

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

Don Young



Don has volunteered and led sports groups in the City of Calgary for over 40 years.

He began coaching with the Calgary West Little League baseball in 1989 and since then has coached at the Major, Junior, Senior and All-Star baseball levels with many of his teams qualifying to participate at provincial championships. He was also President of the Calgary and District Softball Association when he was inducted into the Hall of Fame by the Commercial Men's Fastball Association in 1987. He has continued in the role of Commissioner of Calgary Babe Ruth Baseball Association since the mid 1990's which has included

trips to the Babe Ruth World Series with the Alberta Champions on many occasions.

Don continues to work on the Stampede Rodeo and Chuckwagon committee which he began in 1981. He has also served on the Board of Directors for the Calgary Brier and the annual Mac's Midget Hockey tournament and was a Board Member for the the Calgary Canucks Junior Tier A hockey club for 8 years. In his own community of Rutland Park Don has spent time as a volunteer Director, Vice-President and Casino Chair.

Over the years Don has coached in the Novice, Atom, Pee-Wee and Bantam divisions of the Calgary Minor Hockey Association.

During the 1988 Calgary Olympic Winter Games Don served as supervisor of the office officials. That led to his role at the 2002 Salt Lake City Olympic Winter Games, where he was the official scorer for the Men's Gold Medal Hockey Game. Don also worked the Vancouver Winter Olympic Games in 2010.

Don was supervisor of all off-ice officials for the 2011 World Junior Hockey Championship held in Calgary, and then in 2012 supervised all off-ice personnel for the Alberta Senior Winter Games Hockey Tournament.


Presently Don has been the supervisor of the off-ice officials for the National Hockey League in Calgary since 1981 (38 years). In 2006 the NHL honored Don with a 25-year service award.

Don works quietly behind the scenes and very few know the full extent of his contributions. His humble demeanor embodies precisely what the Sportsman of the Year celebrates in the City of Calgary.

Ken King

Ken King is the Vice Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Calgary Sports and Entertainment Corporation; the parent company that encompasses the NHL Calgary Flames, the AHL Stockton Heat, the WHL Calgary Hitmen, the CFL Calgary Stampeders and the NLL Calgary Roughnecks. Born and raised in Hanley, Saskatchewan, Ken is a strong believer in support for the community; he is involved with several organizations including the TELUS Community Board, the Calgary Sport Tourism Authority, Director of the Calgary

Airport Authority and is a former Chairman of the Calgary Chamber of Commerce. As the senior executive with CSEC, Ken oversees several charitable foundations such as the Calgary Flames Foundation which annually raises approximately \$4 million annually and since 2001 has distributed over \$30 million in support initiatives in Education, Health and Wellness and Amateur and Grassroots Sports. In 2005, Ken received an Alberta Centennial Medal for outstanding contributions to the province of Alberta. He also received a honourary degrees from the University of Calgary (2012) and Mount Royal University (2014). Prior to joining CSEC in 2001, King enjoyed a 30-year career in the newspaper business that included senior executive positions in Canada's leading newspapers including President and Publisher of the Calgary Sun and Calgary Herald.

Mark Stephen

Mark has enjoyed a long and distinguished media career working at CFCN Radio TV, CKCK Radio (Regina), Calgary Cannons and CHQR Radio. His longest tenure was with CHQR Radio as Sports Director, Talk Show host and Calgary Stampeders play-by-play broadcaster (24 years, part of longest serving broadcast tandem in CFL history, with Greg Peterson). While attending university in Calgary he worked at the university radio station and was the public address announcer for U of C basketball games for 23 years. His

university thesis research on Toronto's original NBA team was admitted to the Archives of the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, MA. In 1975 Mark was Inducted into the Canadian Football Hall of Fame, Media Wing and in 2013 he was named Alberta High School Athletic Association Media Personality of the Year. A more recent honor was his selection to host the Calgary High School Athletics Association 100th Anniversary Gala. Over the course of the past few decades Mark has organized and broadcast CSHSAA city high football games on CHQR Radio, pre-season Calgary Basketball Classic on Shaw TV (8 years), and the city HS BB final on MixLR, 2018. He has also volunteered to serve on the committee for Football Canada U - 19 Championships in 2018, assisted Calgary Royals Midget AA showcase hockey, and often made certain that high school and university sports held a priority on talk shows and at various other forums. A native Calgarian, Mark attended Henry Wise Wood HS and graduated from the University of Calgary.

Patti has spent many of her volunteer years working with swimming. She has served as President for her Club, travel coordinator, and regional chair of Officials for swim Alberta. She also worked tirelessly as an official and was the head referee on many occasions. She led officiating clinics at the Winter Club and other venues to make sure that swim clubs had ample and trained officials. In 2016 Patti volunteered to be the Chair of the local organizing committee for the Canadian Age Group Swim Championships, a national swim meet hosting more than 1000 of the best swimmers from across the country. She exemplified all the characteristics that are attributed to

be a great leader by lending advice and guidance where needed, but also knowing when to step aside and let people do what they are assigned to do. Patti is on the extreme positive end of the leader category, and her peers cannot stress enough how great of a contribution she has given to the betterment of youth swimming in Alberta

Patti has become a committed supporter of the Dare to Care program and a champion for the social/emotional well-being of children and youth in both schools and sports. She has remained a key advocate for bully prevention and most recently, in 2016, the Chair of the Dare to Care Board of Directors. She worked in partnership with the Executive Director of Dare to Care to bring the program to the University of Calgary Swim Club, where over 500 athletes, 800 parents and 50 coaches were trained in the program during the 2017-2018 swim season. It is largely due to Patti's quiet but persuasive influence that Dare to Care made the leap into amateur sports in 2017.

Patti also spent several years as a Calgary Booster Club Director, as an ambassador for local grass roots sports.

Bernie Harrison has been intricately involved in ensuring the smooth running of shooting sports organisations at the local level as president of the Calgary Rifle and Pistol Club (CRPC), at the provincial level as president of the Alberta Federation of Shooting Sports (AFSS) and as president of the Alberta Handgun Association (AHA). Nationally he is the Alberta Representative to the Shooting Federation of Canada (SFC) and Vice-President of this same national organization--- the Shooting Federation of Canada (SFC). He has often served simultaneously on all these boards.

His responsibilities have included promotion of the services of the shooting sports in Alberta and across Canada, responding to users, fundraising, working with budgets and dealing with supply chain management. As a volunteer in these capacities, he has responded enthusiastically to opportunities to take on higher levels of responsibility including marketing and responding to human resources needs.

He consults with the community and local sporting organisations and is the liaison with local sports councils, regional committees and national governing bodies. He makes presentations to grant-making bodies and/or relevant authorities, organises meetings, training, coaching, competitions, and other events. He participates in the resolution of political and ethical issues, such as conflicts of interest between partner organisations, use of banned substances and breaches of regulations. He has also been part of the Host Medical Team for the International Masters Games; the World Championships in Athletics and the World Police and Fire Games. Since then, his contributions to the Calgary sporting community can be better understood when we say that he has directly influenced literally tens of thousands of people over the past 30 years. These people would include students in both the faculties of Kinesiology and Medicine at the University of Calgary; athletes that he coached; graduate students that he supervised, examined and mentored; medical residents in training and fellows that he opened his practice to, as part of their sport medicine training; the countless physicians that have benefitted from his teaching and expertise; the organizations that he has helped and led in an administrative role; the research that he has initiated, inspired and contributed to and his colleagues and peers that have furthered their careers and practices because of his leadership at all levels. The most important role that he has provided is the care of thousands of patients. He is the physician other physicians send their family members to. Dr. Preston Wiley is truly a 2019 Honoured Athletic Leader

Emma Wilton


Emma is one of the mainstays for netball in Alberta. For 11 years she has been the junior program coordinator. Programs she has coached include Junior B (U12), Junior A (U 16), and the U23 Provincial team. Emma has created a full program for the coaches that follows the LTAD framework and has a detailed matrix for the coaches to follow. Coaches are encouraged to personalize and implement the program for the season, with emphasis on planning and goal setting.

For 11 years she has been the program coordinator, and, in this position, she is the first contact for the parents, players and coaches. She creates teams, organizes coaches, and attends each league night to manage the program. After games, she sits to give feedback to the coaches. Between her coaching, being program coordinator, umpiring league games and mentoring coaches and umpires, Emma commits over 7 hours per week. Add to that her time in meetings and her extra volunteer time as official bench coordinator for tournaments and everything else she does, she is a force behind netball Alberta and its success here in Calgary.

In addition to this work, Emma is deeply committed to and involved in the development of our young coaches and umpires. She works with the Junior program coaches every week during training sessions and during and after games to analyse processes, celebrate successes and help with their challenges. She instills confidence and imparts knowledge to these young people, creating our next generation of netball leaders.

Emma was the recipient of the JEAN CAMBRIDGE AWARD 2016. This award is given to a member of the Netball Community who has demonstrated leadership and longstanding service to Netball in administration, coaching and /or umpiring.

Alex Gough



Calgary luger, Alex Gough, is the 2018 Female Athlete of the Year. Gough had an incredible 2018 season as she solidified herself as the most accomplished female Canadian Luge of all time.

Alex's 2018 accomplishments were highlighted by her performance at the Pyeongchang Winter Olympics where she captured two medals, becoming the first Canadian athlete to win an Olympic medal in the sport of Luge.

Alex Gough made history at PyeongChang 2018, winning bronze in the women's singles event for Canada's first ever Olympic luge medal. Two days later, she stood on the podium again after winning silver in the team relay alongside Sam Edney, Tristan Walker and Justin Snith. Gough became a double Olympic medallist four years after she experienced the heartbreak of fourth-place finishes in both the women's singles and team relay events at Sochi 2014.

A native Calgarian, Alex's mother signed her up for a luge camp at Canada Olympic Park (Winsport) at the age of 13. She loved the competition and five years later was a member of the 2006 Canadian Olympic Team.

In February 2011, Gough became the first Canadian luger to ever win gold in a World Cup race. That snapped a 105-race German winning streak in women's World Cup competition, a string of success that had lasted more than 13 years. She went on to win Canada's first-ever world championship women's luge medal when she captured bronze in 2011.

Gough had hoped to have her breakthrough at Vancouver 2010. The Canadian team had enjoyed a lot of training time at the Whistler Sliding Centre, but following the tragic death of Georgian Nodar Kumaritashvili, the start positions were lowered, changing it to a track she had never trained on. Since then, Gough's consistency has been remarkable. Over the next four seasons, she finished the year ranked in the top five of the World Cup standings, including second place overall in 2013-14 thanks to podium finishes in six of the nine races. She added another bronze medal at the 2013 World Championships in Whistler, getting closure on her Olympic disappointment on that same track.

As a strong starter, Gough is also a vital component in the team relay, winning silver at the 2013 World Championships following bronze in 2012. Bronze medals followed at the 2015 and 2016 World Championships. Gough returned to full time competition in 2016-17 after two seasons of reduced racing while she completed two years of a civil engineering degree at the University of Calgary.

The four time Olympian (2006, 2010, 2014 and 2018) retired from the sport of luge following the 2018 season, but she remains the leading Canadian luger in history. Alex is an advocate for females in sport, through fast and female, and continues her community involvement, as she aims to finish her engineering degree at the University of Calgary.

SCOTT-MAMINI AWARD WINNER

Justin Kripps



Justin Kripps, Canadian bobsleigh athlete, is the 2018 Calgary Male Athlete of the Year. Kripps who trains and resides in Calgary is the first male bobsleigh athlete to receive the Scott-Mamini Memorial Award.

The three time Olympian (2010, 2014, 2018) is the pilot of Canada's top two-man and four-man sleds and highlighted an incredibly successful 2018 season by capturing gold in the two-man event at the Winter Olympics in PyeongChang 2018.

Kripps and his brakeman Alex Kopacz were part of just the second ever tie for an Olympic bobsleigh gold

medal, matching the four-run total time of Germans Francesco Friedrich and Thorsten Margis.

On top of his Olympic gold medal Kripps enjoyed the best World Cup season of his career in 2018 when he won the overall title in the two-man event after reaching the podium in five of eight races and never finishing lower than fourth. He also had two podium finishes in the four-man event leading him to be awarded the Crystal Globe as the top pilot in the combined rankings.

After his introduction to bobsleigh in August 2006, Kripps spent three seasons as one of the top brakeman in Canada, leading to him being a member of Pierre Lueders' four-man crew at Vancouver 2010. Following that experience, Kripps wanted to be in control so he decided to become a pilot and attended pilot school in the summer of 2010. He spent the 2010-11 season on the developmental North American Cup circuit and competed at the 2011 World Junior Championships, where he drove his four-man sled to a fifth-place finish and his two-man sled to an eighth-place finish. He started the 2011-12 season on the Europa Cup circuit before making his World Cup debut as a pilot in February 2012 in Whistler.

His first world championship appearance as a pilot was in 2012, where he won a bronze medal in the non-Olympic team competition, driving the men's two-man sled that combined with runs by a women's bobsled, a women's skeleton and a men's skeleton. Kripps' first World Cup podium as a pilot was also his first victory when he won the two-man event in Königssee, Germany in January 2014. Through the 2016-17 season he had three more World Cup podiums: two-man bronze in Königssee in January 2015, four-man bronze in Lake Placid in January 2016, and two-man silver in Lake Placid in December 2016.

Scott-Mamini Award

The Scott-Mamini Award, initiated by the Calgary Press-Radio-TV Sports Club in 1958, was presented annually to the city's Athlete of the Year as chosen by the media. That format continued until 1987 when the Scott-Mamini became the Male Athlete of the Year recognition. It is named for Harry Scott, Sports Editor at the Calgary Albertan and Bob Mamini, the Sports Department Head at the Calgary Herald. Both men were highly respected across the country during the 1930's and 1940's.




Riley White - Wrestling

Through this program, Omid has seen remarkable improvement in their physical life as well as their mental well-being.

At his work, at Sport Check, Omid advises customers at various events and promotes the National Sport School as the key to a successful athletic career as well as academic achievement in school.

Upon graduating from the NSS, Omid enrolled in the Child and Youth Care Counselling program at Mount Royal University. Omid embodies what it is to be a great citizen of the National Sport School community.



The Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association was established in 1913 to provide competitive athletic opportunities for students in Calgary high schools. The Association believes that the interscholastic athletic program, as a recognized part of the school program, is educationally sound and will enhance the physical, mental, emotional and social development of young people.

Annually, 10,000 student athletes participate in twelve sports including football, cross country, soccer, volleyball, diving, wrestling, basketball, swimming, rugby, track and field, badminton and field hockey.

The CSHSAA is unique in many ways, but is recognized nationally for its belief that the amalgamation of Calgary's two educational systems into one common athletic association is in the best interests of the residents of Calgary. As such, the Calgary Board of Education and the Calgary Catholic School District have worked together harmoniously for decades. As well, the partnership with the Calgary Booster Club over the past six decades has been beneficial to hundreds of student athletes.

Our partnership with the Calgary Senior High School Athletic Association goes back to 1956 when we presented our first scholarship to Jack Sharpe of Western Canada for the inaugural Harry Hood Memorial Football Award. Since then we have honoured and recognized 547 individual high school winners for a total of \$372,500 and an additional 295 student athletes with maximum participation scholarships in the last 26 years for another \$105,000. This amounts to a total investment of \$477,500 for outstanding student athletes in the C.S.H.S.A.A. program.


