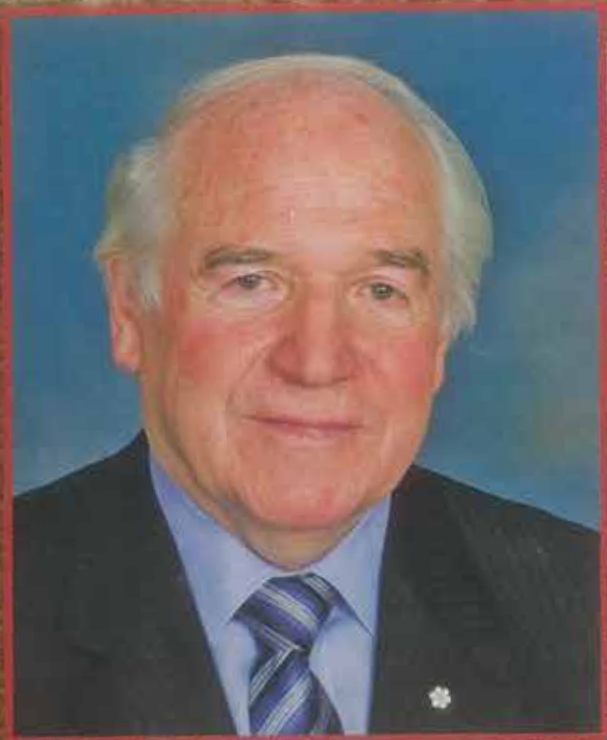

May the memory of this night of celebration remain with you for many years to come.

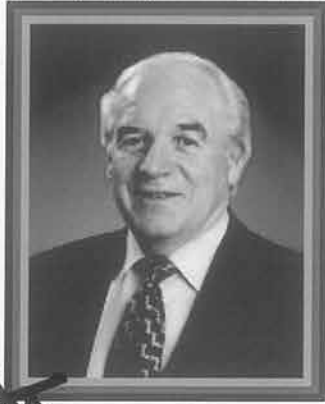

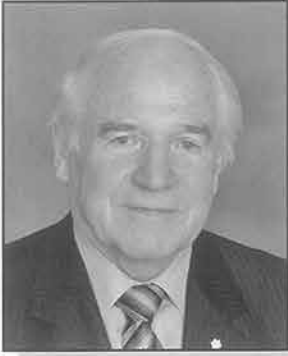

2007 SPORTSMAN OF THE YEAR *Doug Mitchell*



It is with great pride that the Calgary Booster Club names Doug Mitchell as our 2007 Sportsman of the Year.

Over the past 44 years, Doug Mitchell has made a significant contribution to both amateur and professional sport within our city and across the nation. As a player, promoter, commissioner, governor, and volunteer, Doug has sculpted an incredible legacy impacting many levels of sport.

Growing up in Calgary, Doug was an active youth playing minor hockey within the Buffalo Athletic Association and Calgary Community Association. At Crescent Heights High School, Doug came to enjoy another passion, football. Fortunately, he was able to parley into an education; first, by attending Colorado College on a hockey scholarship (Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration); and secondly, by playing football for the

University of British Columbia and the BC Lions (Law degree), later finishing his professional playing career with the Hamilton Tiger Cats.

Doug joined the law firm Howard, Mackie upon returning to Calgary as an articling student, and went on to specialize in Corporate and Commercial Law. He later took a leave of absence to act as Commissioner for the Canadian Football League for a five year period. He is presently the National Co-Chair of the law firm, Borden Ladner Gervais, LLP (formerly Howard, Mackie).

Doug's involvement with different sports has been truly amazing – ranging from coaching at the grassroots level as a volunteer coach of minor hockey at the Tiny Mite and Pee Wee levels to coaching Minor soccer, baseball, and football with the University of Calgary Dinosaurs. Doug is also well known as a colour commentator during the Stampeders' football games for nine seasons.

At the community level, Doug has been a tremendous builder involved with Calgary amateur sport. He has been a Director of the Calgary Olympic Development Association (CODA), and was instrumental in the rebirth of the Canadian Olympic Hockey Program in Calgary. Doug also brought NBA exhibition games to Calgary with proceeds directed towards scholarships for local university basketball players. Doug is currently the Chairman of the Calgary Sport Tourism Authority. He is also the Chairman of Legacy Sports Inc., a not-for-profit corporation which is a part owner of the Calgary Stampeders. Most dear to our hearts, however, has been Doug's commitment to amateur sport in Calgary through his long time involvement with the

Calgary Booster Club as a Past President and Honorary Life Director of the club.

At provincial, national and international levels, Doug has demonstrated his passion for supporting sports. In 1994, the Province of Alberta asked Doug to chair a committee looking at reviewing government involvement in professional sport; hence, his involvement with the Professional Sports Policy Committee. Doug's skills and abilities were also put to use when Edmonton appointed him to the Board of Directors of the World Track and Field Championships in 2001. He has served on the NHL Board of Governors as Alternative Governor representing the Calgary Flames. Doug has acted as voluntary legal counsel for the Alberta Games and the Alberta Sports Council. Most noticeably, however, is the fact that Doug Mitchell was the driving force behind the establishment of the annual Howard Mackie, now Borden Ladner Gervais Awards – an event that showcases the excellence of Canadian university athletes.

As a result of his tireless contributions, Doug has received a number of awards. These include: Lester Pearson Award (1996) as Outstanding Alumni of the Canadian Intercollegiate Athletic Union; election to the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame (1999); and Calgary Chamber of Commerce's Kay Pringle Award (1991) for outstanding community service. In 2002, the Canadian Interuniversity Sports association renamed the semi-final championship football game the Mitchell Bowl in recognition of Doug's commitment and dedication to university athletics. He was also selected one of Alberta's 50 most influential people over the last 100 years by Alberta Venture magazine in 2004, and in the same year, he was appointed a Member of the Order of Canada. In 2005, Doug received a Centennial Medal from the Lieutenant Governor of Alberta, as well as one from the Minister of Community Development as one of Alberta's top 100 sports figures of the past century.

Doug and his wife Lois are proud of their four children: Shelley, a lawyer who lives in Vancouver; Steven, who is involved in the food brokerage business in Toronto; Sue Ann, who works in the not for profit business in Vancouver; and Scott, the President of the Hamilton Tiger Cats. They have four grandchildren who live in Vancouver. One of their grandchildren, Spencer, attends the University of Calgary and plays football. Doug and Lois find countless hours to devote to community service and sport interests in Calgary.

The 2003 Sportsman of the Year, Frank King, said this about Doug and his wife Lois: "Above all else, Doug has been an outstanding citizen of Calgary. Together with his wife Lois, he continues to make a meaningful contribution to the strong volunteer fabric that characterizes Calgary as a leader in so many ways."

Doug Mitchell truly represents the sports fraternity and our city with professionalism and dignity, richly deserving this recognition as the Calgary Booster Club's 54th "Sportsman of the Year"

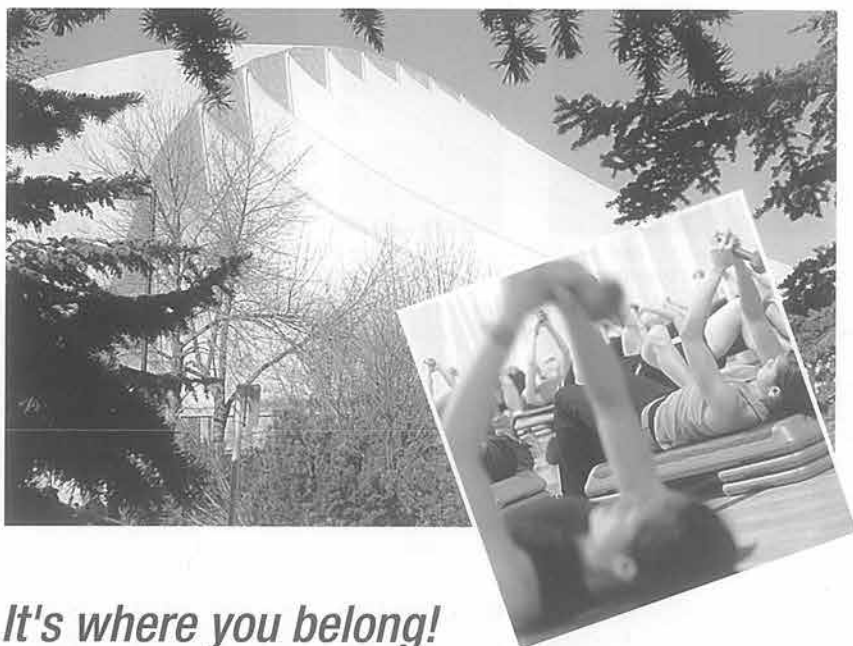

Jack Mac '07 Jack MacDonald



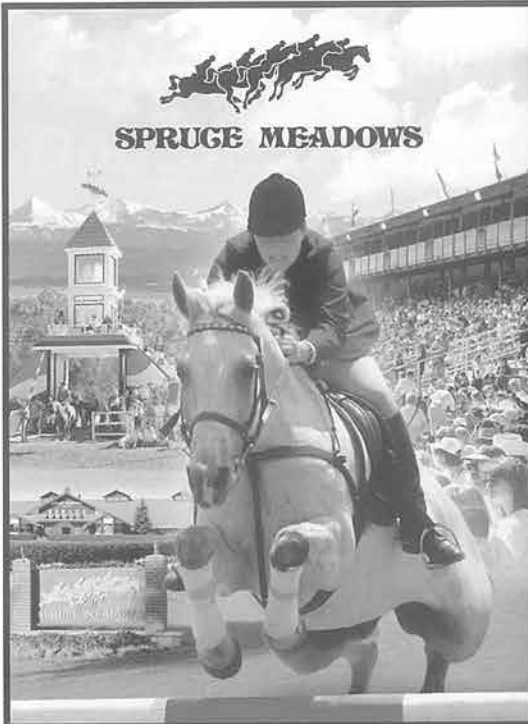

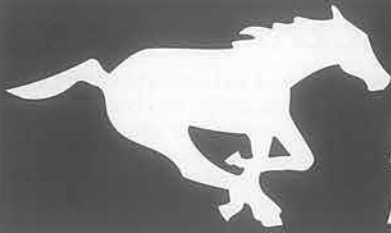

Over the years, Ted Hellard has been committed to the sport community, both as an athlete and as a coach. Hellard spent his childhood in St. Thomas Ontario and Halifax, Nova Scotia, and went on to star with the University of Calgary Dinos Basketball Team from 1974 to 1978, and was a member of the Canadian National Basketball Team in 1977 and 1978.

Graduating with a Bachelor of Education Degree in 1980, Ted Hellard has coached championship high school basketball and football teams. In addition, he has started a scholarship program for students playing Dinos basketball. From among the more than 115,000 alumni living in 120 countries around the world, Ted Hellard was selected as one of the University of Calgary's "Top 40 Alumni".

Under Ted Hellard's leadership and guidance, the Calgary Stampeders Football Club has set in motion a new chapter in the history of Stampeders football. Ted's initiative and tenacious attitude were invaluable in the purchase of the Club in January of 2005. The Founder and Chairman of Critical Mass, a successful Calgary-based interactive marketing agency, Ted has been able to bring the same level of expertise and passion to the business of professional sports.

Ted Hellard has gone on to become a success in the virtual world of cyberspace. Critical Mass, the company he founded and remains its chairman, provides website design and online marketing strategy to many blue chip companies. Hellard's view of his business life is akin to his work in sport: to educate and support growth and development. Ted relaxes with his family, including acting as a caddy for his wife, former professional golfer Jackie Twamley-Hellard.

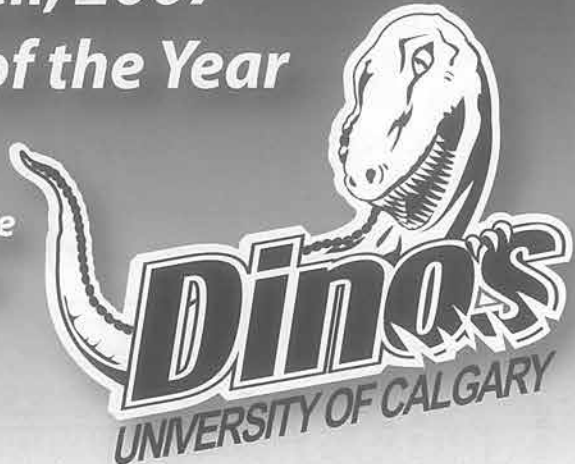

GUEST SPEAKER

Cody Snyder



Cody Snyder imagined it so many times – being the best bull rider in the world and waving to the adoring crowd. The Medicine Hat cowboy spent countless hours upon days preparing to become one of the greatest bull riders of all time.

All of Snyder's practice paid off when his dream became reality at the 1983 National Finals Rodeo in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Cody knew from the time he could put on a pair of boots and a hat, he wanted to be a bull rider. Moreover, Cody knew he wanted to be the best in the world – and he made it happen. Snyder also made Canadian history as the only Canadian to win a world bull riding championship. For that accomplishment alone Snyder could have been selected for induction into the Canadian Rodeo Hall of Fame. When he was selected in October 1995, there were many other accomplishments to support the selection.

Snyder competed in both Canada and the United States for 14 years, mounting an extensive list of achievements, including a Canadian bull riding championship and recording the highest National Finals Rodeo qualifications. The biggest highlight of

his riding career came at the Coliseum in Edmonton during the 1983 CFR when he set the record for the highest scored ride in Canadian history with a 95. On that spectacular evening, Snyder received three standing ovations and became a hero to many rodeo fans.

Retiring at the age of 29 in 1993 due to a long standing wrist injury, Snyder has acknowledged leaving the sport was one of the hardest things he has ever had to do. As with his determination to 'ride again' when a bull bucked him off, Snyder got right on. Less than a month after his final ride, Snyder, with the help of his wife Rhonda, held his first Professional Bull Riding event in Calgary. His family moved to Okotoks and began Cody Snyder's Bull Bustin'.

For the past fourteen years, Snyder, has been synonymous with the PBR in Canada. His company has hosted from six to 20 Bull Bustin' shows a year. Snyder believes "[t]he main thing it takes to be a bull rider is confidence," and he brings that quality to all that he does. The Calgary Booster Club is proud to welcome Cody Snyder as one of our Guest Speakers for this year's Sportsman of the year Dinner.

Special Recognition Award



RUSS PEAKE

Russ Peake is certainly well known in Calgary and in the Calgary sports community. As a sportscaster at CFCN for over 35 years, Russ has provided us with excellent commentary and insight into many sport events in Calgary including the 1988 Olympic Winter Games, as well as the 1976 Olympic Games in Montreal, and the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles.

Russ was born and raised in the farming community of Marwayne, near Lloydminster, and grew up in an area where amateur sport prevailed. He began his career in broadcasting in Red Deer, followed by stints in Saskatoon and Lethbridge, joining CFCN in Calgary in 1961. He left CFCN

when CHQR started up in 1964, but moved back to CFCN as a sportscaster in 1971. Russ served as the Sports Director for CFCN from 1996 until his retirement in 2004. He and his wife Helen have two daughters, Jodi and Debbie, and they are now enjoying spending time with their one-year-old granddaughter.

Russ has also been actively involved in the sporting community as a volunteer, working with Calgary Little League Baseball, the Calgary Stampede Rodeo, and the Southern Alberta Curling Association. During his almost forty years in the broadcasting industry, Russ was noted for his passion for amateur sport. He ensured that the grass roots competitor and the recreational athlete were given a share of air time with programs such as "Junior Sports Scoreboard", "Face-off Circle", and the "Athlete of the Week".

Russ has been recognized with many awards over the years, including:

- The Scotty Harper Award for the top electronic media story (1981 Brier, Halifax);
- Member of the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame (1983 Bell Memorial Award);
- Media Tribute Award (1994 Calgary Booster Club);
- Southern Alberta Curling Association Hall of Fame (2004, as a Builder); and
- Significant contributor to CFCN numerous CANPRO Awards for rodeo coverage

DAVE ARDELL

Dave Ardell has been involved in the Calgary water polo scene since moving from Ontario in the late 70's. He first participated in water polo as an athlete, then moved on to become an official and organizer of local, national, and international events. His active and passionate involvement with Lindsay Park, The Parks Foundation Calgary, Calgary Water Polo, Alberta Water Polo and Water Polo Canada over the past 25 years has made Dave a driving force within the Calgary sports community.

Dave began his water polo involvement with the Hamilton Water Polo Club. He competed in the Western Canada Games in 1983 and 1987, and participated in the FINA Master's World Championships in 1997.

Dave has been an integral part of the water polo community in Calgary, as well as serving as President of the Lindsay Park Society and Chairman of the Amateur Sports Committee of the Parks Foundation Calgary. He played an active role in the development of policies for Lindsay Park (renamed The Talisman Centre) and he was also active in the decisions that saw it become a leader in sport and wellness in North America. His other accomplishments include serving as Vice-Chairman of the 1992 Men's Olympic Qualifications tournament and the 2003 Junior Women's World Championships held in Calgary.

Dave was the founder of the Alberta Open Water Polo Championship that continues to be the largest international Water Polo event held in Canada. In 2001, Dave became the Senior Men's National Team Manager.

As an avid volunteer, Dave has impacted countless amateur athletes not just in the sport of water polo, but also as coach for his daughter's community soccer and basketball teams. He continues to be a role model to the youth of his community as well as our national team members. The Calgary Booster Club is proud to honour Dave Ardell as an Athletic Leader for 2007.



USHER BARNOFF

Usher Barnoff is a dedicated individual who has been committed to the growth of the sport of racquetball, and the continuity of fair play and positive ideals, for the past 25 years. He began volunteering as a member of the Calgary Racquetball Association in the early 1980's, and he extended his volunteer work to the Alberta Racquetball Association (ARA) in the mid-1980s, as head of officiating. His volunteer role expanded when he became President of the ARA in 1990, a position that he held until 1996.

Usher was a Team Canada Referee at the 1991 and 1993 Pan American Championships, in four World Championships, and the 1999 Pan American Games.

He first became involved with Racquetball Canada in 1986 as a member of their Officiating Committee, becoming Officiating Chairman in 1990. For 17 out of the past 18 years, he has been a member of Racquetball Canada's Board of Directors and Executive Committee. He was elected President in 1999, a position he continues to hold while actively volunteering in the international racquetball arena.

His international volunteer contributions began in 1992, when Usher was appointed Chairman of the Rules Committee for the International Racquetball Federation (IRF), a position in which he still serves. In 1999, he was elected the IRF's Vice-President, North America, as well as Vice-President of the Pan American Racquetball Confederation (PARC). In 2003, Usher's international role expanded further when he was appointed Technical Director of the IRF, a role which also makes him the recognized Technical Director and Rules Committee Chairman of PARC.

In those roles over the past 4 years, Usher has been in charge of organizing the World Championships, Junior World Championships, Central American and Caribbean Games and Pan Am Championships. Usher has received several international and PARC awards. Most recently, in May 2006, he received Racquetball Canada's highest honour -- the Ivan Velan Award.

Usher Barnoff is well deserving of an Athletic Leader Award for his service to the sport of racquetball provincially, nationally and internationally.

Kelly Blackshaw is a kinesiologist and certified exercise physiologist, and is a staunch advocate of daily physical activity for lifelong health and wellness. She is the President and co-owner of Foothills Health Consultants Ltd. and is currently researching intervention programs for "at risk" populations with the University of Calgary and the University of Alberta.

Kelly was a member of the Board of Directors of the Alberta Sport Council from 1986 to 1992, and served on the CODA Board of Directors from 1992 to 1996. She was a co-founder of the Fortress Mountain Ski Club in 1983.

In 1995 Kelly co-founded the "KidSport Society of Alberta", a non profit organization that enables children to overcome the financial obstacles that might hinder their participation in sports. She has been the only Chair of the Alberta KidSport Fund until 2005, and she is very proud of the fact that KidSport has provided the opportunity for more than 20,000 youth in Alberta to participate in sport. KidSport is now a National program and KidSport Alberta is one of the top organizations in Canada.

With Kelly's positive leadership and direction, over 32 local organizing committees of KidSport have been established throughout the province, affecting more than 200 communities. The development, growth and operation of KidSport in Alberta has become the model for KidSport organizations across Canada.

Kelly received the 2005 Alberta Centennial Salute Award, and she was inducted into the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame as a Multi-Sport Builder in 2006. We are very proud to honour Kelly Blackshaw with a Calgary Booster Club Honoured Athletic Leader Award for her leadership in the KidSport programs.



ANNETTE GILLIS

Annette Gillis is one of Alberta and Canada's premier swimming officials. She has been a key volunteer and official for competitive swimming for over 25 years. 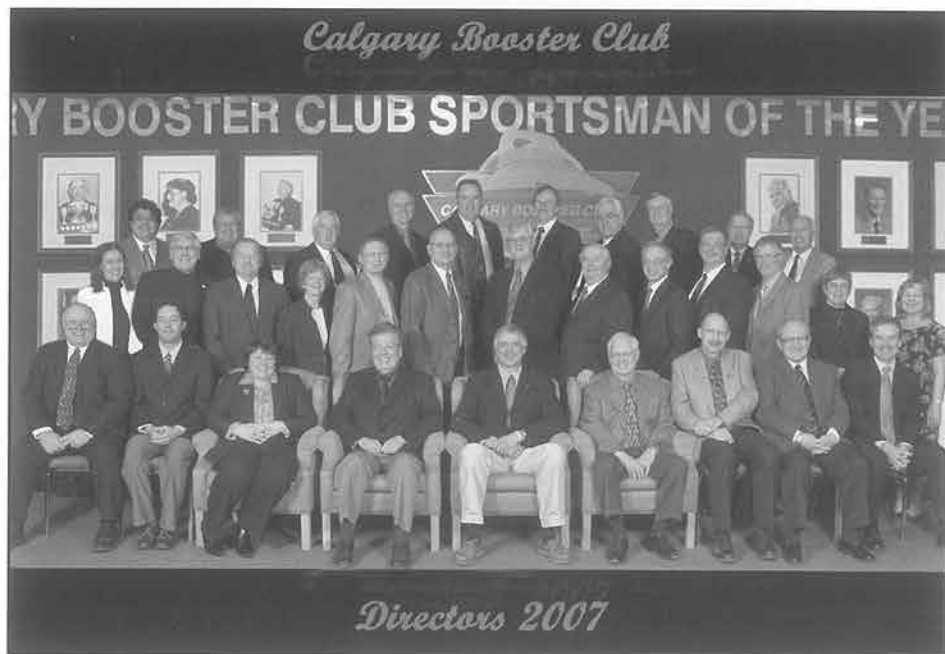

HENRY VINEY TROPHY WINNER**Cindy Klassen**

The Calgary Booster Club is extremely proud to award Cindy Klassen the Calgary Booster Club Female Athlete of the Year for 2007. Cindy is the recipient of the Henry Viney Trophy for the third consecutive year, based on her outstanding performance in Speed Skating in 2006. Cindy honoured our country by carrying Canada's flag into the 2006 Olympic Closing Ceremonies in Turin, and medaled in five speed skating events (Gold in the 1500m; Silver in the 1000m and Team Pursuit; Bronze in the 3000m and 5000m events) making Cindy the most decorated Canadian Olympic Athlete. Following her successes at the Olympics, Cindy won another two medals (Gold and Bronze) at the 2006 World Cup at Heerenveen, Netherlands in February, 2006.

In March, 2006, at the World All Round Championships in Calgary, she achieved first place finishes in the 500m, 1500m, 3000m, and 5000m events, which culminated with Cindy winning first place overall at the World All Round Championships.

This native of Winnipeg, Manitoba has always been an elite athlete with unparalleled determination, flexibility, perseverance and determination. In addition to playing field lacrosse at the 1994 Commonwealth Games, Cindy spent 14 years playing men's hockey reaching the AAA level. She spent one year with the women's junior national hockey team and, upon being released just prior to the 1998 Olympics, she moved into speed skating at the age of 18.

Since that time, Cindy has consistently demonstrated her amazing athletic abilities. Cindy became a member of the Women's National Speed Skating Team in 1999, and won a Bronze medal at the 2002 Salt Lake City Winter Olympic Games in the 3000m event. She also finished 4th in the 1500m and 5000m events, and 13th in the 1000m event. Undeterred by a training accident that lacerated her forearm and caused tendon damage, Cindy came back in true style after missing most of the 2003/2004 season to win Silver and Bronze medals in the World Single Distance Championships at the end of that same season.

Congratulations to an outstanding person and Canadian athlete: Cindy Klassen, the Calgary Booster Club's Female Athlete of the Year for 2007.

The Calgary Athlete of the Year Award was started in 1958 by the Calgary Press Radio TV Sports Club. The Calgary Booster Club has coordinated the recognition program since 1990 as part of its continuing dedication to the development and encouragement of athletic endeavour since 1952.

Miikka has played professionally in Sweden, Finland and the National Hockey League. He began in the NHL in 1995 when drafted by the San Jose Sharks. Since joining the Calgary Flames in 2003, he has shown tremendous growth and development as a player. Miikka Kiprusoff, the 50th Scott-Mamini Memorial Award honoree, enjoyed an outstanding 2006 while playing with the Calgary Flames. Miikka earned the Vezina trophy as the NHL's top goaltender, and was a finalist for the Hart Trophy as the NHL's regular season MVP. He was also an NHL First All Star Team selection. In addition, he set new Flames' records for wins (42) in a season and individual shutouts with 10, and was second in the NHL for number of wins.

Moreover, Miikka captured the William Jennings Trophy for the team allowing the fewest goals against, with an impressive 1.69 goals against average.

This thirty-one year old goaltender, from Turku, Finland, is legendary for his physical and mental preparation. Miikka is well known for his stand up style and ability to withstand pressure. Indeed, he has a reputation for being 'hard to rattle' when in the net. A fan favorite, "Kipper" is seen as a goalie who 'plays big and makes big plays', using his physical stature and presence. His success as a net minder is not limited to the NHL. Miikka led Team Finland in the 2004 World Cup of Hockey to a Silver Medal, losing in the final to Team Canada. Chosen to play for Finland in the 2006 Turin Winter Olympics, Kiprusoff declined due to a recurring hip injury. His decision brought benefits in the form of his best professional season ever in 2006. The Calgary Booster Club is pleased to honour Miikka Kiprusoff as the Calgary Booster Club Male Athlete of the Year for 2007.

Scott-Mamini Award

The Scott-Mamini Award, initiated by the Calgary Press-Radio-TV Sports Club in 1958, was presented annually to the city's Athlete of the Year as chosen by the media. That format continued until 1987 when the Scott-Mamini became the Male Athlete of the Year recognition. It is named for Harry Scott, Sports Editor at the Calgary Albertan and Bob Mamini, the Sports Department Head at the Calgary Herald. Both men were highly respected across the country during the 1930's and 1940's.

Sports Wall of Fame



In 1984, the Calgary Booster Club approved the concept of a permanent display of recognition for its leadership and athletic award winners. After reviewing potential locations and arranging the necessary funds, an agreement was reached between the Club and the Board of Directors of the Lindsay Park Sports Centre (now the Talisman Centre) to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility.

The Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame was opened to the public on December 9, 1987. As each year's group of award recipients is announced, their names will be added to the display providing a complete history of the best in Calgary athletes. The Wall will be updated through the current renovations at the Talisman Centre.

Olympic Torch Display



The Calgary Booster Club passed a motion on September 11, 1978 to look into the possibility of Calgary hosting the 1988 Olympic Winter Games.

On February 13, 1988 Harry Maubert, representing the Calgary Booster Club, used the torch to officially light the cauldron at the Olympic Plaza.

Petro Canada, sponsor of the cross-Canada torch relay, presented this torch to the Calgary Booster Club on June 6, 1988 in recognition of the club's major contribution to the XV Olympic Winter Games. The torch is on display in conjunction with the Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame at the Talisman Centre.



Since 1954, the annual Sportsman's Dinner has been dedicated to the person(s) selected Calgary Booster Club Sportsman of the Year. The Sportsman has customarily been one of the city's athletic leaders who has greatly contributed to the local sport scene. To further recognize these outstanding Calgarians, the Booster Club maintains a permanent pictorial showcase of all Sportsman of the Year honorees.

The Sportsman of the Year Wall was unveiled at the ATCO VIP Centre at Canada Olympic Park

on March 25, 1990 and at the time of the unveiling contained the pictures of the Calgary Booster Club's 45 award recipients. As each year's winner is announced, their picture is added to the display.

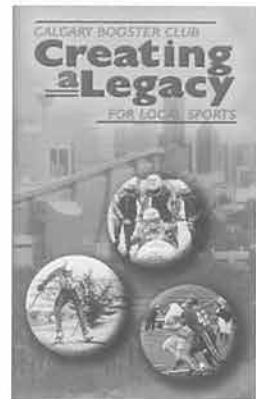

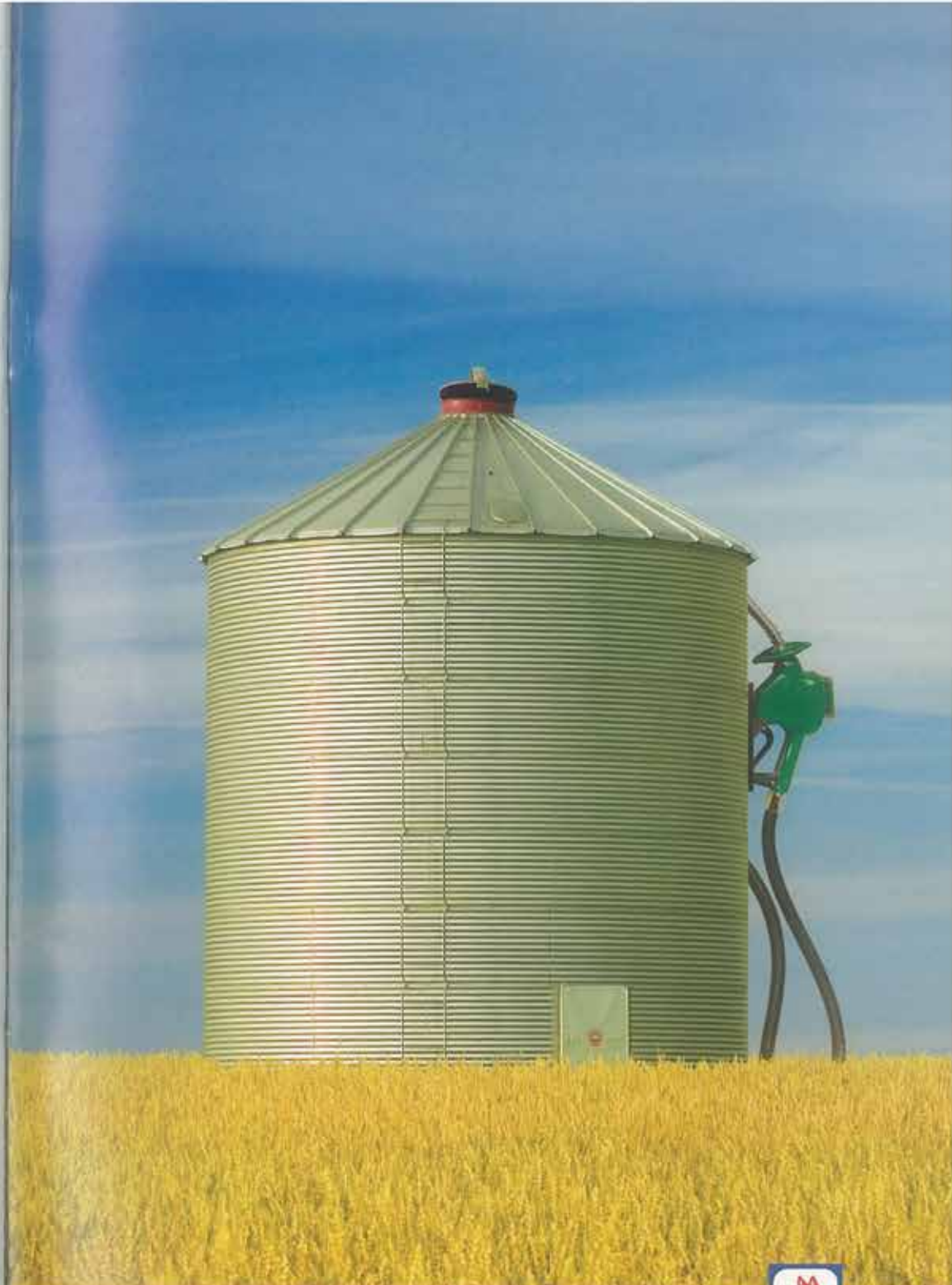
