## 2005 SPORTSMAN OF THE YEAR RUSS Parker



It is with great pride that the Calgary Booster Club names Russ Parker as our 2005 Sportsman of the Year.

Originally from Moosomin, Saskatchewan, Russ came to Calgary in 1958 and played junior and intermediate hockey and junior baseball. Russ turned to coaching where he guided many teams to city, provincial and national titles. In hockey, his Calgary Orphans team won the Alberta Intermediate Hockey Championship in 1964. In baseball, Russ guided a Southern Alberta All-star team to a win at the 1965 Canadian Junior Baseball Championship. In 1968, Russ was the coach/manager of the Calgary Odeons and first league Commissioner of the Alberta Major Baseball League.

Russ and his wife Diane have four children: Shannon, Brent, Blake and Darren. In the 1970's, Russ returned to the grassroots to coach baseball in the Centennial and Foothills Little Leagues and minor

hockey in the Rosemont and Triwood communities. In 1977, Russ and his family took the plunge into professional baseball in the Pioneer Baseball League (Calgary Cardinals). Russ is perhaps best known for his role as owner of the Calgary Cannons of the Pacific Coast League (1985-2001).

Over the past 45 years, Russ Parker has made a significant contribution to both amateur and professional sport within our city and beyond. During his tenure, the number of young people playing baseball in the city of Calgary has substantially increased. His legacy includes the development of Foothills Park into Burns Stadium. Russ donated the stadium scoreboard and, through 50/50 draws, Calgary amateur baseball has received over \$300,000 in support for their programs.

The respect and recognition for Russ Parker points to the high esteem that Calgarians and others have for him and his work. The Calgary Booster Club recognized Russ previously as an Honoured Athletic Leader in 1973. Russ was elected to the Saskatchewan Rural Sports Hall of Fame, and has received many awards at minor and professional levels. Russ was the first Canadian elected to the Board of Trustees of the National Association of Professional Baseball, the governing body for minor league baseball.

While his home is in Calgary, Russ now spends time in Scotsdale, Arizona and is the current owner of the Regina Pats of the Western Hockey League. Residents of Calgary are fortunate for having Russ Parker and his commitment to the promotion of baseball. Involved as a player, coach, manager, administrator and owner from 1960 to 2001, Russ richly deserves the title of "Mr. Baseball" in Calgary.

The Calgary Booster Club is proud to honour Russ Parker as its 52nd Sportsman of the Year.



# Kyle Shewfelt



All sports-minded Canadians, particularly Calgarians, were ecstatic in August of 2004 when Kyle Shewfelt won the first Gold Medal for Canada in the Olympic Games in Athens. He had just thrilled a world audience with the top Floor Routine in Men's Gymnastics in the 2004 Summer Olympic Games in Athens. Dubbed "Our Golden Hero" in a front page photograph on August 23, 2004 in *The Calgary Herald*, and "Shew Good as Gold" on the front page of the *Calgary Sun*, Kyle Shewfelt made his mark in the annals of Canadian Gymnastics.

Although he placed just out of the medals in the Vault event, which had such controversy in the judging, Kyle handled the situation by responding to the Media's questions with diplomacy, maturity, and exemplary sportsmanship — a fact which made his family and Canadians watching the event have even greater pride in his accomplishments.

When asked by CBC Anchor Brian Williams in Athens later that day about his future plans, Kyle responded that some day, he would like to be doing his job. Perhaps, one day in the future, he will indeed be doing so! Since he returned from Athens, Kyle has made hundreds of public appearances, and he has "made a start" in achieving his career goals in public speaking. In spite of returning to his training schedule in Gymnastics, he has been "honing these skills" by speaking to thousands of school children, and at large banquets and conferences throughout Canada.

The Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association was established in 1913 to provide competitive athletic opportunities for students in Calgary high schools. As such, the Calgary Board of Education and the Calgary Separate School District have worked together harmoniously for decades. As well, the partnership with the Calgary Booster Club over the past five decades has been beneficial to hundreds of student athletes.

Since 1956, over 250 young people have been celebrated for their academic and athletic excellence. In excess of 380 scholarships have been awarded by the Booster Club totalling over \$150,000. The basis of selection includes athletic ability and performance, scholastic achievement, school citizenship, leadership, sportsmanship, and community involvement.



#### LORNA SNOW

Lorna has been a competitive swim coach for over 25 years and has been recognized by her peers as one of the premier development coaches in Alberta. Over the course of her coaching career, she has introduced thousands of swimmers of all ages and abilities to competitive swimming. Success for these children has not been about being the fastest, but more importantly acquiring the proper technique and work ethic to achieve success: important life lessons for children.

In addition to coaching the development program for the University of Calgary Swim Club, Lorna has been a leader in extending opportunities to numerous swimmers with a disability (SWAD). She has been a strong advocate for these

athletes in the competitive swim programs of Swim Alberta and Swim Canada. It is a testimony to her coaching abilities that a number of swimmers who she introduced to the challenges and demands of the

sport have gone on to successfully compete in both the Olympic and Paralympic Games.

As president of the Canadian Blind Sports Association, Lorna was a member of the Canadian Paralympic Committee that oversaw the transfer of responsibility for governance of disabled swimmer's from a sport specific national organization to full and complete integration with Swimming Canada. Blind and partially blind athletes now compete as Swim Canada team members, and receive all the services available to able body swimmers.

Lorna is a founding member of the Alberta Sports and Recreation Association for the Blind and is recognized throughout the province as being responsible for bringing ASRAB from a "kitchen table"

operation managed by volunteers to a significant professional presence in Alberta.

She has served as President, Vice President and presently holds the position of Director of Sports and Recreation. Lorna is an official in the sport of Goalball, and has attended many international events; Paralympic Games, and World Championships. Lorna has served as a committee member for every Canadian Championship hosted by ASRAB.

For her outstanding contributions to health, wellness and active living, Lorna received the YWCA Woman of Distinction Award in 1998. Every group she has been associated with has formally recognized her significant contributions. The Calgary Booster Club is pleased to honour her leadership and efforts to enrich the lives of so many young athletes by naming her an Honoured Athletic Leader.



#### DANNY SNOW

Goalball is a team sport played by athletes who are blind or partially sighted. All players wear full black out goggles so that their vision is equal. It is all about hearing, since the ball, which has bells in it, is tracked with the ears. A team consists of six players, with three players on the court. The game is played on a volleyball court and the lines are taped so they are tactile. Players feel the boundaries and playing lines with their feet and hands. Goalball is played in ninety-five countries, and it is the only team sport played by blind athletes.


Danny has been involved with ASRAB since 1979. He played an integral role in the formation and success of the Alberta men's and women's goalball programs. Coaching has been Danny's passion; guiding, teaching and developing athletes


who are blind and partially sighted is his forte. Danny has had a great deal of success coaching ASRAB's goalball teams, capturing seven Canadian Championships, along with numerous silver and bronze medals. His knowledge and leadership in the game goes beyond the boundaries of Alberta. He is known and respected worldwide for his contribution to the sport of goalball. At the International level, Danny has coached four Paralympic teams, the latest being in Athens. The Canadian men improved their international ranking from 10th to 4th under Danny's coaching.

Danny treats his athletes with respect, integrity, honesty and fairness. Practices start in October and run through to March. During this period, Danny spends every weekend picking up and dropping off players,

taping courts, and conducting practices.

As an administrator, Danny has been the treasurer of ASRAB for many years and has been involved on every ASRAB championship organizing committee. Alberta has hosted one World Goalball Championship, one World Cup of Goalball, three Canadian Goalball Championships, and two Canadian Lawn Bowls Championships. Danny Snow is truly a unique individual and a deserving recipient of this award. The Calgary Booster Club is pleased to recognize Danny Snow as an Honoured Athletic Leader.





# HENRY VINEY TROPHY WINNER CINDY Klassen



You might say Cindy Klassen grew up on the ice in her hometown of Winnipeg, Manitoba. Her early development as an athlete was founded through "The Good Ol' Hockey Game!" Indeed, during the initial years of four to sixteen, when she played community hockey on a variety of boys' teams, there was little to suggest that Cindy dreamt of the Speed Skating podium at all. It was her success as a young defenseman that landed her a spot on the Junior National Women's Hockey Team. In 1998, however, The Winter Olympic Hockey Team decided to take a pass on Cindy, and it occurred to her that she just might have some transferable skills that could be applied to Speed Skating. A year later, after adjusting her skating technique, she had managed to place first in the 1000m and third in the 500m at the World Junior Championships.

In the following years, Cindy steadily improved her game, and started to amass a collection of Medals. With consistent international rankings, numerous top-five finishes, and a few broken Canadian records now under her belt, Cindy set her sights on the 2002 Winter Olympics. She brought home her first Olympic Medal with a Bronze in the 3000m. In 2003, she became the first Canadian in 27 years to win the overall title at the World Speed Skating Championships.

In an unfortunate off-season training session, Cindy lost an edge, forcing her into another skater. The laceration and torn tendons forced her to miss the bulk of her 2003/04 season. Miraculously, Cindy bounced back at the end of the season to win a silver and bronze medal in the World Single Distances Championships!

With her very recent successes, Cindy Klassen has proven to be a balanced embodiment of perseverance, on one hand, and adaptability on the other. The stability she has demonstrated as an elite athlete is a mark of athletic performance that few can achieve, let alone maintain. The Calgary Booster Club is extremely proud to award Cindy The Calgary Booster Club Female Athlete of the Year for 2005, and wishes her the greatest success in the months and years to come!

The Calgary Athlete of the Year Award was started in 1958 by the Calgary Press Radio TV Sports Club. The Calgary Booster Club has coordinated the recognition program since 1990 as part of its continuing dedication to the development and encouragement of athletic endeavour since 1952.

# SCOTT-MAMINI AWARD WINNER Kyle Shewfelt



The head judge for Floor Exercises at the Athens Games has portrayed Kyle Shewfelt's performance as "the best that's ever been [with] a virtuosity...that even a layman can appreciate." Kyle has an undeniable reputation for his meticulous movement, and for the precision with which he executes his routines. Kyle Shewfelt has most certainly brought Canada into uncharted athletic territory, and in recognition of his efforts, the Calgary Booster Club is extremely pleased to award him Male Athlete of the Year.

Kyle was born in Calgary and in 1988 was enrolled at the Altadore Gym Club. During this time, Kyle received athletic guidance from Kelly Manjak, who would continue to train and hone Kyle's abilities throughout his development as a gymnast. His first international competitions in Hungary and Austria both earned Kyle Gold Medals in Floor and Vault.

In 1999, he was selected for the Canadian Junior National Team. His rapid progress and advancement in competition launched him quickly onto the Senior National Team in time for the Sydney Olympics in 2000. Kyle competed in 2002 at the Commonwealth Games to obtain two Gold Medals and one Silver Medal. At the World Championships in 2003, Kyle managed two Bronze Medals as well as finishing first at the World Cup.

Despite the momentum that Kyle had gathered in competition, he was still largely viewed as an underdog. This sentiment was deeply compounded by an ankle injury he sustained leading up to the 2004 Olympics. For many, Kyle Shewfelt looked like a long shot to see the podium in Athens.

After a series of tiebreakers in Floor Competition, the judges were ultimately obliged to present Kyle the Gold Medal. This was Canada's first medal in Athens, but more importantly, Canada's first medal ever in an artistic gymnastic event! In the subsequent Vault competition, there was dramatic controversy surrounding final standings. As the debate swelled, Kyle managed to distance himself, keeping his composure, his class, and his character well in hand.

It is with immense enjoyment that we follow his progress, and with even greater pleasure that we identify Kyle Shewfelt as The Calgary Booster Club Male Athlete of the Year for 2005.





## Sports Wall of Fame



In 1984, the Calgary Booster Club approved the concept of a permanent display of recognition for its leadership and athletic award winners. After reviewing potential locations and arranging the necessary funds, an agreement was reached between the Club and the Board of Directors of the Lindsay Park Sports Centre (now the Talisman Centre) to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility.

The Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame was opened to the public on December 9, 1987. As each year's group of award recipients is announced, their names will be added to the display providing a complete history of the best in Calgary athletes. The Wall will be updated through the current renovations at the Talisman Centre.

## CALGARY BOOSTER CLUB Olympic Torch Display



The Calgary Booster Club passed a motion on September 11, 1978 to look into the possibility of Calgary hosting the 1988 Olympic Winter Games.

On February 13, 1988 Harry Maubert, representing the Calgary Booster Club, used the torch to officially light the cauldron at the Olympic Plaza.

Petro Canada, sponsor of the cross-Canada torch relay, presented this torch to the Calgary Booster Club on June 6, 1988 in recognition of the club's major contribution to the XV Olympic Winter Games. The torch is on display in conjunction with the Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame at the Talisman Centre.

## Sportsman's Wall



Since 1954, the annual Sportsmen's Dinner has been dedicated to the person(s) selected Calgary Booster Club Sportsman of the Year. The Sportsman has customarily been one of the city's athletic leaders who has greatly contributed to the local sport scene. To further recognize these outstanding Calgarians, the Booster Club maintains a permanent pictorial showcase of all Sportsman of the Year honourees.

The Sportsman of the Year Wall was unveiled at the ATCO VIP Centre at Canada Olympic Park

on March 25, 1990 and at the time of the unveiling contained the pictures of the Calgary Booster Club's 45 award recipients. As each year's winner is announced, their picture is added to the display.


