



2017 SPORTSMAN OF THE YEAR



Jack Gregory has been the ambassador as well as the face of Special Olympics Calgary for nearly three decades. He has served as a Board member for the Special Olympics for over 20 years and is currently Past Chairman of the Board. Jack also continues as a Special Olympics coach in both curling and golf. Jack has made numerous donations along with providing subsidized sports equipment and uniforms for Special Olympic events and programs. Jack has represented Special Olympic Calgary provincially, nationally and internationally. Jack's involvement goes much more than that. He is now renting the front office section of Tuxedo Source for Sports to Special Olympics Calgary. When Tuxedo Source for Sports celebrated their

50th anniversary in 2010, they hosted a celebration gala and auction which raised \$50,000 for Special Olympics Calgary. Jack's generosity, kindness and love for the Special Olympic athletes has never wavered for the last 28 years.

Jack has served as a coach in both baseball and hockey and has volunteered and supported numerous fundraisers and casinos for sport groups in Calgary. Jack and Tuxedo Source for Sports have contributed all types of sports equipment to virtually every minor sport in Calgary. Much of this equipment was donated or given to sport groups at deeply discounted costs.

Jack was instrumental in establishing the very first Calgary Minor Hockey Equipment Drive that provides gear to families that would otherwise be unable to afford new equipment. The funds collected started one of the first player subsidy programs allowing less fortunate kids the opportunity to play hockey. Jack later helped create the first Calgary Minor Hockey Golf Tournament, where all funds raised were used to subsidize deserving hockey players. Jack through his business signed Bauer Hockey as the major tournament sponsor, ensuring the tournament was successful for many years. Jack has received multiple awards for his contributions to both Calgary Minor Hockey and Little League Baseball.

Jack and Tuxedo Source for Sports have been actively involved with Mac's Hockey tournament for over 30 years. He is currently the Director of the Mac's Tournament Scholarship Program which awards a total of eight \$1500 scholarships each year. Jack continues to support the tournament in many ways which may include driving a truck, supervision of ticket sales and deliveries.

Jack has been involved with the Calgary Oldtimers Hockey Association for more than 20 years, providing financial support to deserving athletes, Junior A, university and college hockey teams and awarding academic scholarships to a wide range of athletes. Jack has served on multiple committees within the Association and is currently the Vice President.

The Calgary Booster Club takes great pride in recognizing Jack Gregory as the 2017 Sportsman of the Year.

The Dare to Care program impacts over 65,000 children, youth, and adults each year and has had a significant impact in creating and maintaining safe and inclusive environments for children and youth.

Lisa is a former member of the Canadian National Swim Team and a current World Masters champion. Lisa was inducted into the University of Calgary's Sports Hall of Fame in 2015.

Perry Cavanah's contribution to sport in Calgary over the last 25 years is very impressive. He began volunteering as a coach for his son's hockey team and quickly moved into the administration side of the sport. Throughout his many roles, Perry has had a lasting impact on hockey and other sports in Calgary. He has helped build numerous facilities within the city and has raised awareness of the remaining athletic facility shortages.

Once moving to the administration side of hockey, Perry became President of Southern Alberta Tyke Hockey Association, the Properties Sports Hockey Association and the Calgary Minor Hockey Association. After being elected to the Calgary Minor Hockey Association Board of Directors in 1998, he served for 2 terms as President and implemented the inaugural "Respect in Sport" parent program, helping parents understand the critical role they play in their child's sport life. Perry also successfully took on the challenge of Co-chair of the 2012 IIHF World Junior Championship Organizing Committee.

Perry currently volunteers his time sitting on the Comrie's Sports Equipment Bank Society Board, holds the position of Executive Director and General Manager of the Don Hartman North East Sportsplex and is the Chairman of Sport Calgary. Perry and Sport Calgary recently delivered the "All Sport in One Day" for youth, a program that allows young athletes to try a variety of different sports in one day at no cost, and launched "All Sport One City", an initiative to encourage adult activity and participation in sport.

Hayley's passion for hockey extends to the community as she has worked tirelessly to promote women's hockey in Canada and throughout the world. She visits schools, created the "Stepping

Out" initiative and volunteers with the "Right to Play", the international humanitarian organization aimed at helping children through play.

In partnership with Girls Hockey Calgary and The Rocky Mountain Female Hockey league, Hayley hosts Wickfest, an annual Hockey Festival that engages more than 1500 female hockey players. Hayley was also a recipient of the Order of Canada in 2011 for her efforts both on and off the ice.

Athletic Leaders



Dr. Don Stouffer

A personal story of success, be it as an athlete, coach or as an administrator is quite remarkable in and of itself. Don Stouffer has managed to be all three.

As a youngster growing up in Lethbridge, Don's innate talent as a skilled athlete and team leader was identified and nurtured. Don was very successful as a multi-sport athlete. In baseball, he and his teammates on the Lethbridge Tigers earned the right to attend the Little League World Series in Chicago in 1953. The Tigers were the

Canadian Pony League Champions in 1955. In hockey, he was the captain of the 1956/57 Alberta Midget "A" Hockey Championship Team. In football, he was one of the team captains of the 1957 Alberta High School Football Champion L.C.I. Rams. In basketball, he was a member of the 1957/58 Alberta High School "A" Champion L.C.I. Rams. Don was voted the Colorado College Athlete of the Year in 1962/63, when he was the team captain, MVP and leading scorer of the Colorado College Tiger Hockey Team.

Don began his teaching career at Mount Royal College in the fall of 1967. His talent as a coach was soon recognized when the MRC Men's Hockey Team earned the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference Championship in 1968/69. As a golf coach, Don guided the MRC Golf Team to a total of 14 ACAC Championships.

While at Mount Royal College, Don worked as the Athletic Director, was the Department Chair of Physical Education and Recreation Studies and was the Dean of the Faculty of Community and Health Studies. Don and Al Bohonus propelled the Mount Royal Cougar Athletic Program to be the best College Athletic Program in Canada over a 25 year period. As an illustration of Don's commitment to leadership in sport, Don was the founding President of the Canadian Colleges Athletic Association.

Don's efforts and successes have been recognized by others in the sporting community; he is a member of the City of Lethbridge Sports Hall of Fame, the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference Hall of Fame and the Canadian Colleges

Athletic Association Hall of Fame. The Calgary Booster Club recognized Don's leadership abilities by asking him to be the Vice Chairman of Hockey at the 1988 Winter Olympics.

Don's philosophy about developing talented student athletes has a certain amount of irony to it. To quote Scott Atkinson, a former hockey player, coach and faculty member at MRC, "Don's belief in emphasizing character development, citizenship, and academic accomplishment over competitive success led to unprecedented competitive success. To put it in athletic terms, he was a great captain and an even better teammate."

Don's charismatic leadership is matched by his unparalleled humility, altruism and sense of humour. It is with great pride that the Calgary Booster Club recognizes Dr. Don Stouffer as an Honoured Athletic Leader for 2017.

Athletic Leaders



Dr. Ralph Stropher

Sports medicine physician, Dr. Ralph Strother grew up in Calgary and played youth hockey, little league baseball, ran track and participated in numerous school sports at the Henry Wise Wood High School. With practice and the benefit of excellent coaching, he excelled at tennis and basketball. This positive and successful experience in amateur sport provided Ralph with a firm foundation to pursue a career in sports medicine.

In 1981, Ralph graduated from the University of Alberta Medical School (Phi Beta Kappa). His passion for sport and medicine inspired him to be a leader in developing the newly evolving specialty of sports medicine. Today, there are many qualified physicians and medical practitioners visible on the sidelines of the spectrum of sporting events. Thanks to Ralph, sport medicine is now recognized as a practice "specialty" at medical schools in Calgary and across Canada.

Ralph has contributed to every aspect and level of sports medicine. He has been part of the Canadian Academy of Sport Medicine National Credentials Committee and was responsible for setting the standards for sport medicine practice in Canada. He has been a recognized leader in educating sport medicine professionals and has been the volunteer editor and medical adviser to numerous sport medicine journals. Ralph was recognized as a Charter Recipient of a Diploma in Sport Medicine from the Canadian Academy of Sport Medicine in 1989 and a Charter Recipient of a Certificate of Added Competency in Sport and Exercise Medicine (SEM) from the College of Family Physicians of Canada in 2016.

As a sports medicine specialist, Ralph has served as the coordinating team physician for numerous National Teams including Volleyball, Badminton, Luge and Bobsled and has been a network physician for Nordic Ski Jumping, Downhill and Freestyle Skiing and Swimming. He is a consulting physician for Professional Rodeo, the National Ballet of Canada, Alberta Ballet, Decidedly Jazz Dance Works, the Cascades Diving Club and the Sport Canada High Performance Training Centre.

As a community leader, Ralph has chaired the National Board of the Canadian Breast Cancer Foundation and has been a Director and Chair of the Calgary Foundation (a leader in collaborative philanthropy since 1955).

Ralph has been a long-time advocate of safe sport participation and continues to contribute to the Calgary sporting community in multiple capacities; some as a coach and mentor, some as a father, some as an administrator, some as facilitator, but most of all, as an outstanding sports medicine physician. Dr. Ralph Strother is a truly deserving recipient of the Calgary Booster Club Honoured Athletic Leader Award for 2017.

HENRY VINEY TROPHY WINNER

Erica Wiebe



Calgary wrestler, Erica Weibe, is the 2016 Female Athlete of the Year. Wiebe capped off an incredible 2016 season as she captured a Gold medal in the 75kg women's wrestling competition at the 2016 Rio Olympic Games. Wiebe became only the third female Canadian wrestler to capture an Olympic Gold medal and she is the third wrestler to win the Henry Viney award as the top Calgary Female Athlete of the Year. Previous winners of the Viney were Christine Nordhagen 1997 and Carol Huyhnh in 2009.

Originally from Ontario, Erica came to Calgary and the University of Calgary to pursue her wrestling ambitions and

academic goals. At the University of Calgary she was a four-time CIS medalist, capturing a silver medal in 2010 and gold in 2009, 2011 and 2012. Erica has two degrees from the University of Calgary (Bachelor of Kinesiology 2012 and Bachelor of Arts (Sociology) in 2016. Following her CIS success Erica continued to train at the University of Calgary as she pursued her international goals.

Wiebe had enjoyed a very successful 2014 season in which she won every individual tournament she entered, a streak of 36 matches, until the world championships quarterfinals. Among her notable victories were gold medals at the Commonwealth Games and World University Championships. It was the third straight year she had stood on the podium at the latter, improving on her silver in 2012 and bronze in 2013. Despite not earning on a spot on the Canadian Pan Am Games or world championship teams in 2015, Wiebe still gained a wealth of international experience, highlighted by first place finishes at the Nordhagen Classics, Ivan Yarygin Grand Prix, Klippan Lady Open, Grand Prix of Germany, Canada Cup, Grand Prix of Spain and Bill Farrell Memorial, extending her international competitive record in 2015 to 29-1.

Representing Canada at the 2016 Rio Games Erica finished on top of the 75kg weight class in her Olympic debut, defeating Kazakhstan's Guzel Manyurova in the final.

Off the mat Erica is making a commitment to giving back to the community as she is an active ambassador for Fast & Female, Right to Play & KidSport Calgary. She also works with Motivate Canada as part of their Esteem Team as she goes into class rooms to share positive messages and goal setting skills through my sport experiences. As Erica says: "The informal and interactive presentations highlight the values I have learned through sport and is shared in an informative, fun way! It's important for these young girls and boys to see that the athletes they see at the Olympics are just like anyone else; working hard every day to achieve great things. For them to understand that it's cool for a girl to be a wrestler speaks to the opportunity to go out and follow their dreams." She also gives back to her sport as a coach and mentor.

The Calgary Booster Club congratulates Female Athlete of the Year Erica Wiebe for a tremendous year of accomplishments and her first Henry Viney award.

This award, named in honour of Henry Viney, the long-time Sports Director of CFCN Radio-Television, was established in 1987 by the Calgary Sports Media Club. Viney, over a career that spanned some 50 years, covered every major sporting event around the globe and received many major awards including Canadian Sportscaster of the Year (1967 Foster Hewitt Award) and the Calgary Booster Club Sportsman of the Year (1976). SCOTT-MAMINI AWARD WINNER

Calgary curler Kevin Koe is the 2016 Scott-Mamini Memorial Award winner (Male Athlete of the Year). Kevin capped off a terrific 2016 season by capturing the World Men's Curling Championship. Kevin Koe becomes the fourth male curler to be named the Athlete of the Year. Ron Northcott in 1966 and 1968, Paul Gowsell in 1977 and Ed Lukowich in 1986 were all recipients of the Scott-Mamini Memorial Award, Cheryl Bernard captured the female Henry Viney award in 2011.

Kevin Koe is one of Canada's curling elites. Koe along with his current teammates consisting of lead Ben

Hebert, second Brent Laing and third Marc Kennedy put together an incredible run in 2016 as they dominated the curling world. Having had previous success in 2015 as Alberta champions the Koe team followed up that success with another provincial title in 2016. As representatives of Alberta they then captured the 2016 Canadian Brier against an always tough field earning themselves the right to represent Team Canada at the 2016 World Men's Curling Championships, where they topped the world and were crowned 2016 World Champions.

At the 2016 Canadian Brier the Koe foursome went 8 and 3 in the round robin good enough to get them into the playoffs where they won three straight games to capture the 2016 title. Koe defeated Brad Gushue in the final earning the opportunity to represent Canada at the World Championships.

At the World Championships the Koe rink went 10 and 1 in the round robin. In the playoffs they beat Denmark twice including a 5-3 victory in the gold medal final. For Koe this was his second World Championship victory (first in 2010 with a different team). For Canada the Koe victory broke a four year drought at the World Men's Championship. Koe commenting on his victories in 2016 said "It wasn't flashy, but it was solid, and what a feeling. It's so hard to win the Brier, so you just want to win the worlds when you get here, and it feels awesome."

Originally from Yellowknife Koe now calls Calgary home. The 42 year old is a graduate of the University of Calgary and curls out of the Glencoe Club in Calgary. Away from the ice Koe is a landman at Respol Oil & Gas Canada, is married and has two children. He comes from a curling family as his brother Jamie has represented the Territories at the Brier and his sister Kerry has also represented the Territories at the Scotties Tournament of Hearts.

The Scott-Mamini Award, initiated by the Calgary Press-Radio-TV Sports Club in 1958, was presented annually to the city's Athlete of the Year as chosen by the media. That format continued until 1987 when the Scott-Mamini became the Male Athlete of the Year recognition. It is named for Harry Scott, Sports Editor at the Calgary Albertan and Bob Mamini, the Sports Department Head at the Calgary Herald. 

The Association believes that the interscholastic athletic program, as a recognized part of the school program, is educationally sound and will enhance the physical, mental, emotional and social development of young people.

Annually, 10,000 student athletes participate in twelve sports including football, cross country, soccer, volleyball, diving, wrestling, basketball, swimming, rugby, track and field, badminton and field hockey.

The CSHSAA is unique in many ways, but is recognized nationally for its belief that the amalgamation of Calgary's two educational systems into one common athletic association is in the best interests of the residents of Calgary. As such, the Calgary Board of Education and the Calgary Catholic School District have worked together harmoniously for decades. As well, the partnership with the Calgary Booster Club over the past five decades has been beneficial to hundreds of student athletes.
