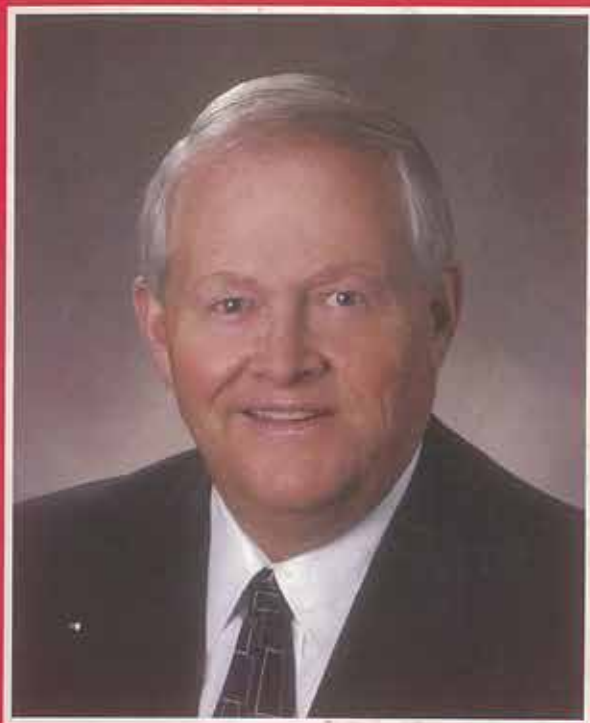

He has been described “a class act” by the media, “conscientious” by his colleagues, and “professional” by anyone who has had the pleasure of working closely with him. He is an individual who has garnered affirmative public recognition in our community, and has done so with great character and dignity. The Calgary Booster Club is extremely proud to honour Stan Schwartz as the 2004 Sportsman of the Year.

Over the past 48 years, Stan Schwartz has made significant contributions to sport within amateur and development levels as well as the professional ranks. While best known for his role as President of the Calgary Stampeder Football Club from 1996 until 2003, Stan has influenced much of Calgary’s sport community in his quiet and unassuming manner. Stan has managed to blend his professional responsibilities with his commitment to amateur sport, creating many opportunities for younger athletes. Stan, along with

Tony Anselmo, has been instrumental in the development of McMahon Stadium as a multi-purpose facility that now functions as a first-class venue for several hundred amateur events every year.

Stan was born and raised in Southern Alberta, near Medicine Hat. In his earliest pursuit of athletics, he participated in community and school sports where he excelled in football and track and field, winning awards in both disciplines.

Stan’s dreams took him to Mount Royal College and the University of Calgary where he played football and earned a degree in Physical Education and an Alberta Teaching Certificate. In 1970, the Calgary Board of Education hired Stan and his wife Shirley. In 1972 they left for graduate school, moving to Indiana State University where Stan coached football and received a Master of Science degree in Sports Medicine before returning to Calgary. Over the years, Stan coached high school football, wrestling and track and field. He guided a bantam football team to the City and Provincial Championships. He also acted as the defensive coordinator with the Calgary Mohawks Junior Football Club. He was heavily involved as a wrestling coach, coaching a city high school championship team, participating in the World Amateur Wrestling Coaches Camp and serving as an assistant coach for the Alberta Junior Olympic Team. Stan also served as an athletic trainer and conducted training clinics for the Calgary Board of Education. He spent much of his personal time building football practice equipment that continues to be used by some Calgary high schools today. He spent an equal amount of time building fitness equipment and organizing work out spaces for the use by students.

In 1976, Stan started his eight-year career as an Assistant Coach with the Calgary Stampeders. Stan left his coaching position with the Calgary Stampeders and became Manager of McMahon Stadium. In preparation for the XV Olympic Winter Games, Stan and his staff oversaw the \$30,000,000 expansion of the Stadium. In addition, Stan contributed many volunteer hours working with the various OCO ‘88 management personnel, committees and volunteers. Stan returned to the Stampeder fold as Vice-President and General Manager – Administration. In 1996 he was elevated to President of the teams that won Grey Cups in 1998 and 2001. Stan acted as The Calgary Stampeders’ representative on the Canadian Football League Board of Governors for eight years. During his association with the Calgary Stampeders and the Calgary Stampeder Alumni Association, successful fundraising campaigns have raised close to two million dollars in support of various Calgary football programs.

The recognition, respect and praise that Stan Schwartz has received from his community underline the high regard that Calgarians have for him. The Calgary Booster Club has recognized Stan previously as an Honored Athletic Leader (1999). In 2000, as recognition of over 30 years of support for high school football, the Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association introduced a trophy in the name of Stan Schwartz. The trophy is awarded annually to the top Calgary high school volunteer football coach. In 2003, Stan Schwartz was inducted onto the Calgary Bantam Football Wall of Fame for his outstanding contribution towards the foundation of bantam football in Calgary.

Stan is a tireless worker, never seeking the public acknowledgement that has quite naturally attended him, committing his life work to the sports community. It is the vigorous dedication of Stan Schwartz that has made a positively indelible mark on the face of Calgary Sports.

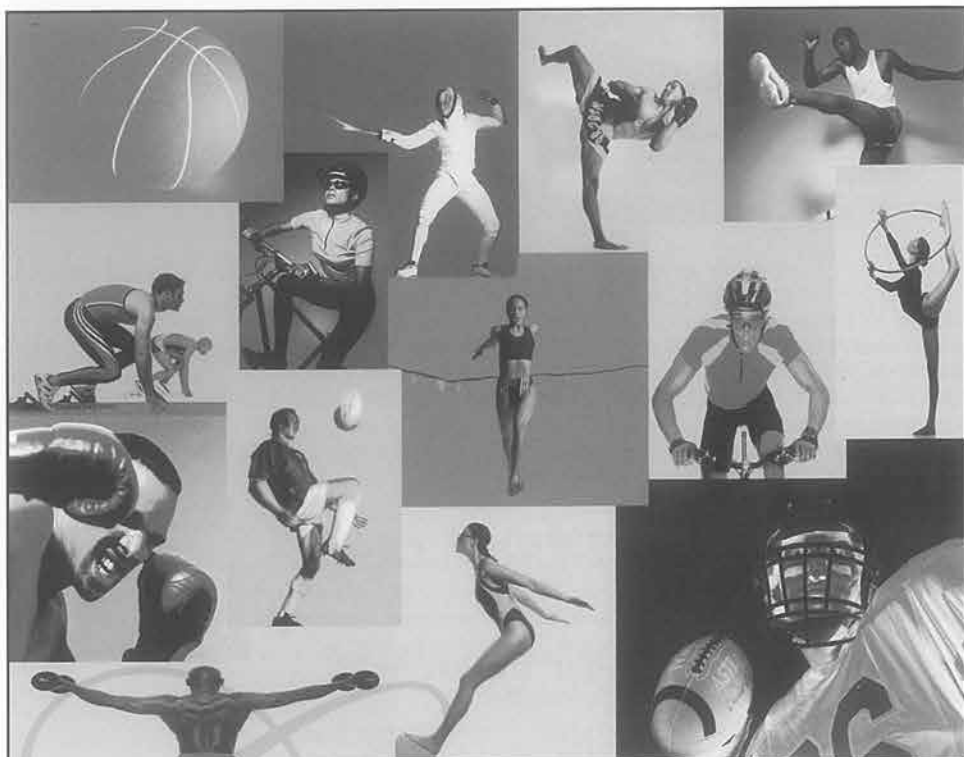
Recognition Partnership

Being an avid curler, Paul has taken his passion for the sport to another level by attaining his NCCP Level 1 Technical and is a Level 11 Official in Training. He has officiated at the Canadian Juvenile, Seniors, Mixed, Women's and Men's Championships.

As a coach, he has fostered the ideals of always playing to the best of your ability and respecting your opposition and officials; as an administrator, he has promoted the sport, encouraged competition and promoted safety, ethics and fairness; and as a volunteer, he has supported the efforts of the organizations. Paul is involved in sport for the athletes and has played and continues to play a vital role in sports.

**BILL WYLLIE**

When you think of long distance running, you think of Bill Wyllie. In 1960, he started running after it was determined that chest pains were caused by stress. Now at seventy-one years young, he recently completed his seventy-first marathon and shows no sign of slowing down.

In the 1960's and 70's, he was a tireless worker as a coach and official with Caltaf and with the University of Calgary men's and women's cross country teams. He organized junior and senior high school cross country races, was race director of Canadian Marathon Championships and Olympic Trials, was head timer at various track and field meets, set dates for all road races and cross country races in Alberta and Saskatchewan, organized a variety of distance races, etc. In 1971, he founded the Calgary Road Runners and it became the largest running club in Canada. He was their newsletter editor and chief of everything. He also co-founded the Canadian Masters International Track Team. He is a first class gentleman who has been involved in a variety of sporting events. He has been a community soccer coach and a volunteer aerobics instructor at the YMCA. Bill has also been a committee member for amateur boxing championships and assisted with the tour of a Soviet gymnastics team, organized pre-game and half-time shows at Calgary Stampeder Football Games and was the assistant organizer of the torch-carrying relay run from Calgary to Edmonton for the opening of Alberta's Sports Hall of Fame. His nominator wrote:

"Bill has coached and mentored many of Calgary's best distance runners, but his strongest attribute is his willingness to assist those who desire to enhance the quality of their lives through active participation."

Bill was the first Western Canadian to run the Boston Marathon and he also competed in the First World Masters Track and Field Championships in Germany. In 2001 and 2002, he competed in the Canadian Duathlon Champions. Since 1973, he has started the year off right by going for a lengthy New Years Day Run.

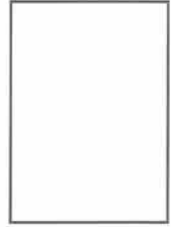

Deidra Dionne



Growing up, Deidra Dionne has always been involved in a variety of sports. As she developed as an athlete, her first love of skiing became the dominant interest in Deidra's life. From the early age of three, Deidra was exposed to skiing. Almost immediately she became impassioned with the sport, and soon after she became a member of the Nancy Green Racing team whom she competed with until she was twelve. During the Christmas break of 1993, Deidra and a friend decided to attend an introductory freestyle camp, and the rest, as they say, is history.

At the 1994 Alberta Winter Games, Deidra won gold in aerials and combined. The following year, she took gold in aerials, combined and acro (3rd in moguls) at the Junior National Championships. As a member of the Alberta Freestyle Ski Team, she repeated her championships in aerials and combined for 1997 and 1998. When

Deidra joined the Canadian Freestyle ski team in 1999, she decided to concentrate on aerials. That same year, she participated in her first World Cup event, taking the Bronze medal. In 2000 she won the Silver, proving she was much more than a "flash in the pan". Since then she has maintained a solid world ranking, having won three more international Bronze Medals and a Silver Medal at the 2002 Winter Olympic Games.

As Deidra works toward her Bachelor of Arts Degree from Athabasca University, she manages an active schedule of speaking engagements. Since the Olympics, Deidra has presented to over 75 school groups and spoken at sports banquets, rotary clubs and women's groups. The Calgary Booster Club is delighted to welcome this special guest to our 51st Sportsman of the Year Dinner.



Budding soccer luminary Taryn Swiatek, the 18th Henry Viney Trophy winner is the first representative of her sport to be chosen Calgary Female Athlete of the Year. The 23 year old native Calgarian is a goalkeeper with Canada's World Cup women's team which has captured the hearts of sports fans across the country in recent years. Taryn has represented Canada 12 times since joining the National Team in 2000 including 8 international appearances during 2003 highlighted by two shutout performances. She was a member of the Pan American team which won silver in a hard fought 2-1 overtime loss to Brazil last summer. She was also a member of the FIFA Women's World Cup team that finished 4th at the important autumn competition. A graduate of Western Canada High School, Taryn played youth soccer with the Calgary Celtics and later earned All-Canadian status with the University of Calgary Dinosaurs. As well as

playing for the Ottawa Fury of the W League, she is working on a BSc degree in geography at the U of C. As for the future, Taryn, who was part of the team that just narrowly missed qualifying for the 2004 Olympics in Athens, is looking ahead to some professional opportunities in Europe and to competing for Canada in the 2007 Women's World Cup in China and the Summer Olympics in Beijing in 2008. The Calgary Booster Club is proud to recognize Taryn Swiatek as the 2004 Calgary Female Athlete of the Year and wishes her continued success in her international soccer pursuits.

The Calgary Athlete of the Year Award was started in 1958 by the Calgary Press Radio TV Sports Club. The Calgary Booster Club has coordinated the recognition program since 1990 as part of its continuing dedication to the development and encouragement of athletic endeavor since 1952.

Speedskating superstar Jeremy Wotherspoon is the 47th winner of the prestigious Scott-Mamini Memorial Award as Calgary's 2004 Male Athlete of the Year. Jeremy selected for his formidable exploits on the international speedskating circuit during 2003 captured the honor for the second time previously receiving recognition in 2001. The 27 year old Red Deer native has been a leader on the National long track speedskating team for 8 years. His 2003 campaign was truly outstanding.

- Broke outdoor world record 500m at World Cup in Inzell, Germany
- Undefeated in 500m competition during 2002-2003 World Cup season

Jeremy still holds the Canadian records in the 500m (34.37 sec.) and 1000m (1.07.72) events and success on the international scene continued through the recently completed 2003-2004 season. His sights are now firmly aimed at representing Canada at the 2006 Winter Olympic Games in Torino, Italy. 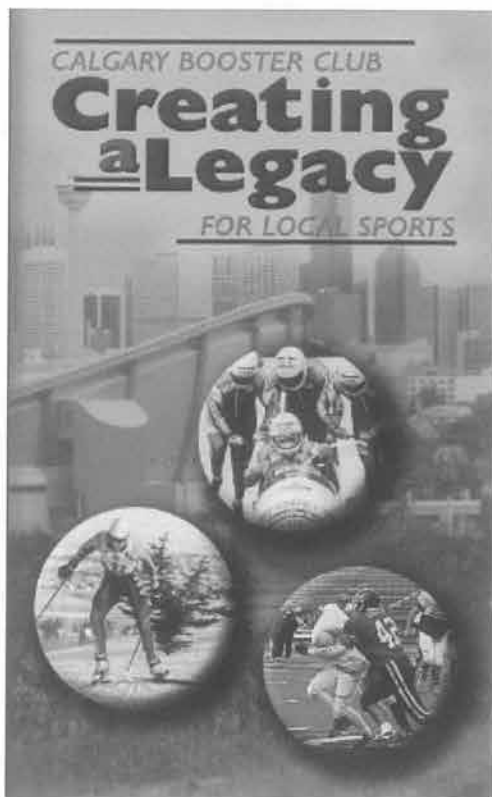

Sports Wall of Fame



In 1984, the Calgary Booster Club approved the concept of a permanent display of recognition for its leadership and athletic award winners. After reviewing potential locations and arranging the necessary funds, an agreement was reached between the Club and the Board of Directors of the Talisman Centre to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility.

The Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame was opened to the public on December 9, 1987. As each year's group of award recipients is announced, their names will be added to the display providing a complete history of the best in Calgary athletes. The Wall will be updated through the current renovations.

Olympic Torch Display



The Calgary Booster Club passed a motion on September 11, 1978 to look into the possibility of Calgary hosting the 1988 Olympic Winter Games.

On February 13, 1988 Harry Maubert, representing the Calgary Booster Club, used the torch to officially light the cauldron at the Olympic Plaza.

Petro Canada, sponsor of the cross-Canada torch relay, presented this torch to the Calgary Booster Club on June 6, 1988 in recognition of the club's major contribution to the XV Olympic Winter Games. The torch is on display in conjunction with the Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame at the Talisman Centre.

Sportsman's Wall



Since 1954, the annual Sportsman's Dinner has been dedicated to the person(s) selected Calgary Booster Club Sportsman of the Year. The Sportsman has customarily been one of the city's athletic leaders who has greatly contributed to the local sport scene. To further recognize these outstanding Calgarians, the Booster Club maintains a permanent pictorial showcase of all Sportsman of the Year honorees.

The Sportsman of the Year Wall was unveiled at the ATCO VIP Centre at Canada Olympic Park
