2015 SPORTSMAN OF THE YEAR Christine Hampshire



The Calgary Booster Club considers it a privilege to honour Christine Hampshire as our 2015 Sportsman Of The Year Award Winner. For over 35 years she has been involved in the development and expansion of Synchronized Swimming in Calgary as a volunteer. Chris has had many roles including judges chairperson, recreation chair, competitions chair and president. She is also a past president of the Lindsay Park Sport Society and competition chairman for Synchro Canada.

In 1980, Chris started out as a volunteer parent for Synchronized Swimming, became a founding member of the Killarney Synchro program and their president for 15 years. She is also the past president of the very successful Calgary Aquabells and has been an international judge for over 25 years, reaching a level 5 which is as high as you can go. Chris has been instrumental in developing a strong base of officials and event management in Alberta at all levels

of competition.

From 1996 to 1998 she was a global volunteer representing Calgary in Malaysia, to help initiate the infrastructure required to develop the sport of Synchronizes Swimming into their country while providing the necessary education and training to host the Commonwealth games in 1998.

A few honors bestowed on Chris include Calgary Booster Club Honoured Athletic Leader in 2006, Synchro Canada Bridge Builder Award in 2010, Alberta Sports Hall Of Fame inductee in 2011 and President's Honor Roll- Synchro Canada in 2013.

The International Pan American Synchro Championships are being hosted by Calgary this year and Chris is the Meet Manager in charge of these Age Class Championships.

It is rare that one comes across a volunteer with the commitment, dedication and expertise that Chris brings to and so willingly gives to Synchronized Swimming. Her influence on the sport over the years has grown from the local level to provincial, national and international levels and made her an icon to literally hundreds of people involved in Synchronized Swimming.

In summary, Chris has devoted 35 years as a volunteer to Synchronized Swimming as a Builder, Administrator and Judge and is still active as a Judge in the sport today. She has made a significant contribution to amateur sport in Calgary and for these reasons and many more, the Calgary Booster Club is proud to honour Chris Hampshire as our 62nd Sportsman Of The Year Award recipient.




Grant has been working as a sports anchor and reporter in Calgary at Global, which was formerly Channels 2&7 when he was hired back in 1983. He achieved his career goal of being a part of the TV crew doing NHL games. He has never had more fun in TV than the 9 years doing Sports @ 11, but the biggest enjoyment in his 35 years of TV in both Calgary and Barrie, Ontario and still today, is covering amateur sports.

Angela started her broadcasting career over 30 years ago in radio in Nanaimo. She moved to Calgary in the early 80's working for CBC TV, QR Radio and then Global Television. Angela has been a news reporter and co-host of Global TV's Morning News. Today she is the afternoon host of Calgary Today on Newstalk 770.

Grant and Angela have been together since 1994, they have two children, both living in Toronto.

GUEST SPEAKER





Brian Burke joined the Calgary Flames Hockey Club on September 5, 2013 in the newly created role, President of Hockey Operations. He is responsible for overseeing all hockey operations for the Flames organization. The 58-year-old Burke, brings over 20 years of National Hockey League experience in various roles to the franchise. In 1,145 games as a general manager in Hartford (84 games: 1992-93), Vancouver (492 games: 1998-99 to 2003-04), Anaheim (263 games: 2005-06 to 2008-09) and Toronto (306 games: 2008-09 to 2012-13), Burke has accumulated a record of 521-449-74-101. Additionally, he worked in the NHL front office for five years as executive vice president and director of hockey operations, under Commissioner Gary Bettman.

Prior to assuming his current position in Calgary, Burke was president and general manager of the Toronto Maple Leafs, a title he assumed on November 29, 2008 becoming the 13th general manager in Maple Leafs history. He parted ways with the Leafs on January 9, 2013 and became a pro scout and consultant with the Anaheim Ducks.

As executive vice president and general manager of the Anaheim Ducks from 2005 to 2008, Burke guided the Ducks to their first Stanley Cup in 2007, first Pacific Division title (2007), and first two 100+ point seasons (2006-07 and 2007-08). He was ranked No. 1 by The Hockey News in the magazine's Annual GM Rankings in March of 2008, and was a finalist for The Hockey News Executive of the Year in 2006. Burke was also named the Sporting News Executive of the Year in 2001, and was a runner-up for the same award following the 2005-06 season.

Since the 2000-01 season, Burke's teams have qualified for the Stanley Cup playoffs seven times, playing in 13 total post-season series. In addition, those seven clubs recorded at least 90+ points, including four 100-point seasons.

In March 2012, Burke was appointed to the Hockey Hall of Fame's Selection Committee. He is also an original member of the US Men's National Team Advisory Group that was formed in 2007 to assist USA Hockey with the selection of players and staff of Men's National Teams, including the Olympics. He served as the general manager of the 2010 US Olympic Hockey Team, which won a silver medal at the 2010 Winter Olympic Games in Vancouver, and was general manager of the US World Championship teams in 1993, 2009 and 2010. On August 7, 2008, Burke was recognized for his outstanding service to hockey in the United States when he was named the recipient of the 2008 Lester Patrick Award.

Away from the rink, Burke is well-known for his work within the community. He is a vocal activist against homophobia in sports, a strong supporter of first response personnel and military service members, an environmentalist and a humanitarian. His most recent appointment was to the Board of Directors for Rugby Canada, a sport he fondly has referred to as his "second favourite sport."

In honour of his late son Brendan, Burke has been a spokesperson for the 'You Can Play Project' since it was co-founded by his son Patrick in 2011. Brendan was a homosexual working as a hockey operations assistant at Miami University at the time of his death. 'You Can Play' is dedicated to ensuring equality, respect and safety for all athletes, without regard to sexual orientation. Burke has also marched in numerous Toronto Pride Parades in Brendan's memory and has candidly spoken out against homophobia and bullying. Alongside several city councillors and representatives of the group Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays (PFLAG), he helped raise the Pride flag outside Toronto's City Hall in May 2011. Burke is also a member of Egale, Canada's largest lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) human rights organization.

In April 2011, Burke was named Youth Role Model of the Year by Jer's Vision given to a community leader dedicated to fighting homophobia and bullying. Jer's Vision is Canada's youth diversity initiative, which works to address bullying, homophobia, transphobia and discrimination of all kinds in schools and youth communities. Burke also received the Straight Ally Legacy Award from the Federation of Gay Games (FGG) in October 2011, PFLAG Toronto's Ally Award in January 2012, and was honoured by Courage Campaign Institute with a Spirit of Courage Award in September 2012 for his continuing work and dedication in the LGBT community. In 2010, USA Hockey created the 'Brendan Burke Internship,' which is an annual internship for a recent college graduate interested in pursuing hockey operations as a career.

Burke is a devoted supporter of Police Services and was given honourary Police Chief status in Toronto in April 2012. In November 2011, he purchased and donated a horse named Moose to Toronto's Mounted Police Unit in memory of his late son Brendan, who shared the same nickname.

In May 2011, Burke and the Honourable John P. Manley, President and CEO, of the Canadian Council of Chief Executives, were presented with the Easter Seals Toronto's Tribute Award for lending support to kids with physical disabilities and for excellence in business and community service.

Burke is also heavily involved with the military, visiting bases within Canada, the United States and Afghanistan. He has been associated with the Wounded Warrior Project since 2003, which honours and empowers wounded warriors. The programs raises awareness and enlists the public's aid for the needs of injured service members, helps injured servicemen and women aid and assist each other, and provides unique, direct programs and services to meet their needs. At the 2010 Olympics, Burke and a volunteer group called Operation Homefront paired each of the 23 hockey players on Team USA with service members wounded in Iraq or Afghanistan. He felt the players would have extra pride and motivation to not only be representing their country, but an American war hero wounded in battle.

Burke is an avid supporter of many philanthropic organizations, devoting time and making numerous donations to each. Some of these organizations include: Ducks Unlimited Canada (DUC), a registered charity that partners with government, industry, non-profit organizations and landowners to conserve wetlands that are critical to waterfowl, wildlife and the environment; the Canadian Safe School Network (CSSN), a national, not-for-profit, registered charitable organization with a mandate to reduce youth violence and make our schools and communities safer; Big Brothers Big Sisters of Canada, who commit to Canada's young people to be leaders in providing them with the highest quality, volunteer-based mentoring programs; Special Olympics which provides year-round sports training and athletic competition in a variety of Olympic-type sports for children and adults with intellectual disabilities; and Kids, Cops & Computers Merry-Go-Round

Children's Foundation which enables financially disadvantaged students to achieve excellence in their academic and personal pursuits by providing them with brand-new computers and police mentorship.

Burke took part in the 2012 Sleep Out for Homeless Kids, helping raise awareness and funds for Covenant House. He also attended the official launch of the 2012 Shoppers Drug Mart Tree of Life Campaign in support of Toronto East General Hospital, was an honoured guest at the 2012 CAMH Healthy Minds dinner to raise awareness for mental health, and supported the Rick Hansen 25th Anniversary Relay in 2011 to raise awareness and commemorate Hansen's Man in Motion World Tour commencing its historic cross-Canada journey.

Born in Providence, Rhode Island but raised in Edina, Minnesota, Burke is a graduate of Providence College. While attending Providence, he played for the Friars Division-I hockey team. As a professional he played in the AHL, capturing the Calder Cup with the Maine Mariners in 1978. After one year in the AHL, Burke attended Harvard Law School, graduating in 1981.

MIKE BOYLES - Football / Baseball

Mike is a two-time recipient of the Stan Schwartz award for the Volunteer Coach of the year. He has been a volunteer football coach at high schools since 1990. Mike chairs the Nathan Bennor Golf Tournament, which is a major fundraiser for men's volleyball. He also chairs a Baseball fundraising dinner each year. He is a volunteer administrator for the Canadian Intramural Recreation Association and a Director with the Health and Physical Education Council. He is also one of our own! He has been a Director with the Calgary Booster Club since 2009, serving as President in 2012-2013. Mike's dedication to Football, Baseball and sport as a whole

make him a worthy recipient for the Honoured Athletic Award.



DAVID DILUZIO - Football

David has been a coach and administrator for 23 years. He constantly shows empathy for all his players and works on developing character and instilling leadership qualities in them. Paul has been involved in High School and Community football since 1989. He was the driving force behind developing and piloting the Sport Performance Programs in Calgary High Schools. He was part of the coaching staff of the Calgary Colts Junior Football program that were National champions in 1989 and 1990. He coached the NW Cowboys from 2001 to 2011. He was a volunteer coach at Calgary Christian High School from 2011 to 2013. In 2003 He was recognized as the NFL/CFL Coach of the Year for Canada. This is an award that is based on character and citizenship as well as on-field success. He also holds national coaching

certification in football, basketball and wrestling. Paul has motivated past players to give back to the sport they love by volunteering. He is an Alberta Sports Hall of Fame member and we are pleased to recognize him this year as a Calgary Booster Club Honoured Athletic Leader.

BILL MITCHELL - Basketball

For 35 years, Bill has been involved in High School, Community, Club and University Basketball programs. He is a true believer in the life lessons to be learned from sports. Bill shows a high level of integrity and initiative. He coached 11 teams to City High School Championships with 8 of those going on to the Alberta Provincial Championships. He spent 10 years with the CIS Woman's Select Team and 10 years as the Director of Basketball Development at the University of Calgary's Grade 7-12 Program. In 2003, Bill was given the CSHSAA Wayne Thomas Coaching Award. Bill mentors young teachers and community coaches. He is a devoted supporter of

a student initiative that integrated special needs students into regular physical activity and intramural programs. The Calgary Booster Club is pleased to recognize Bill as an Honoured Athletic Leader.



TOM MOLLOY - Hockey

Tom has been involved with hockey for fifty years. He played college and semi-pro hockey and has coached for over thirty years. Tom is quietly a huge influence on everyone he works with – from the beginning skater to the college hockey player. He demonstrates the patience and passion that has affected hundreds of young athletes and helped them achieve their full potential. Tom has had an impact locally by coaching several community teams and at the University of Calgary, SAIT and Mount Royal. Tom has also had an international impact. He set up Finland's National Coaching program and was the Head Coach for Austria's National Team. From 1988

to 1997, South Korea sent their National team players to Calgary so that Tom could be their Skills Development Coach. Tom has also given back to his coaching peers by writing a book entitled Hockey Coaching – The ABCs of International Hockey and by establishing a coach's website that is the most widely-read coaching site in the world. Tom is the epitome of the spirit of a Calgary Booster Club Honoured Athletic Leader.




HARINGTON TELFORD - Luge

Harington competed in Luge in the 1988 and 1992 Olympics. He never left the sport and has been a volunteer for 30 years. He has worked with the Junior Developmental Programs and coached athletes who went on to become Olympians. Since 1988, he has touched the life of every Olympic slider in one way or another. The hours he spends volunteering are too numerous to count. He is a fixture on the track as a board member, a coach or an official. He has refused many offers to become a paid coach, preferring to see the money go back into the program. The Canadian Luge Association has said that "without Harington, Luge in Alberta and Canada

would not be experiencing the success we have today." The Alberta Luge Association honoured him in 2013 for Outstanding Contribution to the Sport of Luge. Harington's positive attitude and commitment to the sport of Luge has made him a deserving recipient of the Calgary Booster Club's Honoured Athletic Leader award.

HENRY VINEY TROPHY WINNER Kaillie Humphries



Kaillie Humphries won her third consecutive "Viney Award" for an incredible 2014 season during which she reunited with her 2010 Olympic gold medal-winning teammate, Heather Moyse to again dominate the sport of women's bobsleigh. For her accomplishments in 2014 Kaillie was recognized as Canada's top athlete and awarded the 2014 Lou Marsh Award. Humphries is the first bobsledder to win the honour.

Kaillie captured her second consecutive Olympic gold medal in Sochi, and carried Canada's flag along with brakeman Heather Moyse into the closing ceremonies.

A month earlier, Humphries had claimed her second consecutive overall World Cup title for Canada.

In 2014 Kaillie made bobsleigh history as she became the first female to compete in a four-man bobsled competition.

As a lifetime resident of Calgary, Kaillie has made a commitment to giving back to the community when she is at home during competition breaks and during the off-season. At Christmas time, Kaillie and her family donate time to help feed those less fortunate through a dinner program at the homeless shelter. Kaillie is also an active member with three elementary schools in the Calgary area, Cedarbrae Elementary, Woodbine Elementary, and the Big Rock School (Okotoks). At these schools, Kaillie is a mentor and speaks to students about the importance of setting goals, exercise and saying "No" to drugs.

The Scott-Mamini Award, initiated by the Calgary Press-Radio-TV Sports Club in 1958, was presented annually to the city's Athlete of the Year as chosen by the media. That format continued until 1987 when the Scott-Mamini became the Male Athlete of the Year recognition. It is named for Harry Scott, Sports Editor at the Calgary Albertan and Bob Mamini, the Sports Department Head at the Calgary Herald. SCOTT-MAMINI AWARD WINNER

Andrew Buckley



Andrew Buckley is a 4th year quarterback with the University of Calgary Dinos football team. Starting at the University of Calgary in the quarterback position is no easy task, but Andrew earned the starting position over a very capable Eric Dzwilewski (2012 Canada West MVP) and made the most of his opportunity to lead the Dinos offense. Andrew accounted for 28 touchdowns this season, 18 passing (3rd in the country) and 10 rushing (2nd in the country) while playing just over 6 games. Statistically Andrew finished the season 8th overall in CIS passing yardage at 2175 yards for 271.9 yards per game. He threw the ball 221 times and completed 142 passes for a 64.3% completion percentage with only 4 interceptions. On the ground, Andrew rushed the ball 48 times for 510 yards for a 10.6 yards per carry average, and was the top rushing quarterback

in the CIS this season. Under Andrew's leadership, the Dinos were the highest scoring team in the CIS, averaging 52.4 points per game.

Andrew's coaching staff has said "Very few QB's have ever been able to pass and run as effective as Andrew Buckley. He accounted for 28 TDs (18 Passing & 10 Running. His statistics are very impressive, but what is more impressive is that he only played the equivalent of 6.25 games. There is no question that he would have challenged any and all stats had he played more. He is an outstanding leader and competitor. He reads exceptionally well, is unselfish and is viewed by many as extremely humble."

Away from the field, the graduate of Calgary's Rundle College is an honours student in the Faculty of Kinesiology and hopes to follow his father's footsteps into a career in orthopedic surgery following graduation. A three-time Academic All-Canadian in the classroom, he has been involved in several research studies, including one looking at a new method to reduce stiffness of the elbow joint by testing difference trial doses of a promising drug. The findings of this study were presented in 2014 at the Orthopaedic Trauma Association (Tampa, Fla.) and the Canadian Orthopaedic Association (Montreal).

Andrew has always made it a priority to give back to his school, his community, and other great causes. Andrew volunteers with Alberta Health Services, where he is paired with two elderly Alzheimer's patients, providing companionship for three hours per week as well as relief for full-time caregivers. He embarked on a 10-day humanitarian trip to Guatemala to build efficient wood-burning stoves to replace dangerous open fires within homes. Andrew is a true student-athlete excelling both on the field and in the classroom. The Kinesiology student maintains a grade point average over 3.8 and has been the recipient of the Calgary Booster Club Scholar-Athlete award at the University of Calgary in 2013 and 2014.

For his efforts on the field and in the classroom Andrew was recognized in 2014 with the Hec Crighton award as the CIS top football player and the prestigious Russ Jackson Award, given to a CIS football player that exemplifies excellence in the classroom, on the field and by volunteering. Andrew is the first athlete to receive both awards in the same year. Andrew also received the Russ Jackson award in 2013.





His favourite sport is powerlifting and his outstanding stats include; bench pressing 200 pounds (91kg), squatting 395 pounds (179 kg) and dead lifting 430 pounds (195kg).


Spencer's success in Special Olympics started when he was 24 years old and he represented Special Olympics Canada in track and field at the Paralympic Games in Barcelona, Spain. Spencer competed in the 100 and 200 meter races, and came home extremely proud, by achieving personal bests in both races.

Over the years, Spencer focused on powerlifting, and in 2010 he was part of Team Alberta at the Special Olympics National Summer Games in London, Ontario. He excelled in his sport and won 3 silver medals and 1 bronze.

In July 2013, Spencer was a member of Team Calgary competing at the Special Olympics Alberta Provincial Summer Games in the sport of powerlifting. He won 3 gold medals and qualified to be on Team Alberta to compete at the Special Olympics Canada National Summer Games in 2014. Unfortunately, in October 2013 while at work, Spencer ended up with a serious eye injury and he did not know if he would be able to continue to participate in sports, or compete at the upcoming National Games. Spencer worked extremely hard to prove that he could still participate and represent Team Alberta at Nationals. He did, and went on to win 3 gold, 1 silver medal and achieved a personal best in Squat.

Outside of Special Olympics, Spencer also competes in powerlifting events against individuals without a disability through the RAW Powerlifting Federation.

Spencer is currently a member of the Special Olympics Calgary Athlete Leadership Committee and mentors other athletes in the powerlifting program. He is always eager to share his knowledge of the sport to help others grow, not just in sport, but in life.

In 2014 Jazmyne was the National Champion and a member of the Bronze Medal team at the World Team Trials. She has been 5th at the Pan Am Championships, 3rd at the German Grand Prix and 1st at the Austria Ladies Open. Her summer FILA ranking is 17th in the world for 58kg.

Jessica Groeneveld - Slalom Canoe/Kayak

Jessica was to 2013 Pan American Champion in Kayak Slalom. In 2014 she was the winner of the 2015 Toronto PanAm test event. She is consistently the top internationally ranked Canadian and has been first boat on the National team since 2012. Her goal for 2015 is to qualify Canada for an Olympic spot and to win the PanAm games. Not only a great athlete, Jessica is a role model for Alberta athletes, acting as mother duckling on the river, giving presentations on nutrition and guiding strength sessions.

Keil Hillis – Short Track Speed Skating

Keil achieved his 2014 goal of a top 10 Finish in National Qualifiers #1 including a 4th place finish in the 500 m. He was also a member of both Alberta Provincial Short Track and Long Track teams. He has big goals for 2015, looking for a top 5 finish in National Qualifier #2, a top 10 finish at the National Team Selections, making the National Development Team Short Track and the Work Cup Qualifiers.

Lauren McGuire - Speed Skating

Lauren made her debut on the National Development Team in 2012. She got her first podium finishes with two silver medals in the 3000m and 1500m at the 2013 North American Championships. The following year she represented Canada at her first World Cups. This season she competed in four World Cups, was the silver medalist in the 3000m and 4th place finisher in the 1500m at the Canadian World Cup Selection. She was the Gold medalist in the both 1500m and 3000m at the Canada Cup #3 this past February. Lauren gives back to Speed Skating, promoting her sport and inspiring young skaters. It is common to see her helping them on and off the ice.

Robin Randall - Water Polo

In 2011 Robin was part of the 2nd place team at the Pan American games (a Canadian best). In 2012, the team placed 5th at the 2012 Olympic Qualification Tournament. In 2013, they won the 2013 World Quals (a Canadian first) and placed 11th at the World Championships. They were also 4th at the National Championships. In 2014, they were 6th in the World League Super Finals. Robin's goals for 2015 are to win gold at home for the 2015 Pan American Games, qualify for the 2016 Olympics and place in the top 6 at the World League Super Finals.

Joshua Riker-Fox - Modern Pentathlon

2014 was a very positive competitive year for Joshua. He met the Canadian National Team standard and was the top Canadian at every competition he attended. In 2014, he won gold in the Alberta Open Series and at the Ontario Invitational Open and the Canadian Championships. He competed internationally winning bronze at the Tlaxcala Mexico Open and the USA Pentathlon Open Championships. At the Pan American Championships he was 5th as an individual and won gold as part of the relay team. Already in 2015 he has won gold at the Ontario Winter Invitational, bronze at the Sarasota World Cup relay and came 8th at the USA Pentathlon Selection. He is ranked #1 in Canada. In January Joshua was the top Canadian athlete at the first of three selection events for the Pan Am Games. He is hoping to qualify to compete there and medal. He also aspires to compete in the Olympic Games in Brazil.

Andrew Wolfe - Figure Skating

Andrew competed as a singles skater in 2012/2013 coming 9th at the Skate Canada Challenge and 12th at the Canadian Championships. In 2013/2014 he improved to 5th and 7th respectively at those same championships. In the 2014/2015 season, he started competing as a Pairs skater. He and his partner placed 3rd at the Skate Canada Challenge and 6th at the Canadian Championships. They also competed in the Autumn Classic Canada (Challenger Series), placing 4th and the Cup of China Grand Prix, placing 6th. Andrew and his partner aim to land themselves on the National team at the end of the year. They intend to represent Canada at competitions on the ISU Grand Prix Circuit, Challenger Series and potentially the Four Continents Figure Skating Championships.

The Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association was established in 1913 to provide competitive athletic opportunities for students in Calgary high schools. The Association believes that the interscholastic athletic program, as a recognized part of the school program, is educationally sound and will enhance the physical, mental, emotional and social development of young people.

Annually, 10,000 student athletes participate in twelve sports including football, cross country, soccer, volleyball, diving, wrestling, basketball, swimming, rugby, track and field, badminton and field hockey.

The CSHSAA is unique in many ways, but is recognized nationally for its belief that the amalgamation of Calgary's two educational systems into one common athletic association is in the best interests of the residents of Calgary. As such, the Calgary Board of Education and the Calgary Catholic School District have worked together harmoniously for decades. As well, the partnership with the Calgary Booster Club over the past five decades has been beneficial to hundreds of student athletes.

Our partnership with the Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association goes back to 1956 when we presented our first scholarship to Jack Sharpe of Western Canada for the inaugural Harry Hood Memorial Football Award. Since then we have honoured and recognized 456 individual high school winners for a total of \$297,500 and an additional 276 student athletes with maximum participation scholarships in the last 24 years for another \$91,500. This amounts to a total investment of \$389,000 for outstanding student athletes in the C.S.H.S.A.A. program.

This season, she set a new Canada West record for assists with 918 and for the first time in her career was named a conference second team All-Star. Bogdan Knezevic - Men's Swimming

For the second year in a row, fifth-year Bogdan Knezevic has been named a Calgary Booster Club Scholar-Athlete. He also shows no fear, blocking shots with impunity and often going into the corner with players twice his size. Cartier is on the first power play, the first penalty kill and along with line mate Tyler Fiddler, they are the first players sent out the door when Coach Gilling needs a big shift.

Cody's 2014-15 campaign was simply remarkable. In 28 games he had 39 points good for an average of 1.39 per game. He finished third in the scoring race to a pair of line mates from the #1 Alberta Golden Bears. Cody scored eight more points than fellow first liner Tyler Fiddler and led the entire conference with 25 assists. He twice recorded a hat trick and had 12 multi-point games. He was also selected to represent Canada at the 2015 FISU University Games in Granada, Spain.

Jayla Verney - Women's Basketball

Jayla had a breakout rookie campaign in 2014-15 with Mount Royal. The Halifax native led the Cougars in scoring and was in the top five in nearly every major statistical category for her team. Her ball-handling skills and ability to drive often left defenders scratching their heads when the sensational rookie came down the floor.

Verney started all 20 games for the Cougars this season averaging 28.9 minutes per game. Her 14.8 points per game were the most by any Cougar, nearly five more than her next closest teammate. She was also in the top five in rebounding, assists and free throw percentage on MRU.

In the conference she was league's leading rookie scorer and was tenth in all of Canada West. Three times she eclipsed the 20-point mark, including her career-high night on the road at UNBC when she dropped 28 on the Timberwolves.

Tyler Schmidt - Men's Volleyball

Tyler is this season's Canada West Rookie of the Year. The Calgary, Alberta native is the first male Cougar athlete to win top rookie honours. Carolyn O'Dwyer of the women's program won the award two seasons ago.

Megan Brennan's third season with the Trojans women's volleyball team saw the powerful outside re-write the record books at SAIT. Her record-breaking year started in the first semester when she became the school's all-time leader in kills on Nov. 21 against Ambrose University, surpassing the mark of 531 set by Daly Donaghy. His hard work helped SAIT reach their second-straight ACAC Championship Final, where they hoped to successfully defend their title won the season before. Despite having to settle for silver this year, Forbes was his team's best forward in the final series, scoring three goals and adding an assist in two games. Forbes' success extends to the classroom. He is a successful Civil Engineering Technology student in his first year of the program.

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SPORTS WALL OF FAME AND OLYMPIC TORCH DISPLAY

For over 60 years the Calgary Booster Club has woven itself into the fabric of our community. Often standing behind the scenes, the Club has endeavoured to recognize the leadership that has made Calgary athletic programs so vibrant and to celebrate and support individual athletic accomplishments.

In 1984 the Calgary Booster Club approved the concept of a permanent display of recognition for leadership and athletic award winners. An agreement was reached between the Club and Board of Directors of the Talisman Centre to house the display in their highly used public athletic facility, The Calgary Booster Club Sports Wall of Fame was opened to the public on December 9, 1987. By 1998 no more names could be added and the display was beginning to deteriorate.

The original wall was removed during 2010 renovations when Talisman Centre was closed for roof repairs.

On February 13, 1988, Harry Maubert, 1978 Sportsman of the Year, representing the Calgary Booster Club, used the torch to officially light the cauldron at the Olympic Plaza.

Petro Canada, sponsor of the Cross Canada torch relay presented this torch to the Club on June 6, 1988 in recognition of the Calgary Booster Club's major contribution to the XV Olympic Winter Games.



The 2010 torch was donated by Ernie McCullough, a founding member of the Calgary Boost Club and president of the Calgary Olympic Development Association (CODA) which submitted Calgary's first Olympic bid.

This torch is of special significance not only because of Ernie's early contributions but also because he represented Canada as a track and field athlete at the 1948 London Games. Sixty two years later, he carried this torch as part of the cross Canada relay tour.
