan American Games,

and in 1975 and 1978, number 1 in the world in the very difficult discipline of Pentathlon. Diane was named "Female Athlete of the Year" in 1975 and 1978, to the Order of Canada in 1978, Chatelaine Magazine's first "Woman of the Year" in 1979 and the YWCA "Woman of Distinction Sport & Recreation" in 1988. On the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Confederation of Canada in 1992, she was given a Commemorative Medal, the Great Canadian Award in 1993 and was inducted into the Canadian Olympic Sports Hall of Fame in 1996. Being recognized by her home province and city by becoming a member of the Sports Hall of Fame of Saskatchewan (1980) and the City of Saskatoon Sports Hall of Fame must hold a special position in her heart. Her counselling of athletes in marketing skills has helped many athletes secure financial assistance. The Youth Education through Sport Program and The Power of Excellence Programs she developed assisted many national team athletes in public speaking skills and provided opportunities for them to speak in Alberta schools where thousands of young people were inspired. Diane has been a strong advocate of the ethical pursuit of excellence through her work with Fair Play Canada and the Centre for Ethics in Sport. Diane, as Chef de Mission of the 2000 Canadian Olympic Team, was instrumental in organizing one of the most operationally successful and efficient Games Missions in the history of the Canadian Olympic Association. These few words only begin to touch on her contributions to sports in Canada and to the athletes who participate in the world of competition. The Calgary Booster Club is proud to include Diane Jones Konihowski CM to the list of 2001 Honoured Athletic Leaders.

#### THERESA HELEN MAXWELL: Women's Sports

When Theresa became the first woman to be President of the Canadian Volleyball Association, it was the continuation of a practice of meeting challenges up front and winning the respect of all involved. Her influential style of leadership had a positive impact on many decisions made by the organization nationally and in some instances internationally. Her involvement with sport began in Taber, Alberta where she led her high school basketball team to the provincial championships in 1961 – an effort that was repeated when as captain of the University of Calgary Women's Basketball team that won the 1966 Western Canadian Intercollegiate Championship. As a volleyball

player, Theresa competed at the varsity and national level playing for Canada at the 1971 Olympic Qualifying Championships. She began her teaching and coaching careers with the Calgary Separate School Board in 1966 and moved to the University of Calgary as Basketball Coach in 1969. She obtained her Masters of Science in Physical Education from the University of Oregon in 1972 and was named Women's Athletic Director for the University of Calgary in 1972. Theresa participated in elite level volleyball until she began coaching at the same level of competition and she decided to stick to the coaching and administrative end of the game. More and more she devoted her efforts towards administration with volleyball provincially and then at the national level becoming Vice-President of the Canadian Volleyball Association in 1989 to 1991, then President from 1991 to 1995. Her job as Associate Professor in the Faculty of Kinesiology at the University of Calgary did not prevent Theresa from doing award winning sport motivation videos, coaching community soccer, volleyball and basketball, while serving on community foundation funding boards, or attending her children's sports competitions, or being a colour commentator at Varsity and Elite volleyball competitions. The Calgary Booster Club is very pleased to include the name Theresa Helen Maxwell on the roll call of Honoured Athletic Leaders in 2001.



#### JACK NEUMANN: Sports Information

In the world of sport there are many people who work quietly in the background serving athletes. One such position is the Sports Information Director, the person who provides the detailed background information on the team, the athlete, the coach, the organization and the myriad of other tidbits of information that seems to be required by the media. Jack's community involvement began with the Calgary Minor Hockey Association as a coach and manager in the winter, while his summers were spent in media relations with Little League Baseball. This led him into this field of endeavour where he cut his teeth in media relations with the Alberta Junior Hockey League. Jack became the

Sports Information Director at the University of Calgary in 1978, a position he holds today. He is a founding member of the Association of Canadian University Sports Information Directors, becoming Vice-President in 1981 and President in 1983. To date, he is the only Canadian to be appointed to the Board of College Sports Information Directors of America, where he served a three year term. He presented research papers at this organization's workshops and has also conducted panel discussions during these same workshops. As a member of the Calgary Olympic Hockey Committee he was involved with media promotion for the years 1984, 1988 and 1992 with the Canadian Olympic Hockey Team. #### GREG RYAN: Coaching Volleyball

Was it the innocent beginnings participating in the interscholastic volleyball program at Bishop Carroll High School in the early 1970's that stirred the desire that led to a very successful career as a coach? Only Greg would know the answer to that question but let the record show that indeed a coach was the result of his interscholastic athletic involvement. He participated as a member of the 1978 CIAU Silver Medal team while playing for the University of Calgary Men's Volleyball Team. His teaching career with the Calgary Board of Education continued along with his coaching career at the university,

first as assistant with the women's varsity team and then as the Head Coach of the Women's Volleyball Team. In 1986, Greg was appointed the Head Coach of the University of Calgary Men's Volleyball team a position he retains to this day. At the university he has been Coordinator of the Summer Youth Sports Camps and Men's Athletic Co-ordinator. His expertise in volleyball has led him to become a presenter at coaching symposiums at the local, provincial, national and international levels. His scholarly papers have appeared in technical manuals, coaching publications and at presentations for the National Coaching Certification Association's Level IV coaching clinics. He has been Chairman of the Canadian Volleyball Association's National Championship Committee, the University of Calgary Hall of Fame Committee, Husky Dino Cup Committee, Alberta Volleyball Association's Player Development Committee, and the CIAU Men's Volleyball Championship's Technical Committee. He has been on the coaching staff for three World University Games Teams: Zagreb, Yugoslavia; Sheffield, England; and Sicily, Italy. Greg still works both with the developing athlete at the club level, as well as the developing level coaches. It is with great pleasure that the Calgary Booster Club adds the name Greg Ryan to the list of the 2001 Honoured Athletic Leaders.



#### ALAN (Al) TAYLOR: Basketball/Volleyball

It was in 1977 that Al Taylor, together with Al James and Myrna Empey, formed the Calgary Volleyball Club. It was a busy time for this Physical Education teacher during this period of his life, as he was also a member of Canada's National Men's Volleyball Team and its Captain from 1974 to 1978. He was an assistant coach in his final year as a member of the national team in 1981/82. In the summer he acted as Director of a camp for underprivileged youth called Kamp Kiwanis which was sponsored and operated by the Downtown Kiwanis Club, and he continued in this role until 1984. His tenure with the Calgary

Board of Education placed him at Dr. E. P. Scarlett High School and Sir Winston Churchill High School. His extra-curricular activities were in track and field, volleyball and basketball. He has served as co-commissioner for volleyball with the Alberta Schools' Athletic Association these past six years. His community involvement was with the Dinos Club teams coaching both girl and boy teams during the competitive season and at their summer camps for four years. He was Head Volleyball Coach at the World Student Games in Zagreb, Yugoslavia and Head Coach of the FISU Games Team for four years ending in 1986. Welcome Al, as the name Alan Taylor is added to the 2001 Honoured Athletic Leaders List of the Calgary Booster Club.





# HENRY VINEY TROPHY WINNER Catriona Le May Doan



Twenty-one years ago when Catriona began skating with the Saskatoon Lions Club did she visualize herself an Olympic Gold Medal Champion?... a World record Holder in the 500 meters at 37.29 seconds? Her elite athletic career began at the 1983 Canada Winter Games with a bronze medal in Short Track. She has been a member of Speed Skating Canada's Long Track National Team for twelve years and is the current Canadian Sprint Champion. She won nine out of ten 500m World Cup races this past competitive season, breaking her world record time twice in the process. Her standing was third overall at World Sprint Championships this past year. Catriona set doable objectives for herself and for the coming year; she wants to reprise her 1998 World Sprint Championship and defend her 1998 Olympic Gold

Medal at the Salt Lake City Winter Olympics in 2002.

How Catriona visualized herself those many years ago is now a moot point, but a glance at her results over the intervening years indicates a determined progress towards her present status. Her interest in sport is varied and as a young person she participated in community and school athletics until sprint racing dominated her available time. Now an avid golfer, along with her husband Bart they are frequent visitors at the local courses during the offseason. She makes Calgary her home as she trains year round at Olympic Speed Skating Oval with coaches Sean Ireland and Derrick Auch. Catriona has become an effective motivational speaker, as have many of the Elite Athletes at the National Sports Centre, challenging her audiences to achieve their potential in both official languages. Congratulations Catriona on becoming the second woman to be a three-time recipient of the Henry Viney Award Trophy as Calgary Female Athlete of the Year.

### Dave Dickenson



In 2000 Dave was named the Canadian Football League's "Most Outstanding Player", the fifth Stampeder player to be so named. In addition, he became the seventh Stampeder Quarterback to join players Joe Kapp, Eagle Day, Peter Liske, Rick Johnson, Doug Flutie and Jeff Garcia as the team's "Most Outstanding Player". Citations like this have followed Dave since he began to play football at the University of Montana, where in 1995 he was named to the Walter Payton Award as Outstanding Player in Division 1-AA of the NCAA. Last year was Dave's 6th season with the Stampeders becoming a Western Canadian All-Star as well as Canadian All-Star for the first time in his career. His teammates voted him the President's Ring Award while the Calgary fans selected him to the Keith Spaith Memorial Award.

He also set a new passing efficiency rating of 114.1 this past year. Another first for Dave was the first professional touchdown pass he received. Later in the season he threw six touchdowns passes in one game to again join Liske, Flutie and Garcia on this club's record page. Dave is a very determined player and can overcome adversity as he displayed in the 1999 Grey Cup game, passing for 321 yards in 24/38 attempts while performing with a broken clavicle and separated shoulder. The University of Montana retired his jersey number 15 in recognition of the 1995 Division 1-AA Championship, two Big Sky Conference Championships, 26 school records, seven league records, and three NCAA 1AA records. Dave is also a three time Division 1 GTE Academic All-American with a 3.84 GPA in Molecular Biology/Pre-Medicine studies. Congratulations Dave in continuing the tradition of ten former Stampeders in becoming a worthy recipient of the Scott-Mamini Award as Calgary Male Athlete of the Year.


