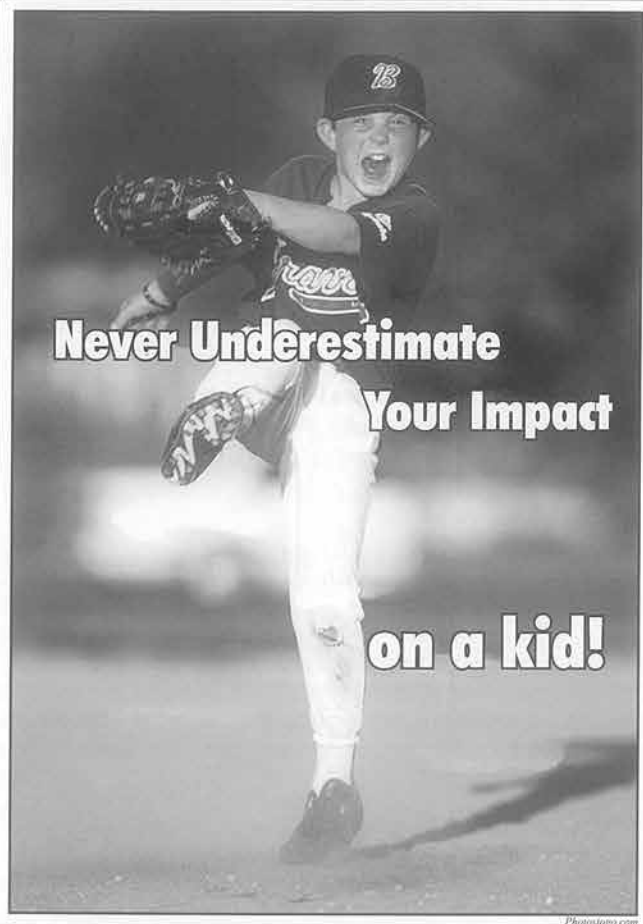

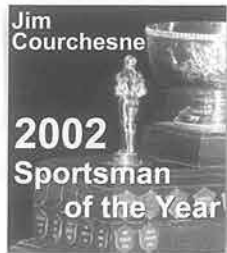

Jim Courchesne is that prototype volunteer in Calgary, having been involved in local community development ever since he himself was a participant in the Hillhurst Sunnyside and West Hillhurst sports programs. A native Calgarian, Jim attended Connaught and then Briar Hill Elementary School matriculating from Queen Elizabeth Junior and Senior High School. He then graduated from Mount Royal College in Business Administration. During this period of his life, Jim played hockey for the community teams in West Hillhurst and Hillhurst Sunnyside ending his playing days at the Junior "B" level. He also played high school football and with the Junior Wranglers coached by Eric Bishop. Jim still plays hockey on the Varsity Velocity old-timers hockey team and tries to stay in shape during the off season roller-blading and biking on the city pathways.

While still an active participant in sports, his coaching career began with the minor hockey teams in Hillhurst Sunnyside and eventually in the Calgary Buffalo league. This involvement deepened after his marriage and the family's move to the Varsity community. He was a member of the original Board of Directors that raised the dollars for their community building and set down the guidelines for the Varsity Community Association. His association continues to this day through all the different committee and community boards. He is currently the Varsity representative and President of the Board of Directors for the Crowchild Twin Arena. Being an original board member, he was involved in fund raising and the construction of the Crowchild Twin Arena. In 1962 Jim learned he would enjoy coaching when he found he could demonstrate skills to young Bantam football players and they were receptive to his approach. His confidence improved with each "Gee, thanks coach." and since that year Jim went on to coach Bantam Football for 12 years, community hockey for 18 years and lacrosse for 18 years. Jim is now the Vice-President of the Calgary Bantam Football Association and helps the league Commissioner with selected duties.

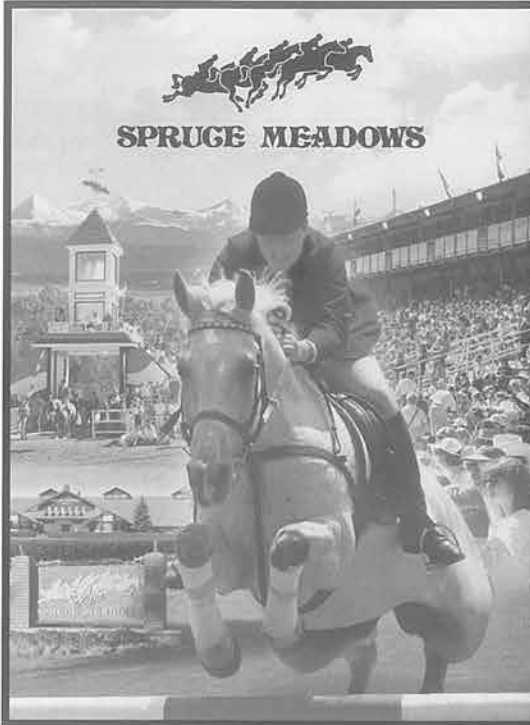
He became a Level IV National Coach Certification Program Coach and Instructor in hockey, specializing in goaltending. He developed the skills competition for the all stars at The Mac's Tournament. He established a hockey school in the northwest with help from instructors in the AA NW Buffalos. The school is now known as the Crowchild Hockey School. In 1983 Jim and Al Coates developed a Pee-Wee team to represent Calgary at the world famous Quebec "America Cup".

The Varsity Lacrosse program has evolved from Pee-Wee level through to Midget level morphing into The Crowchild Lacrosse Association to finally become the Northwest Lacrosse Association which now provides competition at all age levels. With the assistance of many others, Jim helped develop a coaching manual for the Calgary District Lacrosse Association. He was chairman of the 1990 Canada Day Lacrosse Tournament that hosted 87 teams from across the country. He has been a clinic instructor for certification of coaches in Calgary, Red Deer and Edmonton in addition to attendance at national meetings with representatives and the Technical Directors for lacrosse and football.

Of all the awards for hockey, lacrosse, football and community involvement, it is the Jimmy Condon Award he received in 1981 that gives him the most pleasure. The Jimmy Condon Award is presented each year to the Minor Hockey team that displays the best combination of sportsmanship and education using a formula of school grades and fewest penalties. Jim's resume of coaching, program development, directorships, tournament coordinator or chairman is extensive and is totally devoted to the realm of minor amateur sport.

His wife Wendy has supported and been as involved as Jim in their community of Varsity. He feels that any recognition that comes his way is shared with her, their three sons, two daughters and all the members of the immediate extended family especially their seven grandchildren.

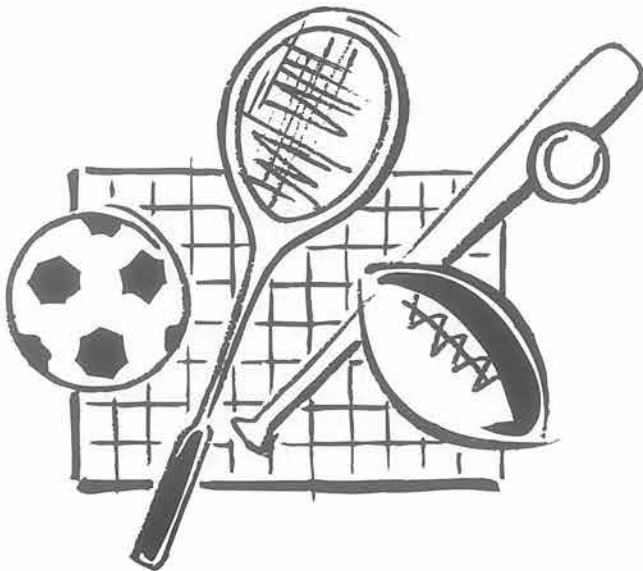

**DON BUCHIGNANI: Swimming**

(Note: Don's award was deferred from 2001 at Don's request because he was in China at the time of presentation.)

Don is a native of Trail, B.C. where he was educated and played his community hockey and baseball. He graduated from St. Francis Xavier University in Nova Scotia with a Bachelor of Science degree and a Masters of Education from Gonzaga University in Washington. He taught with the Calgary Catholic Board of Education for 34 years, ending his teaching career as Principal of Saint Francis High School.

He coached hockey, basketball, and track and field in the Junior High Schools athletic program and was swim coach while at Saint Francis High School. It was his children who got him involved in swimming first as a volunteer and then as an official and administrator. He is a board member of the University of Calgary Swim Club and presently is the Manager of the National Swim Centre at the University of Calgary. He is currently the Vice-Chair of Swim Alberta and serves on many national committees for swimming. As an official, Don has worked every position during meets and works every level of meet he is asked be it local, provincial or national. He has been Team Manager at the Barcelona Summer Olympic Games in 1992 and the World Cup Games in Australia in 2000. He was a Past President of the Lindsay Park Society, the governing body for the Lindsay Park Sports Centre. Currently Don is the President of the Calgary Booster Club. His wife Margaret Ann, three daughters and two grandchildren are very supportive of Don's volunteer activities. The Calgary Booster Club is very pleased to add the name of Don Buchignani to its 2002 list of Honoured Athletic Leaders.

**AL COOPER: Football**

Al was the instigator and visionary leader in the development of the Pee Wee Football League and its offshoot Atom Football in Calgary and area. Seven years ago Al and George Hansen began the Stampeder Alumni Football Clinic for players entering the Pee Wee and Bantam programs in the city. This commitment has over the years raised over \$20,000 for the Alberta Children's Hospital and an additional \$11,000 was raised during the Pass, Run, and Kick competition during the 2000 Grey Cup celebration. He has coached Bantam football for the past 19 years after coaching in the Calgary Senior High School Athletic

Association. His coaching successes have included city and provincial championships and last year Al coached an All Star Bantam team at a competition in St. Louis, Missouri. Throughout his coaching career, Al has instilled a sense of community commitment and the life skills of preparation, determination and teamwork to the players on his teams. Ron Logan, President of the Calgary Bantam Football Association, says he "...feels very fortunate to have a person like Al Cooper working with our young players". The Calgary Booster Club is also fortunate to include the name Al Cooper to the 2002 list of Honoured Athletic Leaders.

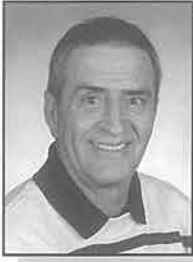

**BRIAN ELLIS: Soccer**

Before his immigration to Canada and Calgary, Brian had the opportunity to train with the Southampton Premiership Club as a fifteen year old and went on to play top level amateur football in Europe. In Calgary he has played for the Rangers and Danish-Canadian Club for 13 years. He has also coached in the Calgary Minor Soccer Association for eighteen years and he has coached at all age group levels including select and all-star teams in Calgary and the province. He has been one of the coaches for the Provincial teams at Western Canada Summer Games. While soccer seems to be Brian's

choice of volunteerism, in reality he has been a Cub and Scout leader, a hockey coach and a community volunteer. He has served as administrator and volunteer official for the soccer community in Calgary. During his tenure as Assistant and then Head coach at Mount Royal College, he entered into and assisted in many of the Athletic department's activities, most notably being the coordinator of hospitality at the CCAA Women's Basketball Nationals. His college teams have been noted for their academic excellence, self-discipline, maturity and respect for fellow athletes. Over the years Brian has accumulated a variety of awards, but it was being presented with the 'Soccer Volunteer of the Year Award' by the Fish Creek Community, for the efforts of he and his wife to the program, that gives him the most pleasure. He is presently responsible for the identification and development of players for the Canadian National Team Program at the National Training Centre for soccer in Calgary. The Calgary Booster Club is very pleased to add the name Brian Ellis to the Honoured Athletic Leader list of 2002.

**DONALD MAXWELL: Sport Administration**

As a youngster Don enjoyed the community athletic programs in Calgary playing golf, hockey, baseball and football. He was very successful in his athletic endeavors such as driving in the winning run at the Canadian Junior National Championship, being a two way player for the University of Calgary football Dinosaurs, a scoring champion while playing Junior B hockey and winning the Shaganappi Junior Golf Tournament. Similar to many of the volunteers in Calgary, Don wished to contribute time and effort back to the community from which he had received many joyful athletic moments. He has been a

coach for his community in soccer, basketball and volleyball, joining in the team fund raising programs or any other duties required. Don served for 31 years as a teacher with the Calgary Board of Education, the last five as the Athletic Specialist for the Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association. During his time as a Physical Education teacher with the Board, Don coached many basketball and football teams at the schools to which he was assigned. He has conducted baseball clinics with the Continuing Education Division of the Calgary Board of Education. He assisted with athlete accreditation during the 1988 Calgary Winter Olympic Games and with transportation during the staging in Calgary for the 2002 Winter Olympic Team. It is a welcome addition to add the name Donald Maxwell to the 2002 Honoured Athletic Leaders list.

LeRoy has been a Director of the Calgary Booster Club for thirty-three continuous years, a testament to his devotion to volunteering in the community. He helped organize the Calgary Herald Road Race as one of his many committee duties with the Calgary Booster Club and during 1984-1985 he was President of the club. He worked with the curriculum committee of the 1988 Olympic Organizing committee that was circulated to all the schools in Alberta and assisted with the Olympic Torch Relay. He was also involved as a volunteer with the 1997 World Police and Fire Games in Calgary. As a member of the Calgary Winter Club, he began a 55 Plus Club so he could conduct

fitness classes for seniors and others. During his 23 years as Supervisor of Health and Physical Education for the Calgary Catholic Board of Education, he developed an extensive extra curricular athletic program for the Junior High Schools. In addition, he was the Associate Secretary-Treasurer for the Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association during the same period. Recognized by his peers for the many contributions in health and physical education, he has been honoured by local, provincial and national associations. LeRoy has been a presenter at fitness clinics, running clinics, workshops and conferences as he worked at spreading the word of the active lifestyle. He came by this interest when he was a youngster playing hockey, baseball, squash and basketball at Saint Michael's High School in Pincher Creek, but it was the running and fitness that captured his lifelong ambition. Marjorie, his sons Perry and Paul, and his grandchildren share and actively support his activities. It is particularly pleasing for the Calgary Booster Club to place the name LeRoy Pelletier on the 2002 Honoured Athletic Leader list.

**BRIAN SKINNER: Curling Administration**

How Catriona visualized herself twenty-three years ago when she began skating with the Saskatoon Lions Club is now a moot point. She is now ranked number One in the World Cup standing for the 500 meter event with the record time of 37.22 seconds. She is a repeat Olympic Winter Games Gold Medal winner in the 500 meter event with an Olympic record time of 37.30 at the 2002 Salt Lake City Winter Olympic Games. During her thirteen years as a member of the Canadian Long Track Speed Skating Team, she has set a standard that is difficult to beat, winning 16 of the last 17 World Cup 500 meter races since 1999. This flag carrier for the Canadian Olympic Team sets attainable objectives for herself both in sports and in life. She has

become a talented bilingual motivational speaker.

Before her elite athletic career began with the bronze medal at the 1983 Canada Winter Games, she participated in most community and school athletic events available to her. Today she still attempts to participate in a variety of activities with golf and horses dominating her available time. She now lives in Calgary with her husband Bart and together they tour the local golf courses and attend as many rodeo competitions that they can. Catriona was named Canadian Female Athlete of the Year in 2001 but tonight Catriona sets a new record. For the fourth time, she is the recipient of the Henry Viney Award Trophy as the Calgary Female Athlete of the Year. SCOTT-MAMINI AWARD WINNER*Jarome Iginla*

With two goals and an assist in a 5-2 win, in a sudden death game for Olympic Gold, an athlete's life can't get much better. This six-year veteran of the Flames is a very versatile center that plays well on defense and offence which showed during the game with Team USA. Jarome has represented Canada at world competitions before with the 1997 World Champion and the 1996 World Junior Hockey Championships both Gold Medal teams. With the Kamloops Blazers in 1993-94 and again in 1994-95, the team won the Memorial Cup both seasons. about a period of play each game with the Flames and is a prolific scorer, which really benefits Kidsport Calgary as Jarome donates \$1000.00 for each goal he scores. He was born in Edmonton in 1977 but was raised in Saint Albert where he played his minor hockey. We can credit his mother for recognizing early the strong desire he developed for hockey and her continual support throughout the years. The Calgary Booster Club is pleased to support Jarome in his athletic journey and welcomes his designation as Calgary Male Athlete of the Year for 2002.

PAST WINNERS*Scott-Mamini Award*

The Scott-Mamini Award, initiated by the Calgary Press-Radio-TV Sports Club in 1958, was presented annually to the city's Athlete of the Year as chosen by the media. That format continued until 1987 when the Scott-Mamini became the Male Athlete of the Year recognition. It is named for Harry Scott, Sports Editor at the Calgary Albertan and Bob Mamini, the Sports Department Head at the Calgary Herald. Both men were highly respected across the country during the 1930's and 1940's.

Sports Wall of Fame

In 1984, the Calgary Booster Club approved the concept of a permanent display of recognition for its leadership and athletic award winners. After reviewing potential locations and arranging the necessary funds, an agreement was reached between the Club and the Board of Directors of Lindsay Park Sports

Centre to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility.

The Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame was opened to the public on December 9, 1987. As each year's group of award recipients is announced, their names will be added to the display providing a complete history of the best in Calgary athletes.

Olympic Torch Display

The Calgary Booster Club passed a motion on September 11, 1978 to look into the possibility of Calgary hosting the 1988 Olympic Winter Games.

On February 13, 1988 Harry Maubert, representing the Calgary Booster Club, used the torch to officially light the cauldron at the Olympic Plaza.

Petro Canada, sponsor of the cross-Canada torch relay, presented this torch to the Calgary Booster Club on June 6, 1988 in recognition of the club's major contribution to the XV Olympic Winter Games. The torch is on display in conjunction with the Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame at Lindsay Park Sports Centre.



Since 1954, the annual Sportsmen's Dinner has been dedicated to the person(s) selected Calgary Booster Club Sportsman of the Year. The Sportsman has customarily been one of the city's athletic leaders who have greatly contributed to the local sport scene. To further recognize these outstanding Calgarians, the Booster Club

maintains a permanent pictorial showcase of all Sportsman of the Year honourees.

The Sportsman of the Year Wall was unveiled at Canada Olympic Park Atco V.I.P. Centre on March 25, 1990 and at the time of the unveiling contained the pictures of the Calgary Booster Club's 45 award recipients. As each year's winner is announced, their picture is added to the display.

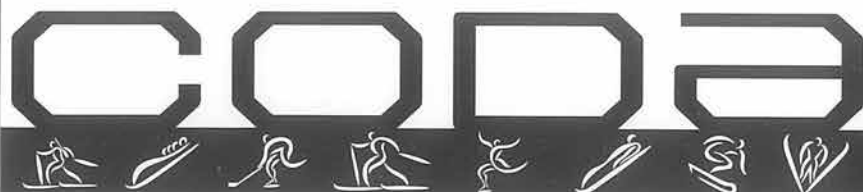

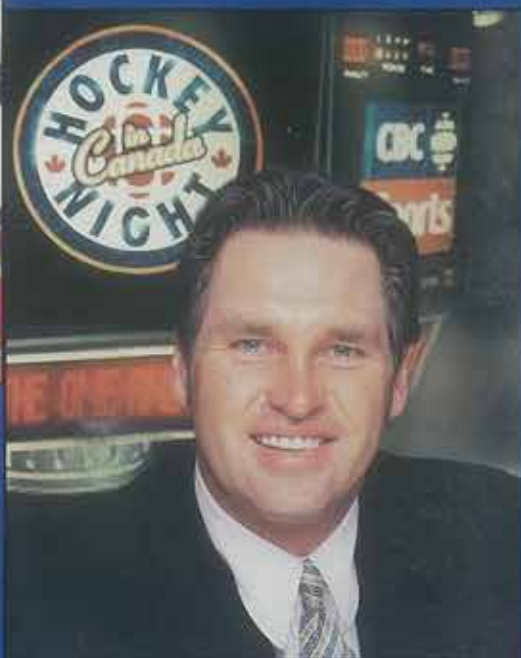
